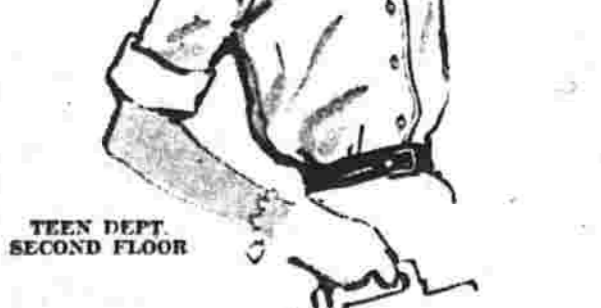

# Sukarno Reported Unseated

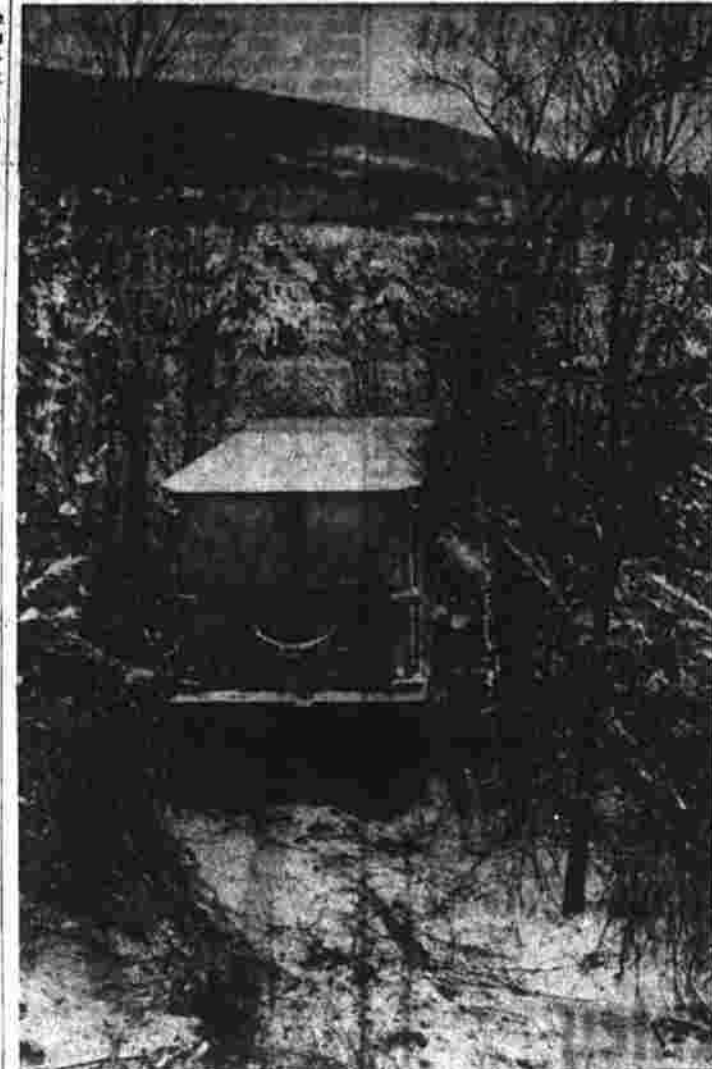

A "port of dictatorship" called a "guide democracy." The Army has been reported abroad to be divided, but in large part opposed to the President's political leanings. President Sukarno was heavily guarded by 20 armed military cyclists eight jeeps of shock troops and two weapons carriers with troops when he drove to the Presidential Palace today in a bullet-proof car.

Assassins attempted to kill him with four grenades on Nov. 30. From 45 to 50 persons have been arrested for the attempt, but their names have not been disclosed.

Police sources said the President is tired physically and mentally and may leave the country for a rest within a week. He last canceled a tour of South America because of the crisis with the Dutch, however.

Meanwhile the campaign went on to take over the \$1.5 billion Dutch investments and to oust the 48,000 Dutch citizens in reprisal for the Netherlands refusal to surrender West New Guinea.

### Improvement Noted In Subway Service

New York, Dec. 12 (AP)—Transit officials and police today reported growing improvement in subway service, disrupted since Monday by a motorman's strike which has created travel difficulties for millions.

But an official of the striking union termed "a damned lie" a claim of the City Transit Authority that more and more of the aggrieved motormen were going back to work.

Frank A. Zelano, executive secretary of the Motorman's Benevolent Assn., said such claims were only "intended to stampede and confuse our men."

Police headquarters said about 70 per cent of scheduled subway train runs were made during the 7 to 8 a.m. rush hour today. This was somewhat above yesterday's performance.

At the same time, the Transit Authority said 72 more motormen appeared for work between midnight and 8 a.m. than on the same shift yesterday.

The authority put the total today at 494. Yesterday's figure was 422. The normal work schedule for those hours called for 816 men.

A transit official termed "extremely significant" the fact that 56 motormen reported for work on the Independent Division of the subway system early today, as compared with 27 yesterday.

The MTA has more members on the other two subway divisions in the city.

Scolding Zelano declared: "The Transit Authority report that men are returning to work is a damned lie. It was intended to stampede and confuse our men, and we'll lose this fight. They're desperate and they'll use any foul means."

Transit officials earlier had expressed the view that the worst was over for the millions of daily subway users facing extreme difficulties in getting to work during the city's greatest transportation snarl.

The Transit Authority has kept partial service going through use of members of other unions, supervisory personnel and promotion of men to motorman's jobs from the ranks of transit employees. The Authority also has threatened to fire strikers who did not return immediately.

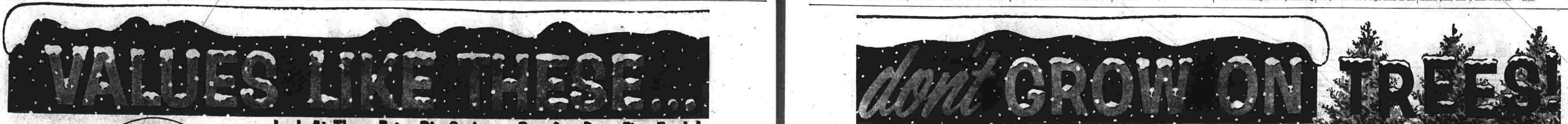

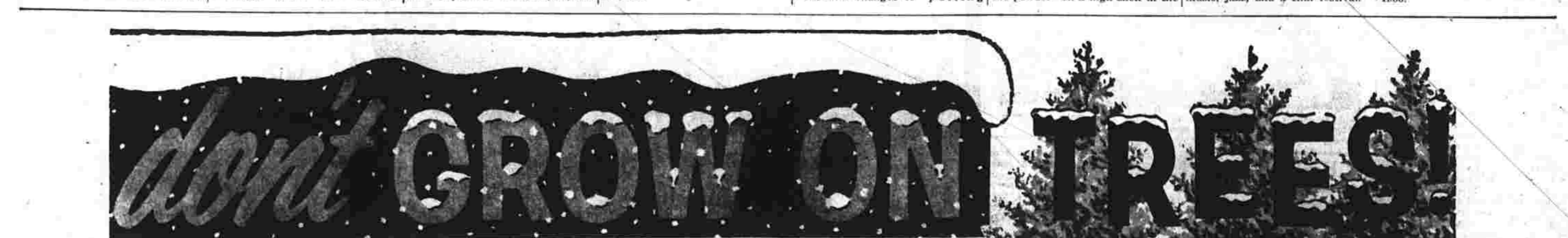

### Lollypop Farm Plays Grandma To Thousands of City Children

By DICK WHALEN  
 Rochester, N. Y. (AP)—It's the nearest thing to having a grandmother on a farm.  
 That's Lollypop Farm, the local Humane Society's way of teaching city-raised children how to make friends with animals.  
 Besides being the home of such barnyard regulars as Billy the Goat, Mary Ann the Lamb and Guests the Goose, the farm has a flock of animals that grandmothers certainly never see in her barnyard.  
 Long-necked llamas look down their noses on two dozen ducks. African pygmy donkeys play with a herd of goats. Tiny, English fallow deer pick their way daintily among the sheep and lambs. And more city children than grandmothers ever saw mingle with the animals in the outdoor corral. On weekends, up to 2,000 visit Lollypop Farm.  
 C. Raymond Naramore, director of the Humane Society of Rochester and Monroe County, sums up the idea behind the farm in two words: "Humane Education."  
 "You can't teach children kindness and love for animals by showing slides and telling stories," he says. "You have to show them how to feed and pet the animals."  
 Lollypop Farm does just that. A youngster finds out that he can't get close to a flock of ducks by chasing them. But with a handful of grain spilled on the ground and he has more ducks scuttling and quacking at his feet than he knows what to do with.  
 "You'd be surprised," says Naramore, "how many children are terrified by a soft, woolly lamb. We teach them that there's nothing to be afraid of if they treat the animals gently."  
 The animals, in turn, have been brought up to treat the children gently. Most of them, including the deer, goats, donkeys and llamas have been bottle-raised from birth on farms and ranches.  
 The farm population also includes raccoons, chipmunks, squirrels, guinea pigs, rabbits, and even two monkeys that someone got tired of having around the house.  
 The smaller animals live in cages and low pens, but the larger ones and the ducks, roosters and geese are in a fenced enclosure with the visitors.  
 Lollypop Farm is financed by donations from animals and people. It has 7,500 members of the local Humane Society and receives for sales of ice cream cones full of corn that visitors buy for their animals. There is no admission charge.
