





ASTATEMENT to the People of Connecticut

Publicity given to actions taken in recent meetings of several county medical associations in opposition to the new CMS Connecticut Contract has, in some instances, raised the question as to whether or not CMS will continue to offer surgical-medical-obstet-

rical benefits to its members. The Executive Committee of CMS reassures every CMS member that through its Participating Physicians, Con-necticut Medical Service will continue to provide the professional services covered by its contracts in the future, just as it has in the past. There is no intent to discontinue the Preferred Contract, which is not involved in the present controversy, and which provides coverage for 98% of CMS members.

We are able to make these statements because of the assurances of continued participation which have been received from responsible physicians in all fields of medical practice throughout our state, and because of the fundamental purposes for which CMS was established.

The Basic Principles of CMS

To most members the words "CMS helps pay doctor bills" are completely descriptive, but the basic concept is much broader. CMS was founded in 1948 and as a public service corporation riot organized for profit. Sponsored by the Connecticut State Medical Society, it has served as the physician's own answer to the public need for voluntary prepayment of surgical-medical-obstetrical care. Through CMS the medical profession undertook a tremendous responsibility for public service in keeping with the profession's highest traditions. It is important to note that CMS was formed "... with the sole objective of serving the general public of Connecticut and particularly that part falling in the lower income category."*

*From report of the Committee on Prepaid Medical Service, House of Delegates of the Connecticut State Medical Society, December 9, 1948 Paragraph 3.

Why The Present Controversy? The current publicized opposition to CMS by certain county medical associations has resulted from the introduction of the new Connecticut Contract, designed to contribute further to CMS goals which were established by the physicians themselves in 1948, and to meet today's public need for broader medical care coverage. Principal objections center around the increase in Service Benefits Limits to families with a total income of \$7500 and the Equivalent Full Payment provision. The Preferred Contract continues to provide full Service Benefits to family members whose total income is not over \$5000. Equivalent Full Payment does not interfere with the right of any Non-Participating Physician to set his own fees. It does inform the memberpatient of the amount which any Participating Physician would accept as full payment for the same professional services had he performed them, and his member-patient qualified for Service Bene-

Where The Opposition Centers

Much of the opposition to the new Connecticut Contract in the meetings of the county medical , associations has come from physicians who do not participate and who, therefore, do not guarantee Service Benefits to their patients. Non-Participating Physician members of county medical associations, however, are free to voice their opposition in discussions of CMS contracts. The two features

emphasized by the opposing physicians mentioned above appear only in the new Connecticut Contract which is now being offered for the first time. It appears to have great value to the public at large. and CMS is confident that it will be found advantageous to practicing physicians when its provisions are better understood.

The Participating Physician is CMS

The very existence and growth of CMS has been made possible only through the loyal support of Participating Physicians. From an original group of 1534, participation has increased each year. By the end of 1957, the number represented over 90% of all practicing physicians in Connecticut. These dedicated men have accepted full payment under Service Benefits provisions in 52% of all the claims paid by CMS. Members are today well aware that participation in CMS is the physician's finest pledge of service to the people of Connecticut.

Who Operates CMS?

Of the 73 Blue Shield Medical Care Plans in the United States, CMS is the only Plan with a Board of Directors on which laymen and physicians are equally represented. These laymen and physicians, who serve without compensation, have the responsibility of operating CMS in the public interest and on behalf of the Participating Physicians of the medical profession. A Professional Policy Committee of 12 practicing physicians, together with the Board of Directors, administer all aspects of CMS dealing with professional medical services, fees, and professional policies. Each physician of the Professional Policy Committee or the Board of Directors is appointed to his position through a democratic procedure which gives full representation to each practicing physician in the same manner as he is represented in the Connecticut General

Assembly or the National Congress. **CMS Today**

As of December 31, 1957 CMS had 1,039,000 members . . . almost one-half the population of Connecticut. Its 2,938 Participating Physicians represented over 90% of all the physicians practicing in Connecticut. CMS is the 9th largest of the 73 Blue Shield Plans in the United States. CMS has paid over \$50,000.000 for doctor's services received by members on 1,017,000 claims. The mothers of 41% of the 55,836 babies born in Connecticut during 1957 were covered by CMS benefits. CMS at this time is paying at the rate of over one million dollars per month for the professional services covered by its contracts. The help that CMS has provided in meeting the cost of adequate medical care is evidenced by its remarkable growth and acceptance as a public service.


CMS is Here To Stay

Many physicians are distressed by the actions of their county medical associations and have asked how they might assist CMS in the present controversy. In several local medical societies and hospital professional staffs, these feelings have led to positive action in supporting CMS. CMS is confident that similar decisions will be made by other physician groups throughout the state when the potential for public service of the Connecticut Contract is discussed on an objective basis. CMS agrees entirely with a recent editorial comment on the controversy that "the argument between CMS and the doctors is a private one only so long as it is conducted in responsible private terms and does not infringe upon the public welfare . . .".



Somewhere close behind it in an 18,000-mile an hour orbit hundreds of miles out from the Earth was the 50-pound, 5-foot long, 20 inches wide third stage rocket that pushed Vanguard to orbital speed.

The Navy estimated that the sphere would stay in orbit 5 to 10 years. The dead rocket in its wake will have a much shorter tide.

Some officials of Martin Co, which built the Vanguard test rockets, suggested that the orbit peak may be considerably above the 2,500 miles officially accorded it, possibly to 3,000 miles or higher.
