(1) Data no specific limits on the length of time that the various tracts of land which will be included in the lease, will be allowed to remain under the immediate jurisdiction of the Manchester Country Club.
(2) Will not forbid its extension, or renewal by any future kind-hearted, and generous-minded Board of Directors, a fact which is now further proved by present talk of re-negotiation at a later date.
(3) Will not include all rules, regulations and green fees provisions from the text of the lease itself, an effort which will make it entirely possible for the Club to re-adjustment in order, "for the welfare of the Club."
(4) While it does specify dates for the Board of Directors, it cannot be terminated by the Town, either in whole or in part, and the assurance that the Town will ever exercise its right to terminate the lease.
(5) Will give the Club until about April 1, 1952 to decide whether or not it will lease the 150 acre parcel of the Department property, which heretofore has so often sold it wanted to lease, for the construction of its own private course, and to decide whether or not it will invest some \$100,000 or more, in such construction.
(6) Will permit the Club, should it decide not to lease this land, and not to invest the money in town-owned land, to appear to the kindhearted and generous Board of Directors, in some three years hence, for continued use of the special opportunity June 13th to register in party.
(7) Since the voter without party affiliation can not vote in the private election, it is throwing away part of his privilege to elect, in the opinion of the independent voters of Manchester, the independent voters of Manchester are being given a special opportunity June 13th to register in party.

(12) Will put the green fee for non-members of the Club, regardless of their age at state, at \$4.00 on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, and at \$3.00 for other days of the playing year, (excluding Tournament and Special Event days), fees which will be in excess of those charged by our neighboring courses, and so prohibitive to the average non-member golfer that he will end himself compelled to enjoy his
