In a dramatic move, the United States has taken the lead in the Arab world. In a move which has been described as "the most important step in the history of the United States power position in the Near East," it was announced today that the United States will support a resolution in the United Nations which would demand that Saudi Arabia be thrown back into Nasser's camp. The resolution, which was introduced by the United States, calls for a cessation of hostilities between Saudi Arabia and the Arab League, and for a return to the status quo ante bellum. The resolution also calls for a cessation of Saudi Arabia's support of Nasser's forces in the Sinai Peninsula.
