Cured Cancer Congress Launches 1958 Crusade

said. President Edmund H. Levey of the International Telephone and Telegraph Corp., called for "dedicated dollars" to help fight cancer. He urged corporations, in spite of the business recession, to double previous contributions.

"Business may not be so good in some areas of the country," he said, "but cancer is worse in any area of the country."

Alton Blakeslee, Associated Press science reporter, in a dispatch from Chicago, said that cancer researchers are showing human bodies to fight cancer beyond the power of the surgeon's knife.

"The rivers are flouid, coming along with cancer invading the pancreas and prostate glands when the cancer is stimulated or fed by hormones produced or controlled by the pituitary glands. In the newest method, the 'BBS' can be placed in the gland with a needle inserted through the neck under local anesthesia. Photographic pictures are used to guide the needle accurately. This method has brought some improvement and pain relief in about half of persons treated, the physicians said."

This technique exposes the tissues directly and intimately to the radiation, and avoids radiation hazard to surgeons and nurses. The physical and toxic science writers making tour of research centers. In another technique, small envelopes, containing hotting paper have been implanted near tumors of the eye. Then the envelopes are filled with radioactive atoms to kill the cancer. Tiny "BBS" of radioactive strontium, a chemical element, have organ or tissue.

This is one of a number of bold new methods of fighting cancer. It was described today by Dr. Paul V. Harper, surgeon of Argonne Cancer Research Hospital and University of Chicago, and Dr. William M. Gross, ear and throat specialist of the University of Chicago and Biological Research Center.

The Limits of Power

If we were asked to define the satellite country, that is where Russian domination today is most absolute, and the ruler who is the most the puppet for Russia, most of us would respond with Hungary, as the country, and Janos Kadar, whom the Russians army put into power after it crushed the Hungarian revolution in 1956, as the puppet.

Russia knows we are about to hold a scheduled series of bomb tests of our own, and the world knows it, and nobody really expects us to fall in line immediately and forego these tests.
