Suffering from severe head injuries and a fractured left leg, Hilding was taken by ambulance to the Manchester Memorial Hospital and early Sunday was transferred to Hartford Hospital.

Ashwell, whom police quoted as saying "I didn't see him until after I hit him," has been charged with reckless driving. Free under a \$1,000 bond, his court date has been tentatively set for Aug. 1, pending a coroner's report.

Police today are attempting to locate two men who they believe witnessed the accident. Chief Herman O. Schindel requests that the men, who reportedly bolted into the nearby Garden Restaurant for someone to call a doctor and an ambulance, contact him immediately.
