Police Chief Herman O. Schendel's longtime desire to introduce canine "cops," full-blooded German shepherds, into the local police force will become a reality this summer.

We all take anywhere from two to six months. These dogs are young and we have to be patient with them," Schendel said.

The chief added that if any of the canines proved unsatisfactory, he would replace then with other dogs. "Eventually we'll do some replacing anyway, because I want all males on the force." He said that the number of animals on the force will be dog-gone sharp!


