Kroll surveyed his office, strewn with rocks, splintered plywood blocks, broken glass and ink bottles and told newsmen "What happened yesterday can only make my job here harder."

That job, he said, had been to improve Soviet-West German relations "but you cannot make policy without the use of rhetoric."

The embassy staff worked under the duress and made no effort to clear it up until after representatives of the Soviet Foreign Ministry had been invited to inspect the damage.

Leaders of Japan's largest labor union, the Japanese Federation of Labor Unions, expressed regret for the assault on the embassy.

The parliaments of National China and South Korea both unanimously adopted resolutions condemning the assault. Both asked that Russia and Hungary be expelled from the United Nations.

The Public Building Commission (PBC) has announced that bids for construction of the A. V. School and the new firehouse will be opened and reviewed at the Planning Commission meeting at 6:30 p.m. July 1.

Increase in medical care costs and transportation prices were largely responsible for the moderate hike in May for the overall index.

The medical care increase was attributed primarily to higher premiums for Blue Cross Hospitalization plans in several cities, including San Francisco and Kansas City. Rates for physicians' services and hospital care were also higher.

Medical care costs as a whole rose seven-tenths of 1 per cent. The increase in transportation reduced the index by one-tenth of 1 per cent.

Transportation prices rose in several cities, and for used cars. Prices of new cars and tires were lower.

Hersey R. Riley, chief of the Labor Department's Price and Cost of Living Division, told reporters that the index had declined in the months ahead as more plentiful supplies of fruits and vegetables hit markets.
