Defining the Problem TDC Mapped Plan To Lure Industry

(Note: This is the first of four parts as that of the Commission — to draw attention to its work and to new competition. Merchants are trying to sell goods, the Development Commission.)

Two years ago the Manchester Development Commission, was operating on a \$1,575 budget. Last year it asked for aid, after considerable controversy, got \$14,000.

This year the Commission is seeking \$22,577 for its work.

Undoubtedly there are many taxpayers in Iowa who, quite understandably, want to know what a bit more about the functions of the Commission, its aims, and what it has accomplished so far to justify this further request for a loosening of the municipal purse strings.

First of all, the primary objective of the Commission is to attract new industry to Manchester, and the members have found that the time-worn phrase, "you have to spend money to make money" applies here as to most of just about everything else.

Manchester isn't the first town, by any means, to decide it needs new industry to secure more local employment or additional sources of tax revenue. The Commission is keen all over the country and the Commission has found that meeting this competition is expensive, at least during the formative stages in 1957-58. It is a matter of money, not merely beating the "publicity" drum, but discriminatingly sending out "propaganda" proclaiming the town's superiority over all others.

Big business doesn't respond to pretty phrases and high-sounding phrases alone — these may be attractive but they fail to attract an industrialist who contemplates setting up a branch or moving an entire company to a new locale.

Facts and figures on which to justify a move, such as high cost of power sources available, shipping costs, and costs, labor markets, types of labor available, climatic conditions and a hundred other things before getting before his board of directors to make a recommendation to make the move.

Then there's another question to be considered. What type of the 477 major industries in the country does Manchester want to attract?

Undoubtedly a town which prides itself on being a "city of village charm" wouldn't be too happy with a factory whose chimney would pollute the air or cause other problems—no matter what kind of taxes it paid.

Problems begot problems, for other questions immediately pop up.

How to Contact

After it is decided what Manchester wants in the way of industry, how should these industries be contacted? What approach should be used? Who handles the tremendous amount of paper work involved?

Confronted with these and other questions, the Commission, quite frankly admitted last year that it was more than it could handle without professional help. No matter how public spirited the unpaid members of the Commission couldn't devote the required time and effort to the program and still work at their regular jobs.

They also felt it would be unfair to the taxpayers to spend money over a period of years while they used a "trial and error" program aimed at attracting the wanted industry.

With this in mind the TDC fought for and got the necessary funds last year to hire a director who would handle the complex problems arising out of the town's search for new industry.

It was a fight too? There were many who felt there was no need for taping the Commission's budget for the purpose. It was only when the members put it on the basis of "either give us money to do our job or do away with the Commission" that the money was forthcoming.

Even then, the problem was only partially solved. Salaries are high for the type of director the Commission wanted and the money the Commission was in a position to pay, it could not get a man with the qualifications or experience the Commission felt were necessary to do the job right.

Preferred Consultant

After several months search the Commission came to the conclusion it would do well to avail itself of the services of a consulting firm rather than attempt to have a full-time director.

About six months ago, the Commission retained such a firm, Economic Development Associates, Inc., of Boston, at an annual fee of \$10,000, to do all the necessary "legwork" in setting up a professional program on which to operate.

Plans for a full-time director, although temporarily set aside, were not discarded entirely, for the Commission still feels the need for such an individual exists.

At first glance, the \$10,000 fee may seem exorbitant, but taxpayers are unfamiliar with the type of job the consulting firm had been hired to do.

However, many a business firm in Manchester spends this amount or more on advertising each year to accomplish much the same pur-

pose as that of the Commission — to draw attention to its work and to new competition. Merchants are trying to sell goods, the Development Commission.)

consideration is that the Commission's budget should show a drop in the next year or so, for, by that time, all of the necessary groundwork in setting up the program will have been done and it should be well established.

With this in mind, the Commission is already seeking funds in this year's budget for a trainee for the job of directing this program in the future.

The idea is for a qualified man to study with the consulting firm until he has the fundamentals down. He will then take over the continuing job of telling the "Manchester story," while the private firm steps into the background and

Stockholders of New Haven Face Profit Problem Today

New Haven, April 9 (AP)—How to make money with a struggling railroad is a problem confronting New Haven Railroad stockholders at their annual meeting today.

Another is the question of who will manage the large northeastern rail empire. A proposed slate of directors awaits a stockholder vote.

The money-making problem is especially acute to the New Haven, which lost nearly \$24 million last year after finishing slightly in the black in 1956.

In economic terms, it is the same imbalance that faces most other railroads in a booming air age—rising costs of operation combined with plunging passenger and freight revenues.

On the management side, five independent directors are up for election as the result of a compromise that averted a threatened proxy fight.

The compromise was reached when the five agreed upon by the Railroad and a group of stockholders, who want more of a say in its operation.

Threat of a proxy fight arose Jan. 28, when the group, Allyn & Co., filed a suit seeking access to the railroad's list of preferred stockholders.

Allyn, represents five other stockholder firms. Together they hold 131,265 of the road's 490,714 outstanding shares of preferred stock. The stock was purchased after the railroad was in desperate need of repairs money after the 1953 floods.

Books Show Deficit

The New Haven's financial books show that its net income for 1957 had a deficit of \$2,563,702. The year before, it had a net loss of \$261,704.

Early this year, the railroad was forced to lay off about 6 per cent of its work force—nearly 800 workers—because of dwindling freight car loadings and passenger ticket sales.

It also tried to discontinue some lines because of insufficient interest from shippers and passengers. There was growing computer discontent.

Friend To Attend Cincinnati Class In Nasal Surgery

Dr. Amos E. Friend, 79, Connecticut, will participate in an intensive postgraduate course in reconstructive nasal surgery at the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine.

College Students Get Opportunity To Study Abroad

Students of the University of Hartford will be able to spend one year studying in France as the result of a new arrangement made between the modern language department of Hillier College and the Faculty of the University of Montpellier.

The program will be effective next September.

A separate college to be known as the American College at the University of Montpellier has been founded permanently on the campus of the university in southern France.

Participants in the program will be registered as regular students at Hillier College of the University of Hartford and will receive a full year's academic credit toward the bachelor's degree.

The faculty will be composed of English-speaking professors at the university. Instruction in the early stages will be given in English. Gradually, the courses will be shifted into French as the student becomes fluent in the language.

Three separate programs will be up for French majors, non-French majors, and a less advanced program open to students in the freshman and sophomore years. The program is primarily aimed at students in the junior year.

The students will live with French families during the year abroad, and will have the opportunity during Christmas and Easter vacations to take low-cost tours to an Austrian ski resort and to Spain, Italy, and the Isle of Capri.

Library Lines

On the evening of Friday, Aug. 9, 1957, a cyclone struck Wallingford, killing 29 persons. The fatalities in town by an eyewitness, John Kendrick, in "History of the Wallingford Disaster," a slim book published a few months after the event. It was recently acquired by the Mary Cheney Library as part of its Commemorative collection.

The Catholic church was destroyed and the schoolhouse badly damaged. The city's business buildings were totally wrecked, and many others partially destroyed. The loss, in 1878 dollars, was \$160,000. Within seven weeks the total of \$15,000 had been collected to help those whose houses and personal possessions had been lost.

Well over 100 special constables were created. "The city was divided upon as 15c per hour, but many refused to work, and the city had to put out the militia, but contributed from his own purse \$100 to the relief fund. He said he had a kind of old-fashioned notion that the militia should never be called out until the civil power had been exhausted."

So many nightseers arrived on Saturday that the following day no trains were allowed to stop in Wallingford. Still the people came and in a wagon full of "crackers and cheese and herring were soon exhausted. Many took dinner in bars and many returned home faint from hunger."

Martin, Union Agree On New Memorandum

General Manager Richard Martin and organized Iowa employees agreed today on a new 2-year memorandum of understanding.

With new understanding on sick leave, a worker no longer will be employed one year before becoming eligible for such leave with pay. He will now be entitled to one day a month upon employment.

Rockville May Get New Post Office

The Post Office Department has promised to consider a new Post Office in Rockville and 12 other Connecticut cities if Congress raises the rate of out-of-town letters to five cents. A remodeling program at the Rockville Post Office costing \$47,000 was begun in November and is now nearly complete.

The Post Office Department also plans to make arrangements for new Post Offices in Andover, Columbus and 27 other communities on a lease basis.

The announcement was made by U.S. Sen. William A. Purtell in Hartford, today. Purcell is Post Office Manager. Donald D'Amico said he knows nothing of the Post Office Department's plans for the Rockville Post Office, but feels that the city should get one since the post office there is one of the oldest in the state.

The post office was built in 1817 at the corner of Park and School Sts.

Prior to a revision of the mail routes on April 5, the post office served 21,000 people. No estimate is available yet on the number of people served under the new arrangements.

The post offices in Andover and Columbus are about 10 years old and are located in buildings leased from residents of those towns.

The Columbia Post Office is located in a store owned by Clair Robinson and the Andover Post Office is located on the first floor of an apartment building owned by Norman Bonneau.
