

# Adams Prober, Witness Feud

Washington, June 25 (AP)—The Goldfine-Adams investigation exploded into an angry row today climaxed by dismissal of a former Securities and Exchange Commission head from the witness stand.

J. Sinclair Armstrong, SEC chairman in 1957 and now an assistant secretary of the Navy, tangled from the outset with Chairman Owen Harris (D-Ark) of the House subcommittee digging into SEC handling of names involving Bernard Goldfine, a Boston industrialist.

The Congress members want to know whether SEC pulled its punches and whether it was influenced by Sherman Adams, top aide to President Eisenhower and a close friend of Goldfine.

"I've been outraged" at allegations that SEC people "could possibly be influenced by anybody," Armstrong hotly told the Congressmen.

Harris asked the former SEC chief to step aside and not resume the witness stand until Harris returned from another committee meeting. The Congressman was about to insist he said he had some questions to ask personally.

Armstrong kept right on. "I've been waiting for two years to make this statement," he said in a rising voice.

"You've been before this committee at the beginning of every Congress," Armstrong said.

# U.S. Approves Boy's Plans for Spaceman

Washington, June 25 (AP)—The National Science Foundation has on file a detailed plan for shooting a man into space and bringing him back alive.

A top Pentagon scientist says the proposal "has all the elements of a workable system."

It came from a 17-year-old boy, Jonathan Orovitz of New York City.

Jonathan, son of a department store owner in the Flushing section, reads a lot of technical books on rockets and propellants, he is in seventh grade and attends "rocket progress" class at school.

The boy's manned space rocket plan is peppered with knowledgeable references to "adaptive nose cones and copper heat-shield." He sent it off in a letter, made under consideration. He sent the letter to the advanced research projects agency (ARPA), the Pentagon's new space coordinator.

Jonathan wrote back: "Your design has all the elements of a workable system. In fact, it is not very different from one of number of systems that have been under consideration. He sent the letter to the National Foundation to be placed on file.

Jonathan did not seem very excited when he heard about the developments in Washington.

"It is more than a rocket, though," he said. "I used a jet-X model engine, a patent rocket engine."

# Recession at Bottom, Commerce Dept. Says

Washington, June 25 (AP)—The Commerce Department says the recession in sales and production, one of the chief factors blamed for the slump, has stopped.

In the broadest statement so far from any government agency it supports of contentions by recession has hit bottom. The department said yesterday.

"Recently both sales and production have steadied, the downturn which began in early 1957 has been arrested at a point about 10 per cent under the end of 1957 level."

However, the department said there is no clear evidence yet of a sharp drop in inventory liquidation—which it described as the most important single factor aggravating the business slump.

On another economic front government officials are discounting in advance the significance of an expected sharp June unemployment statistics, which will include students looking for summer jobs.

Commenting that figures don't lie but can sometimes be misleading, they say also that increased employment figures in recent months, reflecting more outdoor jobs as winter ends, have not guaranteed an end to the recession.

Both changes are seasonal, and are expected every year.

# Lebanon Wants UN Force To Seal Off Syria Frontier

Washington, June 25 (AP)—The United States bitterly accused the Russian government today of stage managing the demonstration against the U.S. embassy in Moscow.

Moscow, June 25 (AP)—A crowd of more than 1,000 Russians, some angrily shouting "Lebanon" and "Syria," demonstrated today at the U.S. embassy.

The demonstration went on for two hours and 15 minutes before the first Soviet police cars pulled up to begin dispersing the crowds with tear gas.

Some of the crowd still was around an hour later, but the banners were furled, and all the hard core demonstrators had left.

A crowd of about 100 Russians pushed the crowd under control. One man was injured by a stone thrown through an open window but there was no damage.

U.S. Ambassador Llewellyn Thompson told reporters he did not know and saw no object to peaceful assembly and demonstrations.

The crowd included some youths and in addition, police forbade smoking in the vicinity.

The Soviet Embassy had prepared for Russian retaliation against demonstration by Russian refugees last weekend at the Soviet U.N. offices in New York. Russian demonstrators had been given the day off.

# Manhattan Bridge Singed In Blaze from Ships Crash

New York, June 25 (AP)—A Soviet freighter rammed a gasoline tanker on the darkness-shrouded East River early today, sparking a fire from the waterborne fuel that singed the Manhattan Bridge.

Two of three men were missing and 31 injured.

The sinking Empress Bay also spread dangerous unignited fuel into the river and caused the city shipping artery to be closed to traffic for several hours.

Although a wide area of the bridge was singed, the collision, the streamway plunged into the water, screaming for help. Drives of rescue crafts rushed out to pick up the survivors. One New York City fireboat was disabled in the task.

The East River, which separates Manhattan from the city of Brooklyn and Queens on Long Island, is about half a mile wide at the point where the smash occurred in midstream at 12:25 a.m.

Despite the hour, thousands of spectators were attracted to the river banks to watch the spectacle, or drama unfolding in the stream.

# State's Youngest Governor

Columbia, S. C., June 25 (AP)—Ernest F. Hollings, a handsome Charleston lawyer and tireless campaigner, was named South Carolina's next governor yesterday by a slumping 45,000-vote margin over Donald S. Russell.

At 36, he will be the state's youngest governor in modern times.

Hollings, named one of the 10 outstanding young men of the year in 1955 by the U.S. Junior Chamber of Commerce, who, the Democratic primary nomination in a runoff election against Russell, 52-year-old former president of the University of South Carolina.

With nearly all precincts officially tabulated, Hollings had 100,813 votes to 119,267 for Russell.

The party designation in the traditionally Democratic state is tantamount to election. Republicans have not held a state for the November general election.

Hollings, lieutenant governor for the last four years and a state legislator for six years before that, campaigned on a platform that included, as did Russell's, a promise to increase the state's income tax.

His victory statement last night said he would start work at once on his program.

The runoff followed a 3-way first primary two weeks ago in which Hollings led Russell by some 25,000 votes but lacked a majority.

The third candidate, Mayor William C. Johnston Anderson, retired from the race.

Followings will take over from Gov. George Bell Timmerman Jr., who could not run under a state law barring self-succession.

Hollings said his first program will be to return to his wife, two daughters and a son.

# Heavy Firing Breaks Out in Beirut Areas

United Nations, New York, June 25 (AP)—Western diplomats expressed the belief today Lebanon's request for a special U.N. military force will result in an emergency session of the 81-nation General Assembly.

Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld is expected to lay the request before the Security Council but bitter Soviet opposition has made it clear that council action will be blocked by a veto.

Western delegates said a Soviet veto would be followed immediately by a call to convene the assembly within 24 hours. There is no veto in the Assembly. The western powers are confident they can get overwhelming support for the proposed U.N. force to seal off Lebanon's borders.

# Dempsey Seen On Ticket with Gov. Ribicoff

Hartford, June 25 (AP)—John N. Dempsey, executive aide to Governor Ribicoff, today moved ahead fast as a front runner for the Democratic lieutenant gubernatorial nomination on Saturday.

The reasoning behind the probable convention and to Dempsey, according to reliable sources, is that he has been the closest person to Governor Ribicoff, knows the latter's thinking and will be able to team up with his boss, the lieutenant governor.

Dempsey, his backers maintain, would also be useful in representing the Governor on many occasions because of his close relationship with the chief executive in state matters.

If he gets the nomination, which many insiders regard as most likely, it would mean a Ribicoff-Dempsey ticket once again for the party's two top state capital offices.

Loss Race to Jewett

Dempsey, who is also mayor of Putnam, and is a former Democratic House leader in the Legislature, lost a close race in 1954 for the lieutenant governor's post in the November election.

employment will rise seasonally by between one and two million in June, while unemployment also increases with the addition of students and other job seekers.

A group of economic specialists quoted by the Senate Finance Committee blamed the current slump on the good times of previous years.

The economists, responding to an inquiry by the committee, generally agreed the recession was touched off by an "inflationary boom" in which the nation's productive capacity outstripped the demand for goods.

In its report on sales and production and inventory liquidation, the Commerce Department said business statistics during May changed little from April, months when the rate of decline slackened.

It said inventory liquidation accounted for the major part of the decline in the gross national product in the first three months of 1958.

Liquidation of merchant stocks during that quarter was at an annual rate of \$9 billion, the largest on record.

In the major case of automobiles, the report said, a considerable period of reduction is ahead before new model production reverses the trend.
