plans today only as Choi. They said he was about 30 years old and a native of North Pyongan Province, north of the Communist Korean capital. Part of his family lives in the north, they added. There appeared to be some belief that Choi was not necessarily a Communist agent but just wanted to return to his birthplace. A special investigation board left for Pyongyang.

An Air Force announcement said Choi made his attempt to hijack the plane with seven South Koreans aboard, took off on a flight from Taegu to Seoul. The aircraft was to pick up a group of newsmen for them to graduation ceremonies at a naval and air academy near Pusan.

A struggle developed between a man of subversive nature and seven men aboard the plane. The hijacker would be armed with a 45 caliber revolver, the announcement reported, adding that the rest of the crew fought "heroically and courageously." Sgt. Kim Sang Bok was the spokesman who was in command of the crew. Capt. Kim Kap Kyoo, the pilot, and Sgt. Chon Byong Hoon, the copilot, were the pilots who made the landing was led. Chong Byong Hoon was reported unharmed.

very soon." Instead of the 50,000 arrested revolutionaries the chief-in-command said would rise up, probably less than 200 answered the call. The rebels insisted the 24-hour curfew had been launched as an all-out attempt to suppress the rebellion and that the public should be allowed to hear their radio and television stations.

In the government camp heavily armed national police to kill any motorist suspected of carrying weapons. Two men were hauled from an automobile carrying 119 gallons of gasoline and kerosene. Another was shot down when he hurried a gasoline bomb at a police car.

By the time Havana quieted down around midnight at least 20 rebels had been counted dead in the capital. Ten policemen were killed in the suburbs and a number wounded.

The outbreak was the first fighting in Havana since Castro called for "total, implacable war" against Batista beginning last Saturday. Most of the recent fighting has been in easternmost Oriente Province. Castro's headquarters are in Havana. Some observers have knocked out most road and rail traffic.

Police raiders in recent weeks have captured a number of rebel leaders in Havana. Some observers thought Castro's forces would have to strike in the capital soon or see their strength evaporate. Castro himself admitted yesterday his men were running low on arms and ammunition.
