Total general fund tax revenue for January, Tax Commissioner John L. Sullivan announced today, was \$3.7 million. Largest January revenue dips were recorded by the following:
Inheritance tax, down \$251,000;
alcoholic beverages, \$161,000; corporations, \$157,000; cigarettes,
\$110,000; and estates, \$71,000. Added to this is a 5 per cent de rease in sales tax receipts for the October-December months. This decline in the state's major revenue source-down \$1 million-did ot become apparent until February when the tax money started o flow into the state's coffers. But the general fund revenue for he past seven months held up eather well as compared to the July-January period of the previ-
