ELMER DAVIS DIES; Famed Newsmen
Washington, May 19 (AP)—Elmer Davis, longtime radio news analyst, died yesterday of the effects of a stroke he suffered two months ago. He was 68. Davis, a white-haired Hoosier, had been relatively inactive since a heart attack five years ago. He is interred in the Washington National Cemetery. In addition, he wrote novels, short stories and essays, and worked for the New York Times for 10 years. Davis claimed himself as a Liberal. In 1947, that organization was winding up its 11th annual convention here when Davis died at George Washington University Hospital.

A private funeral was being planned but arrangements were incomplete. Tentative plans were made for a memorial service later at the Washington Cathedral. Davis, who was born in Aurora, Ind., is survived by his widow, the former Florence MacMillan, a daughter, Caroline Ann of Chicago, and a son, Robert Lloyd Davis, an assistant professor of Mathematics at the University of Virginia, Charlottesville.
