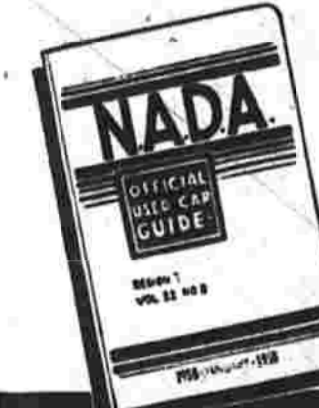

Man is not perfect in the village, in the social group, in the state, in business. But neither is he an anarchist. Only nations still reserve to themselves the privilege of being lawless.

The practical alternative to the cult of power is, then, the cult of law, law which controls and regulates the use of power. And the theory that nations must continue to kill or be killed is no more tenable, in our time, than the jungle theory that an individual could make himself a law unto himself.

The extension of our human system of law until it covers nations is no vain, idealistic dream. It is, rather, the most practical formula for action in our age. We actually already have a beginning of the law we need, and we have already actually used it to thrust back in Korea and Suez, the cult of naked force which would have engulfed the ultimate world anarchy, which is the inevitable end result of the cult of force as an inevitable and respected law.

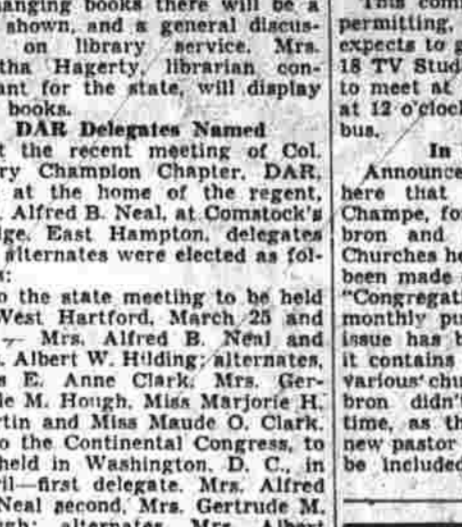

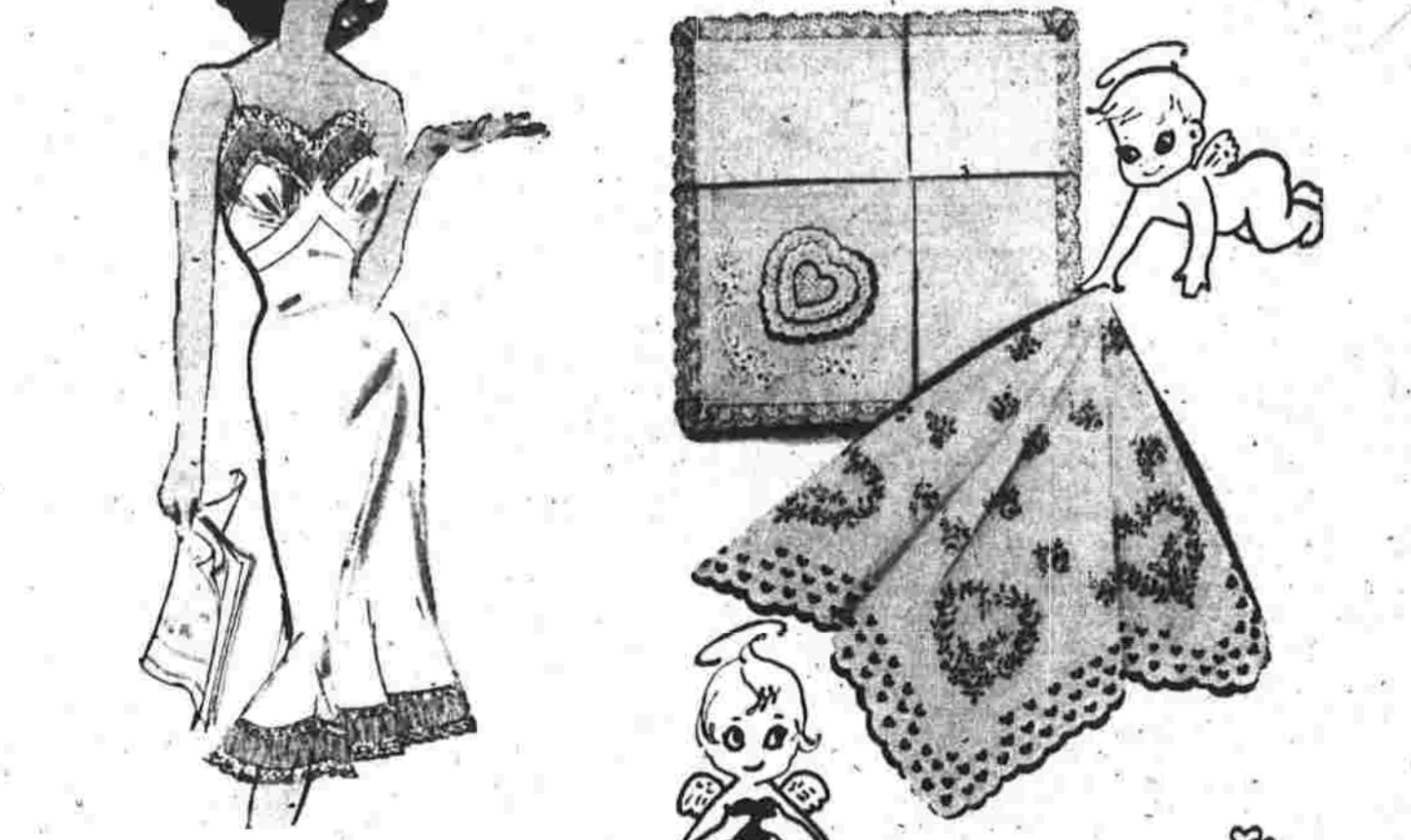
