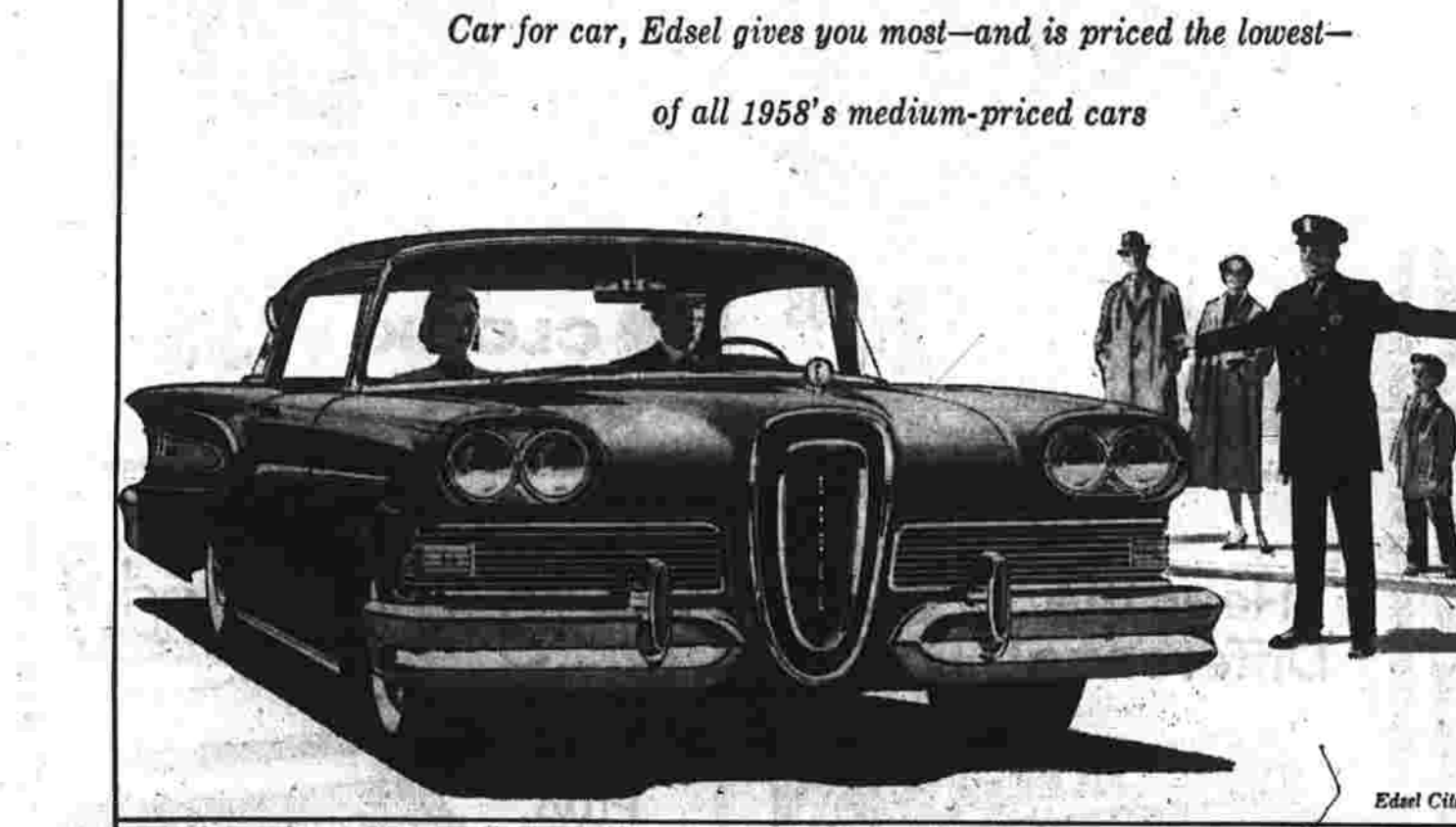

Opponents Voice Objections To Fluoridating Town Water

A gigantic chart of mottled water fluoridation is being on display at the Municipal Board meeting last night.

"Your children's teeth may look like the teeth of a porcupine," the chart proclaimed. The photograph of a child's teeth containing fluoride was used by opponents of fluoridation here.

The presentation, a 7 x 11 inch sheet, was given to the board by General Manager Richard H. Hays.

Martin heard arguments last week from dentists and doctors in favor of fluoridation to help stop tooth decay in children.

Reports were led last night by Miss Lillian Van de Vere of Hartford.

Chalmers presented the fluoridation of the water supply.

Costs far more money than other methods of using fluorides, like taking bone meal or pills.

Speakers besides Miss Van de Vere included a physician, an attorney, and a dentist from Manchester.

The hearing was started with a statement by Stuart B. Cheney, reading local opinion of fluoridation.

"This chemical we are considering is a rat poisoning, being of the same class as rat poisons," Cheney said.

After his own talk, he turned to meeting over the fluoridation of the water supply.

"Why should we introduce a toxic poison against our teeth when we have fluoride in our water supply?" he asked.

Dr. Ginn attacked the endorsement of fluoridation by medical and dental societies as "rubbing salt in the wound."

Thousands of dentists throughout the country don't believe in it, he said.

Additional fluorides to water without the consent of the individual was attacked by John Richard Auctier, a Springfield, Mass., attorney.

"There is no room for paternalism in our philosophy of government and law," Auctier said.

The individual has a right to determine such matters for himself.

Mrs. Van de Vere told the general audience that one part of fluoride per million gallons of water, as recommended by fluoridation proponents, would not be fatal to rats or human beings.

She said, however, that no one can be sure of the accuracy of the results that a particular water tap reaches fluoride, she said.

She said that fluoridation has caused mental and physical ailments in children, and that it has caused more deaths from heart disease and an increase in cancer.

Fluoridation also affects premature births, she charged.

Fluorides in other forms are available at a much lower cost than in fluoridated water to people who want them, Miss Van de Vere said.

Package Racket Scored by Wiet

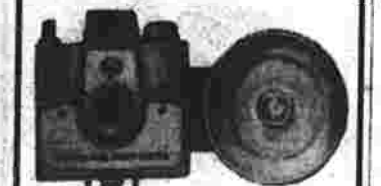

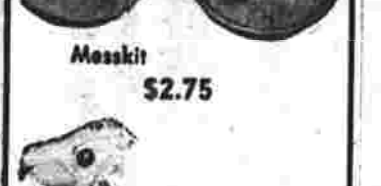
