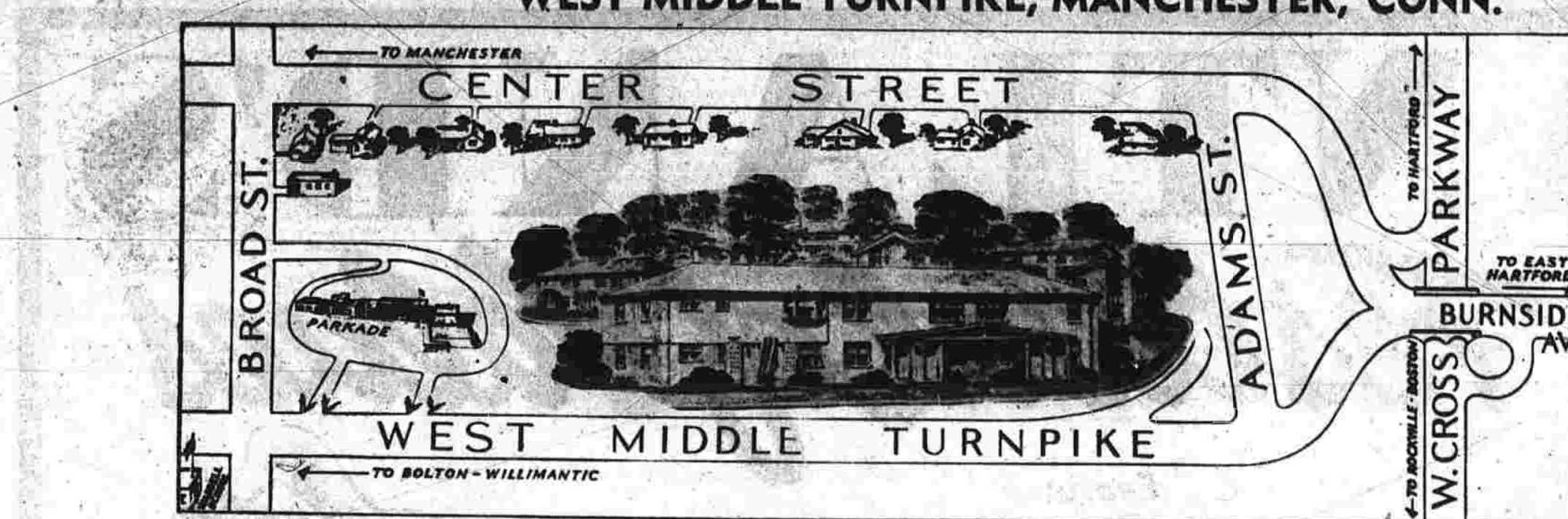

### Bolton Sites Group to Reconsider Rogers, Toomey, Bolton Tract

Kenny Hutchinson, chairman of the School Sites Committee, revealed in a report to the board of Education last night plans to reconsider the Rogers-Toomey-Bolton tract for school purposes.

Hutchinson reported that a proposal to buy land owned by Dr. Richard Toomey and his wife because of opposition of nearby landowners. Opposition was based on the fact that chlorinated sewage wastes would be dumped in the tract, which runs through or abuts other properties.

The Rogers-Toomey-Bolton tract, a package of about 32 acres located near the present elementary school land, was first proposed in January of this year. It is to be used for a school building and a playground.

The other sites all presented similar drainage problems and a sanitary engineer was hired to assist the committee. He proposed installation of sewer lines to the tract and discharge into a nearby stream. With this proposal blocked by adjoining property holders, the Sites Committee studied the available sites and will propose an adaptation of the sanitary engineer's recommendations to the Rogers-Toomey-Bolton tract.

As outlined briefly to the Board last night, the proposal would call for piping the treated sewage through a right-of-way easement to the abandoned portion of Toomey Lane to the school on Rt. 6. The old road intersected Rt. 6 opposite the present Stony Hill.

The report of the School Sites Committee was accepted by the Board. It will undoubtedly be presented for action at an early town meeting.

Another item of significance to future school problems was the Board's reaffirmation of their continuing interest in creation of a Permanent School Building Committee. They will request the Selectmen to include this proposal in an early town meeting.

Microscope Purchased  
Principal Richard Mathes reported that a microscope has been purchased for use by local elementary classes. The 108 graduating class presented the school with check requesting that it be used for purchase of a microscope. The instrument, designed especially for use by elementary schools, has four magnifications ranging from 75x to 210x.

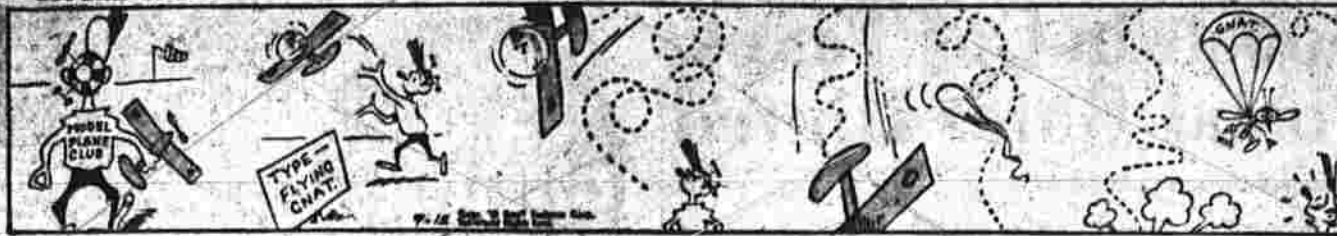

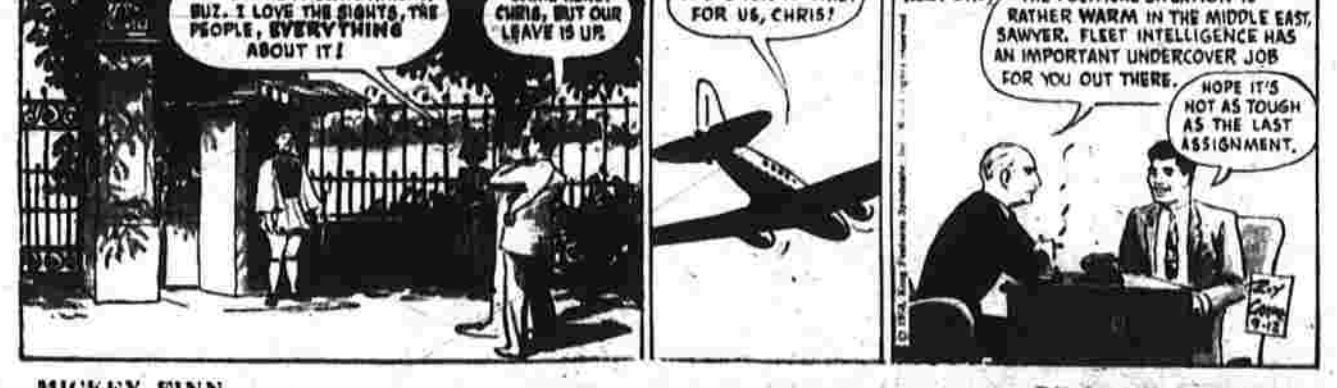
