Amonate, Va., Dec. 28 (A) Rescue workers today re-covered the bodies of 11 miners killed late yesterday when a gas explosion trapped 25 men below ground in a mine straddling the Virginia-West Virginia border. Fourteen miners were brought out of the colliery uninjured shortly after midnight.
Canvas was draped over the victims, carried out of Mine No. 31 of the Pocahontas Fuel Co. on a coal car. About 100 persons looked on in the first grey light of an overcast day. overcast day.

The miners were hemmed in 500

feet underground. Company offi-cials said all the men originally trapped by the explosion were be-lieved to be accounted for. 3 Miles from Entry Shaft Bodies of the dead were removed from the sprawling mine throug a shaft located in West Virginia nearly three miles from the main entry shaft where the survivors were brought out. This was the second disastrous explosion in Pocahontas Fuel Co. mines in the border coalfields in 11 months. A February gas explosion at a mine near Bishop, Va., snuffed out 37 lives. Names of the victims and st vivors of yesterday's blast were re-leased at mid-morning. Officials said there was no in-


