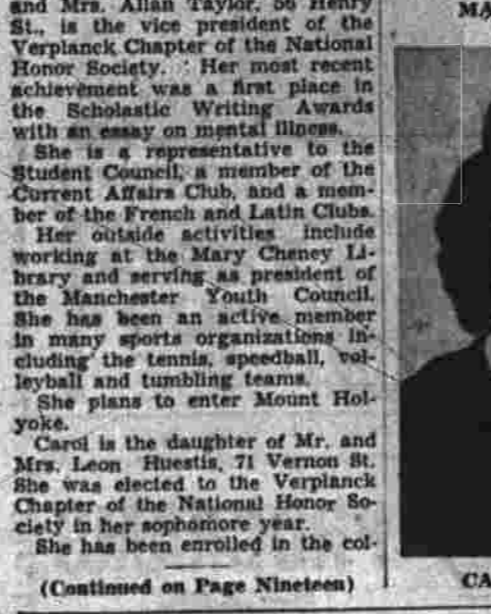

Rockville Police to Get New Teletype

A teletype machine, ordered for the Rockville Police Department... The teletype will provide information on stolen cars, missing persons, jail and prison escapes and other police business... Local officials have assigned a teletype operator to the local police department for some time... The department has its own radio system, but it is not connected with the State Police or the mutual aid system... Calls other than those between headquarters and the city's two patrol cars at present must be made by telephone... The current budget includes \$675 for the new machine... Commissioner Yaskulis, commenting on the teletype, said, "Police business has got to grow the same as everything else. The only reason more money is being spent now is because things have been let go. It did not elaborate on that statement."... A request for a similar machine for the Vermont Constabulary was cut out by the Board of Finance when the new budget was presented by the Board of Selectmen... The Selectmen had asked \$500 for a teletype when they submitted their Budget for the constabulary, formed at the beginning of this fiscal year in the 44th state, Hawaii, and Canada...

A left fire last month in the downtown Manhattan area cost the lives of six firefighters.

Among the injured was Edward Wilson S. Mearns, a truck driver who volunteered to help hold back the fire nets. A woman leaping from the building missed the net and landed on the fire.

The woman and five were taken to a hospital.

Survivors were high in their praise of the fire department's action in getting them out of the burning structure.

But the fire also killed two children and did not spare the rest of their family.

Mr. Mearns, 44, was killed by a fall from the roof. His wife, Mrs. Mearns, 38, was killed by a fall from the same place.

Others who were killed were: Mrs. Mearns' daughter, Mrs. Mearns' son, and Mrs. Mearns' daughter-in-law.

The fire started in a second-floor apartment at 12:30 a.m. on Sunday. It spread to the floor above and then to the roof.

The fire was extinguished at 3:30 a.m. on Monday.

Artist's Window Remains Same But His View Keeps Changing

Laguna Beach, Calif. — From the view window of his cliff-top home, R. Stephens Wright looks out over 40 feet down and sea cliffs extending west and north in the crystal-clear waters of Laguna Beach.



From his desert home 100 miles from the view of the mountains, the ocean, the coast, a landscaped courtyard where a fountain bubbles in the cool night air.

Wright is a nationally known portrait artist. He has wealth but no social position. There's nothing unusual about the fact that he has two vacation homes.

Wright is one of the four million Americans who live in trailers or one part of the time. Of course, he isn't typical — but he is in both the national and Southern California social registers, and few society types are trailerists. But then, among trailer folk, who is typical?

Wright for instance, spends the summer in his 36-footer at "Treasure Island," a fashionable but not exclusive park on the bluffs at Laguna Beach, some 50 miles south of Los Angeles.

When the first cold wind of winter blows in off the Pacific, Wright calls a trailer moving firm. For 250 to 300 dollars he has his trailer moved to winter quarters at Palm Springs Skyridge park, where trailers are parked in neat squares around fancy courtyards.

Wright has enough money to keep the trailer for vacations and weekends — his permanent residence in Pasadena. But there are many Southern Californians of modest means who could afford to live in a trailer-park neighbor.

The Doctor Says

Extra Tapeworm Must Be Expelled to End Parasite

A correspondent writes that she has a tapeworm and "at times feels very uncomfortable with it." She also wants to know what she should take to get rid of this parasite.

I am somewhat puzzled by this letter, since I cannot understand how the writer knows she has a tapeworm unless she has been to a physician who has made that diagnosis. If she has done this I cannot understand why the physician has not recommended treatment. If she hasn't had a doctor's diagnosis, then her uncomfortable sensations might well be the result of something else.

Tapeworms are only one group of animal parasites, many of which attack human beings. There are at least 20 different kinds of tapeworms which may produce intestinal trouble in human beings, but only six of these are common ones.

These six are: Beef tapeworm, pork tapeworm, fish tapeworm, dwarf tapeworm, rat tapeworm and dog tapeworm.

In man the heads of these parasites become attached to the bowel wall and grow by segments back of the head. Sometimes they become extremely long. Beef tapeworms, for example, have been measured up to 12 or 15 feet.

It is a common notion that tapeworms lead to the consumption of a great deal of food without corresponding gain in weight; the tapeworm takes it all. But this is not truly characteristic.

Ordinarily, there are no symptoms for some time until the tapeworm has attached and grown for as long as three or four months. From this time on the symptoms include such things as diarrhea, alternating with constipation, hunger, pain, loss of appetite, sleep, lassitude and/or nervousness. Sometimes there may be no symptoms at all.

The correct procedure, if the presence of any kind of tapeworm in the intestinal tract is suspected, is to examine for tapeworm eggs or for shred segments of the tapeworm. This, of course, can be done effectively only by microscopic examination.

Once diagnosis has been determined the use of one or more medicines—usually drugs aimed at expelling the entire worm are indicated. The effectiveness of the treatment has to be determined by finding the head because if this is not expelled the tapeworm will resume its growth. The outlook for complete recovery is good.

Getting rid of the tapeworm is troublesome. Hence prevention is important.

All tapeworms are killed by thorough cooking of possibly contaminated foods such as beef, pork or fresh water fish.

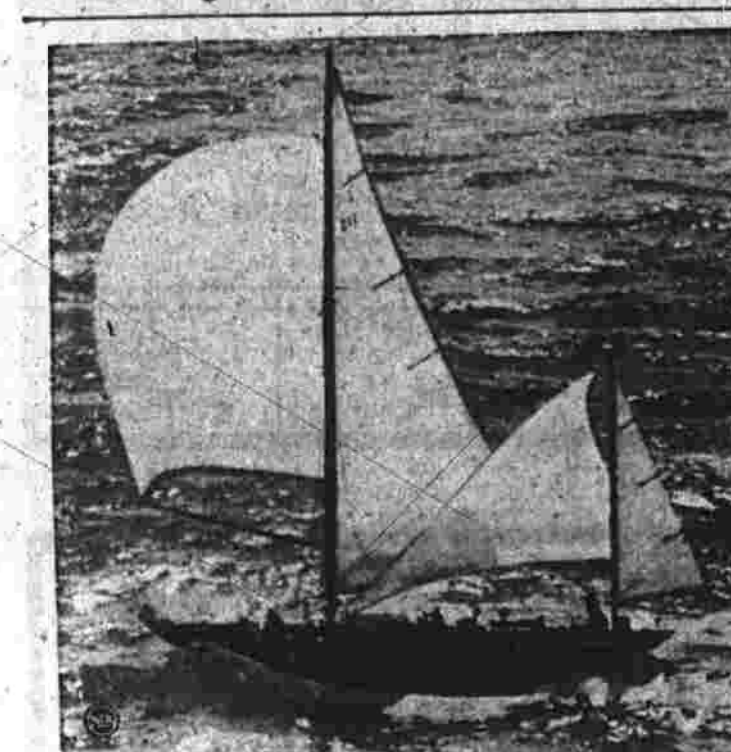
