Atlantic City, N. J., Dec. 11 (P)-The AFL-CIO convention came out unanimously today against any 1958 wage freeze or extension of the 40hour work week. Instead, the convention called for sizeable wage boosts and a shorter

work week. Walter Reuther, head of the Auto Workers Union, charted the federation's bargaining policies in a speech saying the way to counter the nation's economic decline and mounting unemployment is to boost wages and increase purchasing power. "What we do at the bargainin

table in 1958," Reuther told cheer ing delegates, "will be an import ant factor in restoring a dynamic balance to our economy. "We are in trouble because Big
