This is the first year in a decade that the assessed value of real and personal property has not jumped a half million dollars. Biggest drop came in the classification of dwellings. Only 28 new units were completed, compared to 46 in the previous year. The 1956 list showed an increased valuation of \$300,000. This year's increase is only \$107,484 for a total list area of 1,917.72 acres. Some livestock exempt.

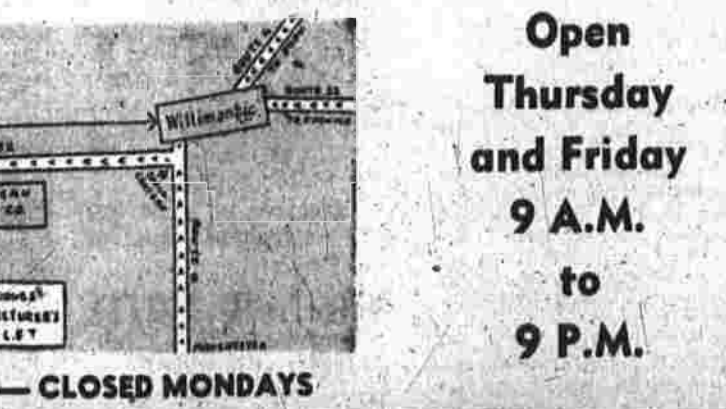
