Sheinwold on Bridge

PLAYING BY INSTINCT
BY Alfred Sheinwold

Did you ever wake up in the middle of the night because of a mistake you had made in that evening's bridge game? It happens to one of the players in that game. He did not make the mistake at the time, but it came to him a few hours later.

West opened the night of hearts, dummy put up the jack, and East won with the king of hearts and drew three rounds of trumps, ending in the dummy.

Declarer then led a heart from dummy and finessed the nine from his own hand. He had spotted West's opening lead as a singleton or the top of a doubleton. The finesse worked, and South easily made the slam, even up one diamond.

Did you see the mistake? You might sniff at the bidding while you're looking for mistakes North doesn't have the values for an immediate raise.

He should bid two notrump first, the "negative" response, to show his weakness. He can then raise spades later without promising too much support. However, if all worked out well for North, West's opening lead was not a mistake.

The nature of the opening lead should be as clear to East as it was to South. What happens if East plays a low heart instead of the queen?

Dummy's jack of hearts wins the first trick. Declarer must draw three rounds of trumps before he can tackle the hearts again. Then he leads a heart from dummy, and East puts up the ten. South must win with the king and still has a losing heart.

ANNAHAN PRIMARY LAW
Hartford, Aug. 26 (AP)—Miss Mildred Allen, Secretary of State, says the state primary law is too cumbersome, inviolate and expensive.

Mrs. Allen whose office supervises the administration of the law that was passed by the 1955 General Assembly, said yesterday she has conferred a series of conferences with primary law experts in her office.

The recommendations are to streamline and make the law more understandable.

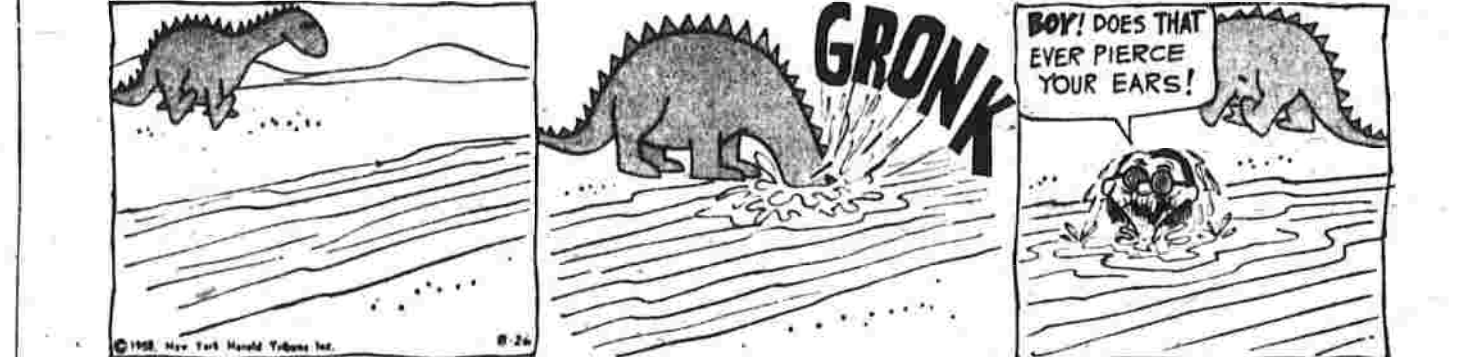
