part time—three and four days a week—Meany added, and it's the equivalent of another 3,500,000 unemployed. He said, "No longer contributing their purchasing power to keep the economy going."

He called for action on both the administration and Congress, saying:

"Almost Too Late
The administration is too late because it has not done enough to share the political responsibility. The people on Capitol Hill must share the blame too. Congress need not have waited for administration leadership."

Saying it's time to "put America to work" by backing prosperity and jobs and restoring America's world military leadership. Meany said:

"To get the money out of the pockets of the rich and the pockets of the idle, the Democrats know they can make progress. The Republicans have to protect themselves by hiding the fact that, during the past few years, the economy has become dangerously unbalanced."

"This is not the time to indulge in party politics. Now is the time for all of us to matter what our political creeds are, to get together and get something done."

"That means abandonment of some of the administration's favorite and now thoroughly disproven economic theories. That means that for the good of the country, the Democrats go to the other side of the political capital to one side and do something."

He said:

"An end to joblessness that talk of millions of jobless men and women in terms of just plain statistics. These are not statistics, they are people. They are men and women."

Meany said there's no point in banding the nation's budget if it means increasing the connection and weakening defenses against Russia's growing might.
