Trucks Hit Cars In Mishaps Here

No one was hurt, no arrests were made, and only minor damage was reported in two car-truck accidents in Manchester yesterday, one of which involved a four-wheeled vehicle.

Teenagers Held For Shoplifting

Two Manchester boys, 13 and 15 years old, have been turned over to juvenile authorities after admitting to police they rifled a car and snatched several items in two stores yesterday afternoon.

Police Chief Herman O. Schmidt said this is what happened:

A shopper (not identified) at the Manchester Parkade saw the two boys get into a parked car and begin going through the glove compartment. He questioned them and asked their names, revealing sufficient replies. He then went into one of the stores and called police.

When Patrolman Robert L. Lannan arrived at the Parkade, the boys had fled but the officer got their description from the man. Lannan located the boys walking down W. Middle St. and took them to police headquarters.

During questioning, the two boys admitted that they had stolen three other things which were located before they tried the fourth.

Twelve-Year-Old Faces Killing Trial

Woodward, Ohio, March 28 (AP)—Twelve-year-old Robert Butler today faced the prospect of being tried for murder or robbery.

Robert was ordered by County Judge James Young to face criminal charges in the shooting death of Floyd Blair, a Woodward grocer, last Sunday. No charges have been filed against the boy who is jailed here.

Judge Young said the youngster was not old enough to know right from wrong. Robert's brother, David, 10, was sent to a boys ranch. David was shot through the heart and two other men wounded.

The crash, for boys from broken homes, is sponsored by the Indianapolis Christian League, a private state organization. It is located in north central Oklahoma.

County Atty. Gen. S. King said he was still undecided what charge to file. He said if Robert were convicted it would be up to the state prosecutor to determine where the boy would be kept.

Sacred Cantata Slated Sunday

Mr. John Blaine's sacred cantata, "The Crucifixion," will be sung by the senior choir of St. Mary's Church Sunday evening at 7. The musical rights at the beginning of Holy Week classes the annual "Crucifixion to Easter" Sunday service. Quite apart from its musical value, "The Crucifixion" teaches the passion story very aptly because of the author's fine selection of Biblical texts.

The cantata will follow sung Evening Prayer. The director and accompanist is to be Sydney MacAlpine, St. Mary's director of music. Soloists are William R. Kloppeberg, Louis R. Lawrence, Donald K. Kral, Richard Henshaw, and Miss Lily Boyce. Members of the senior choir will form the chorus.

"The Crucifixion" was last sung in St. Mary's on Palm Sunday of 1956. Blaine wrote it especially for his own choir, which was that of St. Paul's Cathedral in London. When Sir John became organist at St. Paul's in 1952 he found the choir in wretched condition, and raised it to the level of the best in England in his day. He wrote with an intimate knowledge of St. Paul's acoustics and limitations, thus putting most of his works within the range of the average parish choir. The popularity of many of his anthems undoubtedly due to this fact as well as his excellent textual choices which are indicative of a fine standard of churchmanship.

In presenting the "Crucifixion" Sunday evening, St. Mary's senior choir are reliving the boys' choir who have sung at the evening service since the beginning of November. These boys were in the church for the last time in the winter service last Sunday.
