Mothers Asked to Back Kids' Science Interest

Lexington, Mass.—(NEA)—

When your little Johnny is carried away by the wonders of science do you slip the wires or help spread them?
"Unintentionally, you assist in seeing your youngster dream big about a scientific career. Thinking it might lead him to a minor, but not a major, science field. Or do you dissuade him because it's all beyond you?"

According to physicist Dr. Carl F. J. Overage, director of Lincoln Laboratory of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, the modern mother has a grave responsibility to help guide her small charges into vocations that will promote the technological superiority of the free world.

"The nation that leads will establish its superiority," Dr. Overage maintains.
"The superiority must exist on many fronts," he continued. "If we are to survive through it, then remember little Johnny. Future scientist is in the race, too."
In giving these words in an interview on the motivating role of home and mother, the physicist advised mothers to acquire themselves with technological advances. He pointed out that reading newspapers and magazine accounts will give them an insight into "what is going on."

"It is vital to know the nature of the world and society today," he observed.
As a "father" of the SAGE system for air defense, Dr. Overage has helped put a "face" on the light gun in the hands of defense technicians.

SAGE (Semi-automatic Ground Environment) is a network of digital computer-equipped direction centers, with interconnecting radar aircraft echoes and other information, and for the generation of battle orders against various "threats."

A "shot" of light from the gun starts the SAGE system's electronic brain on the job of tracking an unidentified aircraft. As a "hit" appears on the gun, the gun will track the computer in a track number and supply information on its speed, direction and altitude.

Dr. Overage said he considered his work with the complex SAGE project as having been "fun." With the first actor of SAGE now in operation at McGuire AFB, N. J., his prime interest now lies in the current major project of Lincoln Laboratory—a systematic study of problems in defense against ballistic missiles.

Nasser Talk Friendly, American Envoy Says

Cairo, Aug. 7 (AP)—Showing no outward resentment at the initial snubbing he got from President Nasser, special U.S. envoy Robert Murphy said today their 4-hour conference was "very friendly, very satisfactory."
Nasser kept the U.S. Deputy Under Secretary of State waiting until mid-morning, yesterday. He would receive him, but Murphy said they had a "most thorough, very friendly, very satisfactory conversation ranging over a large number of subjects."

President Eisenhower and Murphy in the Middle East on the day of the 15th landing in Lebanon to help work out a political settlement among the Lebanese and to serve the U.S. position in the area. 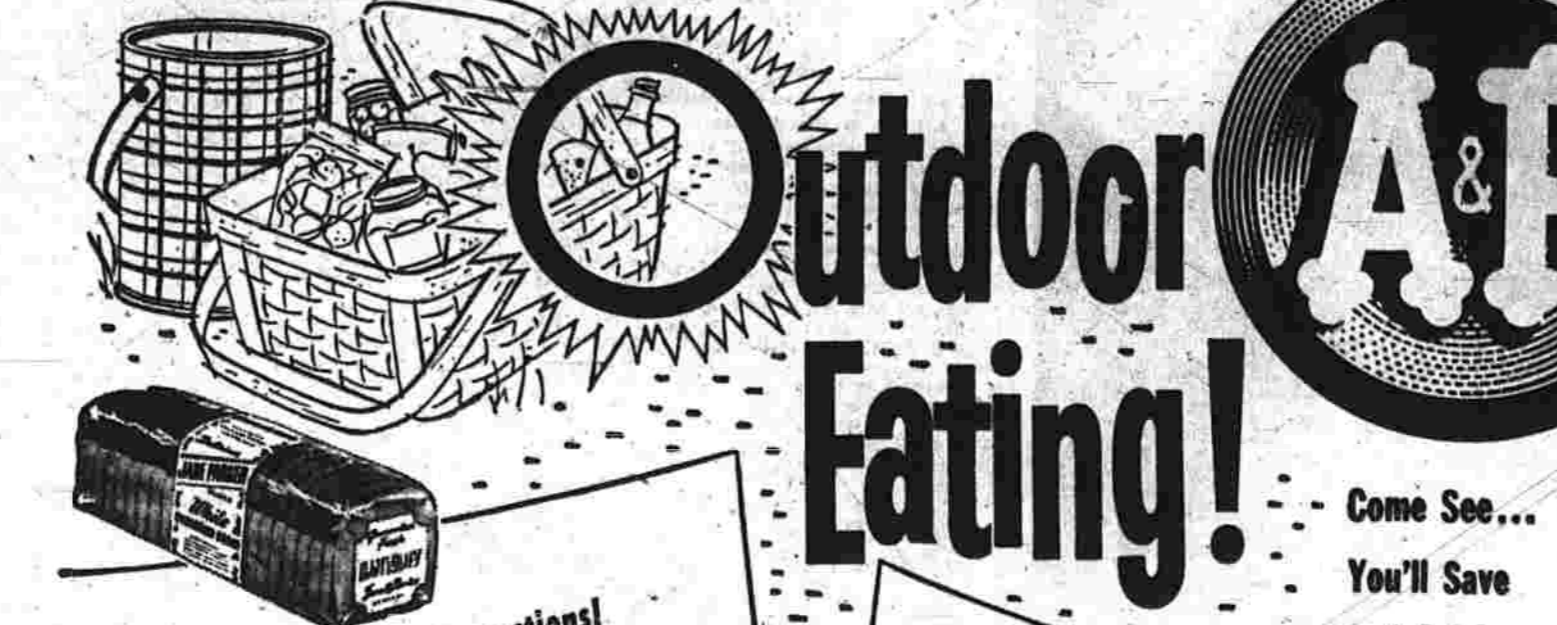
