Boom Predicted In East of State

Putnam, May 7 (AP)—Eastern Connecticut is on the verge of an economic boom, says Gov. Ribicoff. Ribicoff said yesterday that the evidence can be seen everywhere. He cited new plants that have located in the area, construction of the Connecticut Turnpike and other road-redevelopment projects. Speaking at the 20th anniversary of the Building Highway Trust, Ribicoff said that the construction of the Turnpike and other road-redevelopment projects will be a major factor in the economic boom. He said the area had now become a center of growing industry and a source of a one-industry economy. The governor added that the state owes its importance as an industrial area to the competence of its workers. He said the personal pride and interest of Connecticut workers in their jobs had contributed significantly to what Ribicoff said was the state's economic growth. He pointed to the height of the 1955 floods in Putnam.

DON'T GIVE UP WITH BAD CARDS By Alfred Sheinwold Have you ever noticed that all of your friends constantly hold bad cards? You might think somebody has to hold the good cards, but it isn't so. In fact, practically always gets something like the cards in the East hand today. Let us see what a silent partner for them before we go on to the discussion of the hand. Strangely enough, it is up to East to make the best play in today's hand. Put that crying level away and see how his partner is to be a hero with a bad hand. West takes the first two tricks with the king and ace of spades. Then he looks around for new words to conquer. It looks like a bad day for new words. There are obviously no more spade tricks, no more diamond tricks, no more club tricks, only one trump trick. But West doesn't give up because he knows he has a good partner. He has a good partner. Nothing happens on the third round of spades, but the trick paves the way for something delicious later on. Partner opens with one diamond, and the next player passes. You hold: Spades—4; Hearts—Q J 9; Diamonds—5 4 2; Clubs—K Q J 3. What do you say? Answer: Bid one no-trump. The hand isn't quite worth a response of two clubs. You can scrape up ten points in high cards, but you have no need, only one king, and mediocre distribution. A response at the level of two clubs would be real values. ### Radioisotopes Aid In Heart Diagnosis

Minneapolis—Researchers at the University of Minnesota are investigating a method of using radioactive tracers to diagnose congenital heart diseases in infants.

"Right-left shunt"—abnormal transfers of blood from the heart's right side to its left through defects in the heart or great vessels—have hitherto been difficult to detect without puncturing an artery, a hazardous procedure in infants.

It has been found that several radiation detectors, plus X-ray active iodine injected through a vein, avoid artery puncture and can be made to yield a map of an infant's circulation, including the presence or absence of the hard-to-spot right-to-left shunt.

### 'Wildcat Money' From Michigan

Albany, N.Y.—In 1838 New York passed a "free banking" law and soon many independent state banks sprang up all over the country. For the most part, they were owned by the people of their communities and their business was local.

Until 1863 these notes circulated everywhere although many of the banks were in remote places where there were more wildcats than people.

Such banknotes came to be called "wildcat" currency. This name was first used in Michigan, where a bank bearing the name of a wildcat failed, and depositors, looking at their worthless money, said in derision, "Wildcat money from a wildcat bank!"

### The Doctor Says

Study of Gland Secretions In Vital Field of Research

A lengthy list of questions about ACTH and cortisone has been submitted by a reader. I shall attempt to answer the more important ones.

Both of these preparations are now quite well known and have been used in the study of diseases and in treatment. Both of them were originally obtained from glands of the adrenal secretion.

The tiny gland known as the pituitary lies on the underside of the brain at the base of the skull. This gland secretes several important hormones which are necessary for the development and function of various organs and which act, not only on the body as a whole, but also on other glands of internal secretion.

One of the hormones which is secreted from a portion of the pituitary body (or gland) acts on another important gland called the adrenal. There are two adrenal glands, which are also small and which lie close to the two kidneys.

This pituitary hormone activates or stimulates a portion of the adrenal glands and is called adrenocorticotrophic hormone, or ACTH for short.

Lacking the stimulating action of this pituitary hormone, important hormones (perhaps cortisone in particular) of the adrenal glands are not produced in sufficient amounts.

This is a complicated course. However, the last few years have made this subject of practical importance in the treatment of many diseases.

Several different diseases are being treated with success both with the adrenal secretion which is called cortisone, or by the stimulating pituitary secretion, ACTH. And there are related preparations which are also used.

Both ACTH and cortisone have remarkable effects. Both substances are being used in some eye diseases, in arthritis, in some allergies, in several infectious diseases and a number of other conditions, some of which have not up to this time responded well to other forms of treatment.

Medical science has known something about these glands of internal secretion and of the hormones which they produce for many years. However, the discovery of the extraordinary effects of these two hormones on many actions of the human body and on some of the body's diseases has stimulated a great deal of interest.

As a result, the tiny pituitary gland, like the two small adrenal glands, is being subjected to intensive studies.

From the practical point of view it should be realized that these substances may produce undesirable as well as wanted effects. Consequently they must be given with caution and the patient watched closely.

**Paper Issued in 1690**

Boston—In 1690, when some soldiers were clamoring for their wages, the Massachusetts Bay Colony found it necessary to issue paper money. From time to time it was used by other colonies and later by the Continental Congress during the Revolution. Over its life the lack of proper redemption provisions led to the expression "not worth a Continental." The plate for the first Continental currency were engraved by Paul Revere.

**Small Jet Engine Made**

Washington—A small jet engine for airplanes, weighing only 500 pounds and delivering a thrust of 1,000 horsepower, has been developed by one of the nation's leading jet-engine manufacturers.

The lightweight reaction device has a turbocharger engine 16 inches in diameter and 30 inches long. Its development is seen as a step toward reducing the weight and increasing the efficiency of jet-aircraft engines.

### Regional District 8 School Slates Year's Revue

All departments of the Regional District 8 high school will cooperate May 14 in displaying the achievements by students and faculty in the first year of operation. The display will be shown at the open houses from 7 to 10 p.m. Student guides will be named to direct visitors from the three district towns, Andover, Lebanon and Marlborough, on guided tours.

In addition to the usual parent-teacher conference, the main events will include an Industrial Arts Fair, with prizes awarded to the best student projects in each field; demonstrations and exhibits in the science laboratories, which open Monday; reading improvement program demonstrations; art students using various media; and a tour of the school library and a demonstration of Ex Libris Society work.

Also an exhibition and demonstration of projects made by algebra and geometry students, a co-ed volleyball game and other physical education program activities and a showing of film strips, films and other audio-visual aids.

An assembly will be held at 8:30 a.m. featuring the induction of new members into the local chapter of the National Honor Society.

Light refreshments will be available in the cafeteria in the latter part of the evening.

Leo Klopfer, science instructor, is co-ordinator for the overall program.

**Guidance Report Given**

At the regional board meeting this week, Miss Lois Clark, guidance director, reported that 112 of the 48 seniors enrolled are planning to attend a 4-year college while 19 more plan to take other special training. Only one of the college applicants has not been notified of acceptance as yet while five students planning special training have been accepted.

Students in all classes, Miss Clark said, have been given Sequential Tests of Educational Progress in March. Results of tests in Grades 7 and 8 show that regional school pupils are generally slightly above the national norm.

Leo Klopfer of the science department met with the board to make two requests: For a salary increase and consideration by the board of remuneration for work outside the classroom.

The board voted to adopt a 187-day school calendar identical to the calendar used by the district's elementary schools.

**Hardship Grant Granted**

In other business, chairman John B. Tompkins reported he had completed the compilation of material needed for application for a hardship grant.

After a discussion on methods to be used in hiring buses for field trips, the board agreed that bids will be let for the coming year.

Alfred Cadden was named to investigate procedures for letting bids on such contracts.

In the meantime, arrangements for transportation will be handled by Superintendent W. Christof Heuser.

Klopfer was called at the meeting to check with Frederick Kuhse of Oiled and Heat Hampton concerning science materials, which Kuhse has offered to the school.

A report by the cafeteria committee showed a balance of \$1,235.86 on April 30. During the month of April, 4,274 lunches, an average of 235 meals daily, were served.

**Eisenhower Bars Endorsing Sale**

Washington, May 7 (AP)—President Eisenhower has declined to lend his name to a proposed nationwide sales campaign aimed at pumping more consumer dollars into the economy.

Rep. Charles E. Chamberlain (R-Mich.) suggested in an April 18 letter to Eisenhower that he support a "president's sale" Chamberlain specifically mentioned automobiles but did not say the campaign should be limited to this field.

In his reply, Eisenhower wrote Chamberlain: "I am inclined against giving specific endorsement to a particular sales venture. He added he will continue preaching the general importance of consumer purchasing."

## President Orders U.S. Troops Leave Little Rock School

Washington, May 7 (AP)—President Eisenhower today ordered withdrawal May 29 of all federal troops enforcing school integration at Little Rock, Ark. The President said in a statement that he hopes it will be unnecessary to return the troops at the start of the school year in September.

Eisenhower's order on withdrawal were relayed by Secretary of the Army Bruce C. Mahan to Gen. Edwin Walker, commander of the troops which have been enforcing a court order for integration at Little Rock's Central High School since last September.

Eisenhower's statement said: "Since last September the federal government has stationed soldiers at the Little Rock High School in protest of the refusal of the school board to admit to the school the children of the U. S. District Court. . . . Since the summer recess started at the Central High School on May 28 and since there will be no more present need for the guardsmen, I have directed they be released May 29.

"Following that date I trust that state and local officials and citizens will assume full responsibility and duty for seeing that the orders of the federal court are not obstructed.

"The faithful execution of the responsibility will make it unnecessary for the federal government to reply to a question, 'What House press secretary James C. Hegerly said he did not know how many federal troops still are on duty at Little Rock.

"The number is much smaller than it was when the troops took over integration duty last September. Eisenhower ordered regular Army troops and federalized National Guardsmen to the area. (Continued on Page Sixteen)

## Dulles Sees Plot in Red Talk Moves

Berlin, May 7 (AP)—U.S. Secretary of State John Foster Dulles accused Russia today of using disinformation as a smokescreen to "produce a world dominated by the military power of the Chinese-Soviet bloc."

"He warned the West against abandoning its nuclear deterrent and the United States against allowing Soviet promises. He declared Soviet tactics to international pledges constitutes a grave obstacle to working out a east-west accord.

The IAM and UAW contracts expired at midnight last night. Plants in Fort Worth, Columbus, Ohio, Tulsa, Okla., Charlotte, N.C., and Tucson, Ariz., would have been affected by a walkout.
