

Warning by Specialists All Under 40 Need Three Polio Shots

Washington, March 24 (AP)—A booster shot of anti-polio vaccine is "necessary at this time," says a group of polio specialists.

However, the group has urged all persons under 40, particularly pre-school children, take the recommended three shots of the vaccine.

The group, which advises Surgeon Gen. Leroy E. Burney of the Public Health Service, said it is of "paramount importance" that all three shots be taken.

The specialists said a person isn't considered vaccinated until he has done so.

During the day-long meeting, the specialists also underscored Burney's warning that serious polio outbreaks could occur this summer if vaccination is not expedited.

On another health front, the nation's hospitals were urged to return to "rigid standards of cleanliness" to combat a new strain of bacterial infection blamed for the death of 25 Texas babies since Jan. 1.

The plan came from Dr. Alexander Langmuir, chief of the Epidemiology Branch of the Communicable Disease Center (CDC) in Atlanta, Ga.

Langmuir suggested cleaner hospitals would help curb a stubborn new drug-resistant staphylococcus he said is becoming a nationwide problem.

Ellington Doctors Agree To Administer Polio Vaccine

Dr. Roy Ferguson of Rockville, Dr. John Raffner of Dr. Joseph Kristan, both of Ellington, will give polio inoculations for the PTA Council Polio program.

The first of the series will be given April 9 and 10 by the doctors at their offices from 8 to 9 p.m.

Other Ellington and Rockville doctors were contacted and asked to take part in the series of three inoculations.

"Before that time," Langmuir added, "a doctor or surgeon knew he could not operate without rigid cleanliness."

At Ellington, where 16 babies have died of the infection, the City Health Department said preliminary tests indicate more than half of the 123 employees in city-county hospital pediatric department are harboring the disease.

Health officers said the bacteria are carried on the skin and in dust, and also are found in dust, linens and laundry.

At Rockville, where 10 babies have died from the disease and at other babies have died in hospital, there is no indication of a statewide epidemic.

Langmuir said the CDC has investigated something like a dozen outbreaks and that the Health Department is giving advice to any hospital having a problem.

Ellington and Rockville are among the four main types of problems from the infection—impetigo, breast abscesses in nursing mothers, surgical wounds in chronic bedridden patients.
