Tension Eases In Venezuela, Junta Controls

Managua, Jan. 26 (AP)—Tension in Venezuela has eased as the military junta has taken control of the country, according to reports from Caracas.

The junta has said it would respect the principle of asylum if persons wanted to stay in the country, but it made plain it would force them to leave if they refused.

Former political leaders from Venezuela during the Perez Jimenez regime began fleeing back to the United States.

The vanguard was Joaquin Villalba, chief of the Union Republic Party, who had been ousted in the 1952 presidential election.

Other political figures who fled included Juan Pablo Perez Jimenez, who had been president of the country and declared himself elected.

Stepping from his plane, he said he would lead the struggle against the military junta.

TRICKY PLAY MAY FOOL PARTNERS

The reason you make a tricky play is always the same: You want to fool an opponent. The danger is likewise always the same: You may succeed only in fooling your partner.

West opened the deuce of clubs, his ace-high card in the suit, rather than the more normal four-ace hand.

The idea was to make declarer think that West had only a 4-4 club suit. (When the deuce is in his hand, he has three high cards in the suit.)

As it happened, the lead didn't make South feel safe. He knew that the opponents had ten clubs between them, and he didn't care which of them held six.

Declarer needed the first nine tricks and therefore had to guess whether to try a finesse in hearts or diamonds.

The average player would be quick to believe his partner after a hand of this kind. The best defense, after all, is a good attack.
