No "Free Spender"

To the Editor:

Not wanting to get tagged as a free spender with the Town's money, I would like to clear the atmosphere surrounding what was purportedly my words at the April 1, 1958 Manchester Board of Directors meeting, concerning the financing of new light installations on Main St.

The walkway situation had been discussed at length at the meeting. The plan of having a traffic survey, followed by a public hearing, had been approved by the Board. At that time, the financing arose, seemingly driven in as one more dilatory tactic by the opponents of the project. Being so concerned about financing our projects in Manchester as any other local taxpayer and of the feeling that when such a problem is raised, it has the effect of slowing a project's progress at a time when it is in the embryo stage, it was felt that some work could be worked on concurrently, rather than before we know whether we are going to find the money to do it.

The Flare-Backs of Progress
