Sukarno's Foes Air Deadline

Jakarta, Indonesia, Feb. 10 (AP)—Col. Achmad Husein, leader of Indonesian outland rebels, tonight gave President Sukarno five days to dissolve the cabinet of Premier Djardjuna.

The ultimatum was broadcast by the "Voice of the Revolution," headquarters of the rebels in Sumatra, Celebes, Borneo and other islands. Husein demanded that Sukarno, now in Japan on a visit, dismantle the cabinet and call for new elections. He said the rebels were now in the United States.

The rebels proposed that the new cabinet serve until the 1950 elections. Husein said the demand is not moderate. He said he will not accept any cabinet that does not follow the wishes of the rebels.
