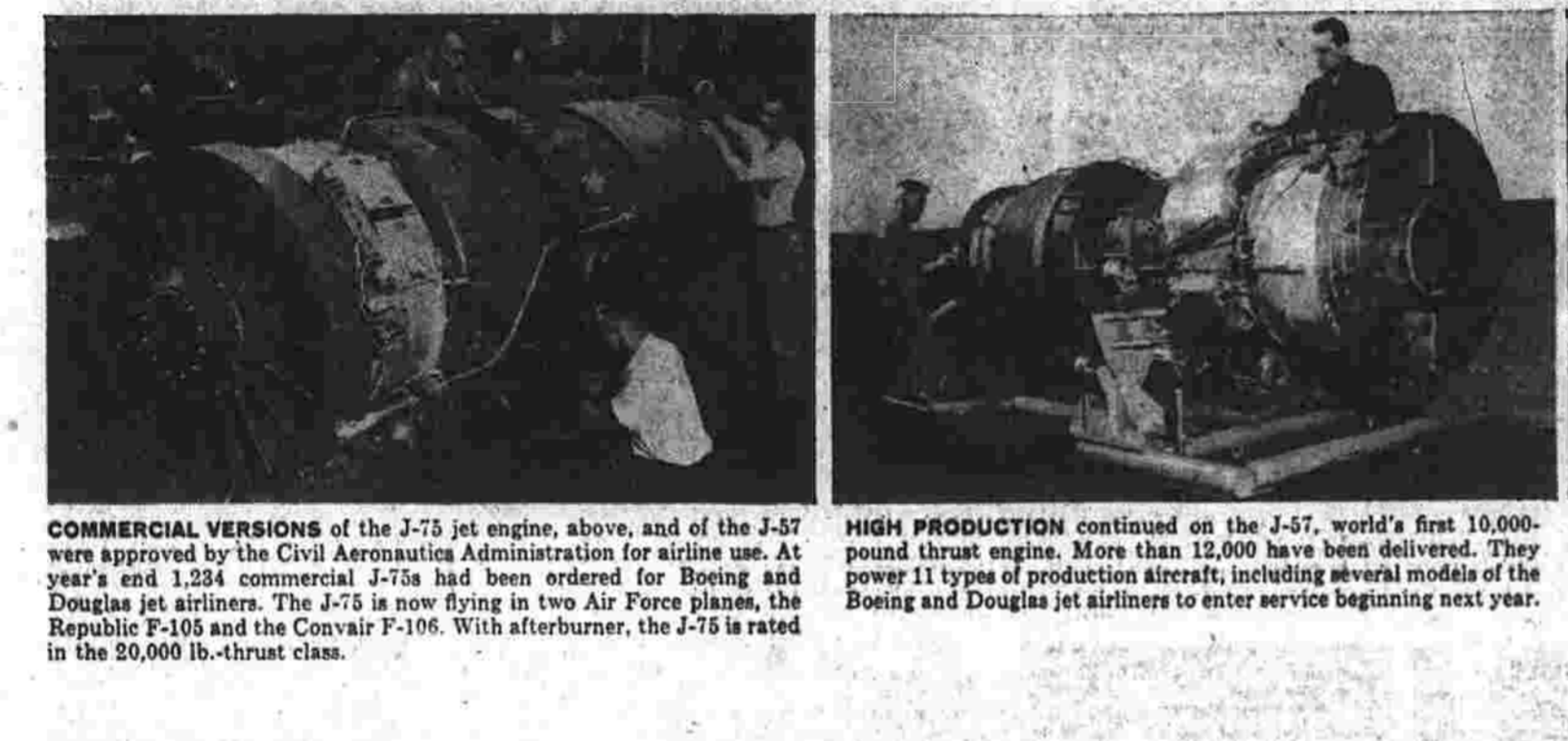

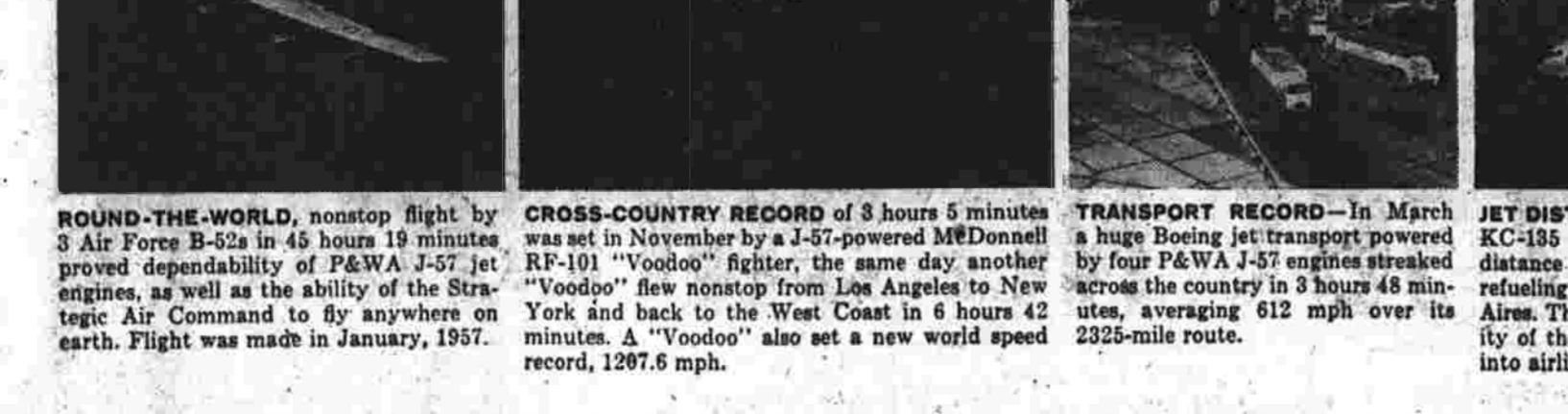

### Bolton Voters May Pick School Site In Public Meeting Tonight

Three tracts of land will be reported as possible future school sites by the School Sites Committee at tonight's town meeting at the Community Hall at 8 o'clock.

Latest addition to the list of possible sites is 50 acres on Hebron Rd. south of the old Albion Gagliardone farm. A price of \$700 per acre has been obtained from the estate of John Lenti, current owner of the property.

A second tract is the 50-acre John Swanson Jr. farm on Bradley St. for which \$25,000 is asked. Third parcel is the so-called Rogers-Toomey-Bolton tract of about 32 acres located next to the present school site.

The Sites Committee has obtained options on the property. Its purchased price would approach \$35,000 depending upon a survey of the approximately 22 acres owned by Leslie S. Bolton.

**Fails Seepage Test**  
The Committee also was able to obtain a seepage test on the parcel by the State Department of Health, who would not approve it from a "sewage disposal angle" and recommended the services of a sanitary engineer be obtained to prepare plans for sewage disposal that might meet its approval.

Seepage tests have not been obtained on the Swanson and Lenti properties because of the lack of time since their availability became known, committee members report.

The Town Planning Commission's man on town soil and land types prepared by Maxine O. Saunders gives general classifications for the areas involved. The Saunders map used as its source of information is a study by the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station entitled "Soil Characteristics of Land Types."

**Soil Types Classified**  
The Rogers-Toomey-Bolton tract lies within an area listed as Class F or Charlton type soil, described as "hill land of heavy texture, slowly drained, glacial till soil."

The drainage qualities are described as having "good surface drainage; impeded under drainage; sub stratum, very compact, 24 to 28 inches."

Both the Swanson and Lenti properties appear to fall within the area designated as Class E or Brookfield type soil which is described as "hill land, medium textured, moderately drained, glacial till soil." It is described as having "good drainage, red or brown color, many stones."

**Items on Call**  
Purpose of the town meeting tonight as listed in the call include: To hear and take action on the report of the School Sites Committee; to see if the town will:

1. Appropriate \$25,000 for purchase of Rogers-Toomey-Bolton site provided it is approved by the State Board of Health.

2. Authorize appointment of a sanitary engineer to prepare a plan for a sewerage disposal area at the site.

3. Appropriate \$1,500 to pay for the services of a sanitary engineer and a surveyor to survey the site, and

4. See what action will be taken on the recommendation of the Board of Education that a permanent School Building Committee be appointed.

A Senate-House conference committee dominated by Democrats skirted any final decision on the issue of civilian-military control yesterday. It wrote the Air Force construction bill compromise language allowing the secretary of defense to go ahead for a year with development of missile, rocket, weapon systems and satellites.

The terms of the compromise avoided either authorizing or prohibiting the establishment of the Advanced Research Projects Agency (ARPA) within the Defense Department to manage missiles and satellite programs.

Secretary of Defense McNamara has contended he already has authority to establish the agency under his direct control. Under the compromise language he could direct the development of systems and military requirements through "his designs." Previously the individual services have had a large measure of control over this work.

Presidential approval would be required for space projects with no immediate military application, such as the Navy's Vanguard.

Both the Senate and the House are expected to approve terms of the compromise, but it could bring sharp debate in both houses.

Knowledge, the Senate Republican leader, forecast that Congress will be asked to act in this session on the issue of civilian-military control of space projects. He said he hasn't made up his own mind on the question but believes any hasty shift in responsibility might delay missile development.

Bridges, chairman of the Senate GOP policy committee and senior Republican on the armed forces committee, said that "for the time being at least, this program should be left in the Defense Department."

"I'm afraid there would be duplication of effort which would delay matters if we started to set up a new agency now," he said. "I am in favor of continuing participating in the work but there will be time

in the future to decide if a new agency is needed."

Baltonstall, head of the conference of all GOP senators, said he believes that for some time to come the satellite program must be handled by the military to avoid confusion. He said an ultimate decision on the issue of civilian-military management can be made when Congress has more information.

Sen. Sparkman (D-Ala), a member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, said it would be inconsistent for the United States to leave control of its program in the defense department while advocating an international agreement on the peaceful use of space.

Sen. Symington (D-Mo), an armed services co-sponsor who has criticized the administration for laps in the missile and satellite field, said he favors retaining direction in the hands of the civilian secretary of defense.

"I hope the President will give a great deal of consideration to the danger of weakening the position of the secretary of defense if he turns the space program over to a new agency," Symington said.

Sen. Capwell (R-Tex), a foreign relations co-sponsor, suggested a compromise under which an equal number of civilians and military men would be appointed to a space commission and select their own chairman.

Sen. Potter (R-Mich), plunger for a new agency patterned after the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) or a department with additional rank which would operate primarily in the field of space research and development.

Congress already has received numerous proposals on this score. Sen. Keating (D-Tenn) has proposed creation of a department of space which would take over the space program. Sen. Anderson (D-Me) and Jackson (D-Wash) had urged that the AEC be given the space assignment.

available, and before the drastic pruning this average has dropped 27.8 per cent to 115,907 miles.

In the first nine months of 1957, the latest period for which figures are available, passenger mileage on trains totaled 20,033,217,841, a stunning 43 per cent under the total of 35,190,414,000 in the same months of 1947.

The loss between the two periods in parlor and sleeping car passenger mileage was 57 per cent, in coaches 42 per cent and in commutation—despite the soaring growth of suburbs—23 per cent.

In 1946 railroads handled 66.2 per cent of all air fare interest, passenger mileage buses 25.6 per cent, airlines 5.8 per cent and inland waterways 2.3 per cent. In 1956—latest figures—it was 36.1 per cent for the rails, 22.9 for the buses, 29.5 for the airlines and 2.4 per cent for inland waterways.

Automobile passenger traffic carried by private automobiles in 1956 amounted to 235,700,000,000 passenger miles. In 1956 it was 617,700,000,000.

"There seems to be no way to influence a person who wants to fly to use the train, nor have we found a way to cause the automobile driver to use the train," says C. E. Peterson, vice president in charge of passenger traffic and public relations of the Southern Pacific.

The Southern Pacific—a well headed, aggressive road—spent 31 million dollars in the past three years on passenger cars for its San Francisco and San Jose commuter business. But when a new highway was opened to clear a bottleneck, the GP lost 1,000 daily commuter passengers within a month.

Mergers in the air for railroads. The biggest study now going on, of course, is that of the Pennsylvania and the New York Central, the two largest railroads from the standpoint of capitalization, but not profits.

There are now about 130 class 1 railroads in the United States. John Budd, president of the Great Northern, says, "I wouldn't be surprised to see the number of class 1 roads cut in half in my lifetime."

Robert MacFarlane, president of the Northern Pacific, thinks consolidation "into a limited number of strong competitive systems—say 25 or 30—would be in the public interest." Alfred Peckham, president of the New York Central, says, "There is more certain merger in this country."

With mergers, consolidations and abandonments the way out of intercity traffic, what will happen to commuter traffic?

Subsidies Asked  
Two approaches have come to the fore. One is offered by George Albert, president of the New York, New Haven & Hartford, which is second to the Long Island in the percentage of passenger traffic to total traffic.

Albert wants some sort of subsidy for commuter business. He has asked the Massachusetts legislature to set up a form of public authority which in essence would provide the subsidy. He has also advocated diversion of one per cent of public highway funds to subsidize commuter service.

Another tack has been taken by the New York Central, which contends railroads should be treated as private enterprises and therefore get a return of six per cent on capital investment.

In furtherance of this policy the Central's subsidiary, the Boston & Albany, has asked the Massachusetts Department of Public Utilities for permission to increase all fares on its Boston commuter service a flat 7½ cents, regardless of distance traveled.

Here is what this means: The present cost of a 46 ride commutation ticket from New-toville, which is eight miles from South Station, Boston, is \$11.79. If the B & A gets its request, the cost would be \$10.00.

But how many people would

continue to hop the train at New-toville?

**Yemen Prince Set For Link with UAR**

in proclaiming their union, provided for just such federation if other Arab nations didn't want to go the whole way. The offer obviously was intended for kings who want to keep their thrones.

El Badr, who was accompanied by 10 advisers, was greeted at the airport by Egyptian minister of state Aly Sabri. Also on hand were E. D. Kinsley, Soviet ambassador to both Egypt and Yemen, and Red China's charge d'affaires.

So far, Yemen is the only nation that has asked to join the Arab union. Yemen's foreign policy follows that of Egypt and Syria. The prince was to confer with Damascus and to nominate Nasir as the first president of the new state.

The two parliaments were also to be asked to ratify a provisional constitution under which the union will operate while a permanent charter is drawn up. It makes Nasir supreme, providing for a one-house legislature appointed by the U.A.R. president and a central advisory council in Cairo. Also appointed by the president.

Presumably the legislature will be elected when the permanent constitution goes into effect. However, the only candidates permitted may be those approved by the government, the system followed in the only election Egypt has had since the deposal of King Farouk.

Syrian foreign minister Salah Hitar notified all foreign envoys in Damascus, including the U.S. and Soviet ambassadors, of the Egyptian-Syrian proclamation. He expressed hope friendly relations would prevail between their countries and the new republic.

One discordant note was sounded by former Iraqi Premier Fadhil Jamali, who declared in Baghdad that the merger was "not natural" and is a challenge to Arab interests and to international policy.

Writing in his newspaper Al Amal, Jamali termed the merger an "artificial union" aimed against Iraq. He said Egypt wanted to merge with Syria "only to separate it from Iraq and make Syria a base to implement a pro-Soviet policy."

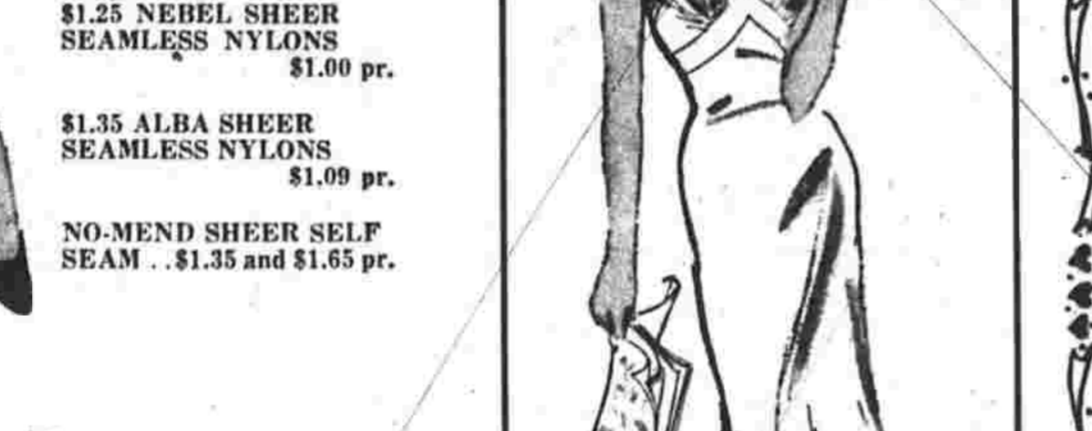
