April index increase. This includes employees of the major auto companies. Labor contracts for these workers are expiring at the end of this month.

The automatic raises go to workers in the aircraft and electrical manufacturing industries.

The 2-cent increase which the auto workers would have received under the old contract is expected to be a factor in calculating new wage rates now being negotiated in Detroit.

Among workers receiving a 2-cent raise are employees of the International Harvester, Electric Auto Life, Studebaker and Buick Companies. Employees of Westinghouse Electric, Bell Aircraft, All-Chairmen and Caterpillar Tractor Company are due to receive a 2-cent hourly raise cost about 10 cents.

He said food prices — the main element which has been buoying up the index — usually hit a peak about July every year and decline in August as more local fruits and vegetables come to market.

The movement would create upward pressure for some weeks more.

But the government's living cost expert indicated belief that enough consumer items are showing decline tendencies to warrant an expectation that retail costs will soon level off.

Housing, medical care and personal care items all increased in April although clothing and transportation costs declined. The transportation items were down principally by lower prices for gasoline, new cars and tires. Used car prices rose slightly, indicating more people are turning to second hand automobiles.

Clearance sales for women's coats, suits and rayon dresses more than offset higher prices for men's slacks and suits and women's shoes.

Food items alone increased by seven-tenths of one per cent in April, reaching almost new record level.

A boost of 4 1/2 per cent in fruit and vegetable prices represented the joint effect of seasonal influences plus continued effect of adverse growing conditions in the winter and spring. Food costs were calculated at nearly 7 per cent above a year ago.

The Labor Department reported that the buying power of factory production workers declined again in April as a result of reduced hours of work and increased prices. Some reduction is usual this time of year.

Weekly spendable earnings in April were \$23.77, a factory worker with three dependents and \$26.50 for a single worker. These earnings were about 36 cents per week lower than in March and about 65 cents lower than April last year.

Thousands of persons were forced to walk to work. The streets in the heart of the downtown quarter were strewn with garbage cans. Demonstrators forced private cars to detour around the area. At least three homemade gasoline bombs exploded in scattered areas. Youngsters ranged down Central Avenue, the city's main thoroughfare, smashing parking meters.

The National Guard, which acts as both police and army, also is in the heart of the trouble. It is the object of the students' wrath since a high school boy was killed in a rock and tear gas clash between students and National Guardsmen.

The president of the program, assuming all states participate, has estimated somewhat in excess of \$600 million.

However, the bill provides for reimbursement of the federal advance. The payroll tax on employers in participating states would be increased, beginning in 1963, unless the money had been otherwise repaid by the states.

Supporters of the House measure contend that it preserves state rights, but opponents argue that few states would be likely to participate because the cost would put their employers at a competitive disadvantage.

Laid as voting for the substitute measure urged by Douglas were, in addition to Douglas, Sen. Robert Kerr (D-Okla.), Alister Gore (D-Tenn.) and George W. Malone (R-Iowa).

Gore called the House bill "nothing but shadow boxing with a national problem." He told newsmen he considers it "futile and inadequate."

Sen. Clinton Anderson (D-NM) joined Douglas, Kerr and Gore in voting against the bill. He said the House bill to the Senate without change. Malone, however, voted for the bill to the Senate after the defeat of Douglas' substitute.

The president had asked for a 3-cent rate on non-local letters in 1957 to offset the Post Office Department deficit estimated at \$700 million this year and next year.

"I'm not rich, but I'm comfortable. I'm not poor, but I'm not a beggar. I'm just a man who has a job and a family and a few dollars in the bank. I'm not a hero, but I'm not a villain. I'm just a man who is trying to get on in a world that is getting smaller and smaller."

Washington, May 22 (AP)—Take it from America's most honored poet: The way to a man's art is through his stomach.

Robert Frost, newly appointed poetry consultant to the Library of Congress, says part of his job is interesting politicians in the arts.

Asked at a news conference yesterday how he'll go about this, the 84-year-old poet quipped: "I guess we'll have to ask 'em to dinner once in a while."

Frost, winner of four Pulitzer prizes and about every poetry award there is, doesn't take over officially until October but he's already at work.

He had a long chat with President Eisenhower recently about politics as well as the arts.

"He told me, confided the white-haired poet, "fied to Jeffersonian Democrat but not a Jeffersonian Democrat."

Frost didn't clear up the distinction much by adding that he himself is "so much a Democrat that I'm almost a Republican."

Hard of hearing, but quick with a Yankee-witted answer, when he grasped the question, Frost made no secret of his pleasure with himself for playing a part in getting fellow poet Ezra Pound released from a Washington mental institution not long ago.

"I never was in court before," mused Frost. Then, chuckling, he corrected himself. "Except for somebody I punched once."

"Who'd he punch?" "A rival."

"Who was er—the girl, and so on?" "That's too delicate," said Frost, still grinning.

Every Seven Years

In this election, the people are permitted to vote for a period of four weeks in which there is freedom of speech. The opposition politicians who emerge to exercise this freedom of speech are never permitted to win the election. They are free to speak, for instance, but not over the radio or in the press. The election and the ballot for the opposition have been of different size and color, so that there was no secrecy at the polls. But every seven years there is at least some freedom of speech.

Where Was D'Artagnan?

Since it has everything else, the French situation inevitably has its own freedom of our part to use our force wherever we pleased whenever we pleased, without regard to the Doctrine's own specific definition of when such use of force was to be authorized, he did shrink away from the newspaperman's attempt to bring his interpretation down to brass tacks. They did this by asking him if he did actually now consider that the administration was already clearly authorized, without further recourse to Congress, to use troops in any situation in the Middle East.

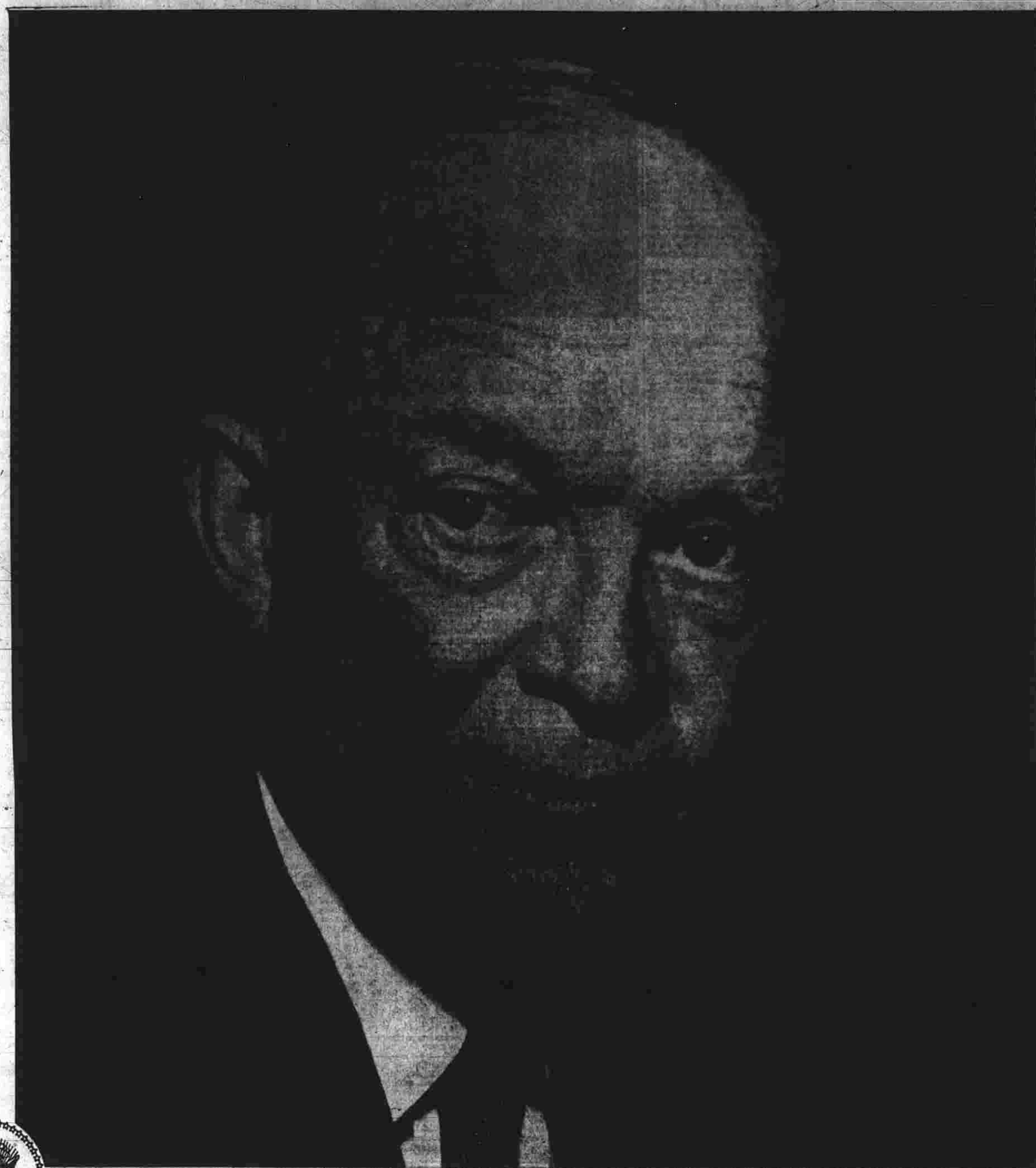
