Red Black Market Records Sell Fast

Moscow, March 7 (AP)—The black market is doing a booming business packing phonograph records to music-loving Russians. One newspaper advised the state-owned record company to turn out more records. It increased the output of 15 hours of recorded music, and distribute some fresh recordings of the classic repertoire.

The marketeers have taken to making their own records, transcribed from foreign players, which they sell through the Soviet Union, or from pickups of foreign records. They turn them out on a large scale, and have no difficulty in finding eager buyers. The Soviet market will snap up anything he can get. "Jazz or Rock 'n' Roll."

But not only pop stuff still sells like hot cakes in the black market, but also the more serious recordings of the classics to which the public's demand is growing. The Soviet Union does not produce enough of the classics to satisfy the public's demand, and a batch of recordings of a classic is sold out. It takes as much as two years before another pressing is made available.

The lover of classical music has no choice but to wait—or find on the black market one of the records transcribed from a foreign disc or broadcast.

France Low In Engineers

Grenoble, France, March 7 (AP)—France is planning a determined effort to overcome a critical shortage of engineers for the atomic age with rigorous tests for workers at its universities. The pilot scheme has been going here in Grenoble since 1953. Soon it will be extended to the universities of Nancy, Toulouse, Besancon and Aix-en-Provence. In the end, 30 centers are expected to turn out 1,000 extra engineers a year.

The French lack of engineers is serious. Charles Millard, a state highway engineer, recently told the Academy of Moral and Political Sciences that France handed out only 4,000 engineering diplomas last year, while the United States trained 75,000. Great Britain 12,000 and the Soviet Union 165,000.

The idea launched here in Grenoble is to educate workers who have practical experience but have never studied the theory behind what they are doing. Each year 200 workers from 20 to 40 years old have 2-hour courses nightly after 5-hour work. Those who come from outside Grenoble or its suburbs work all day Saturday and Sunday morning. The courses total 14 hours a week, and for each hour of lectures there is 1 1/2 hours of practical work. English is obligatory.

After three years of part-time study, worker-students can graduate with a diploma from the faculty of sciences. If they stay on two years more, they may undertake a 1-year full-time course in the National Superior School of Engineering alongside students regularly working for their professional engineering diploma.

The faculty consists of 40 professors—30 from the University and 10 from industry. Factory participating in the scheme usually allow their worker-students to quit work half an hour early to get to class. Some pay them for a 50-hour week although they work only 45.

Some worker-students have tripled their salaries in their regular jobs as a result of the knowledge they have gained in their studies. Railroads still carry more than half the freight transported in the United States despite increasing use of trucks.

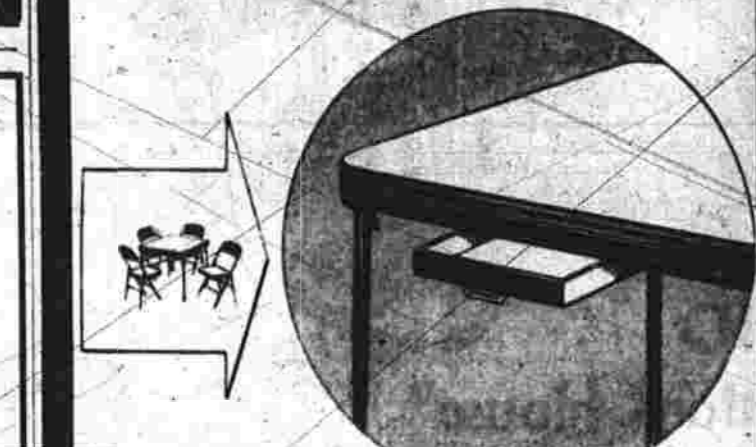
