The high schoolers (45 girls and 21 boys) were asked to select their favorite five from among today's recorded hits. A first place vote was good for five points; second place was worth four points, and so on. No less than 86 songs were named.

The teenagers were also asked to choose their favorite male and female vocalists. Pat Boone received 22 votes and was at the top of a list of 17 names. Patti Page, with 16 votes, was judged the best of 22 songstresses listed. The proceeds will be used to send Manchester youths to this summer's Nutmeg Boys State at UConn.

Colonial House Burned

Bridgewater, Feb. 18 (AP)—Only rubble stood today where a colonial house and its valuable antiques were destroyed last night by fire.

The house, owned by former town clerk Mrs. Burton Canfield, burned last night in a fire that started about 10:30 p.m. and lasted for more than two hours to minimize damage, but the house was declared a total loss.

Unofficial estimates placed damage at more than \$40,000. The house contained many valuable antiques.

Mrs. Canfield was not living in the house at the time. Cause of the fire was not immediately determined.

Our "Good Offices"

Each of the parties involved in the "good offices" effort of the United States and Britain to bring reconciliation between France and Tunisia is looking for something different.

The United States and Britain are looking primarily for avoidance of an open United Nations debate which might force them to choose between their ally, France, and their friend, Tunisia. In other words they are looking for some solution which will smooth over the French bombing of a Tunisian village, and keep it from becoming a major world issue. In addition to this, they can promote some constructive adjustment of French policy in all North Africa, they may wind up doing something more than putting a temporary lid on the North African trouble.

Their hope for this additional achievement lies in the possibility that France, at last, may be willing to listen to reason, and willing to listen to it from her friends before the problem does become fully internationalized.

But this higher hope of the American and British "good offices" function does not burn too brightly when it is placed in relation to the hopes and purposes held by France and Tunisia.

Tunisia is seeking not merely the pacification of its own troubles with France, but the freedom of Algeria, as the necessary for a settlement of the whole North African problem.

And France, the moment after it finally decided to welcome the "good offices" of two major allies, began immediately to make it clear that what it really wants from them is help in improving its own chances for military victory in Algeria.

Tunisia thinks the crisis over the bombing of its village should be the thing which should lead to French concessions in Algeria. France thinks the same crisis should bring measures which would wall off Algeria and weaken the rebel cause so that French military victory can still be possible.

Things are not too bright, then, for this first definite venture of outside nations into the North African situation. But one certainty should be brought home to the French. If this friendly intervention of France's allies is not allowed to produce some positive results, nothing can keep the North African problem from the jurisdiction of the United Nations. This is the last chance for avoiding that world showdown which would require the United States to choose between France and North African freedom.

Neither Can Renege

Left to themselves, Russia and the United States could easily through avoid any new diplomatic postaght on world problems. All they would have to do would be to continue the present tone of their mutual correspondence which was set when Bulgarian, in his latest to Eisenhower, took cracks at his secretary of state, President Eisenhower, in return, has defended Mr. Dulles, and taken a few jabs of his own at a certain associate of Premier Bulganin, named Khrushchev.

Both of these letters of calculated insult are letters written primarily in advocacy of a summit conference. It is not necessary, in other words, to oppose a summit conference in order to prevent one from being held. Instead, you can advocate a summit conference, but so it in a way which makes it look like a ridiculous proposition.

That is what President Eisenhower now charges the Russians with doing: in their voluminous correspondence. And, even while he accuses the Russians, justly enough, he tries a little of the

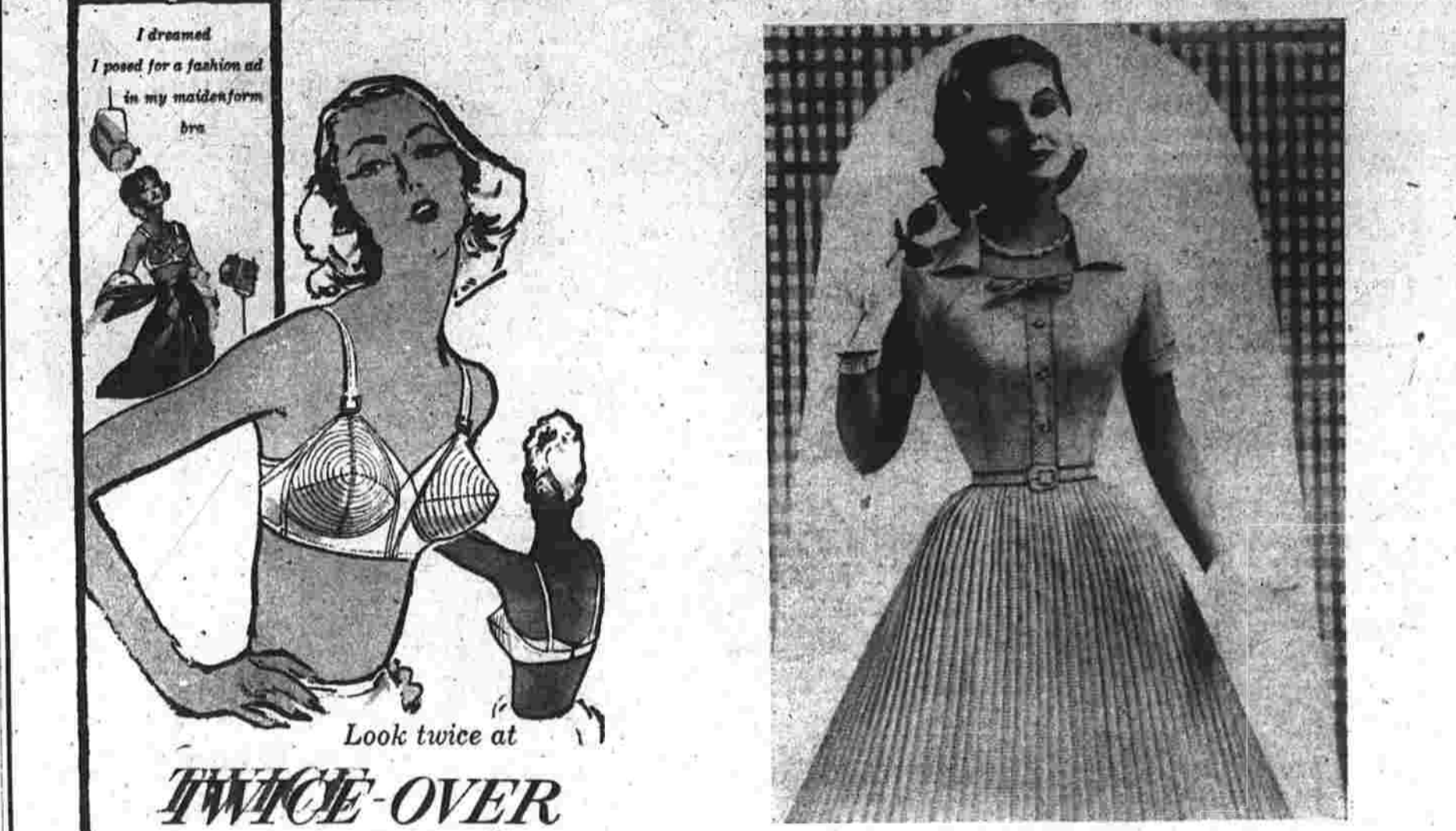
