### Court Takes Case Of Private School Under Advisement

St. Louis, Oct. 15 (AP)—Federal Appeals Court took under advisement today a request to permanently block the use of Little Rock high schools as private, segregated institutions. Judge Woodruff said the court would rule as soon as possible. His statement was interpreted to mean a decision might come within the next two or three days. It was pointed out, however, that the judge had not yet had the opportunity to completely study the written arguments. The other two judges hearing the case today are M. C. Mathen and Harvey M. Johnson. Johnson and Woodruff issued the original temporary restraining order. The three judges of the U.S. Eighth Circuit Court of Appeals gave an immediate indication when they would rule on the case. Judge Joseph W. Woodruff ordered the clerk of the court to maintain the status quo until the Little Rock high school buildings to a private corporation. Arguments look less than an hour before the court which only nine days ago extended the restraining order until the case could be argued on its merits. A Negro attorney at the start of today's hearing attacked the Little Rock Board's contention that it was neutral in the case. Thurgood Marshall, general counsel for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), made a statement before three judges of the eighth federal circuit court of appeals. Marshall charged that the school board's motive in leasing Little Rock's four public high schools was to bring new parties into the case, exactly what the NAACP was trying to prevent. Marshall added that the NAACP merely was asking the appellate court to see that the original Federal Court order integrating the Little Rock schools is carried out. "The school board deliberately leased the building knowing very well that the NAACP would be going to appeal from a restraining order," he Negro attorney said. 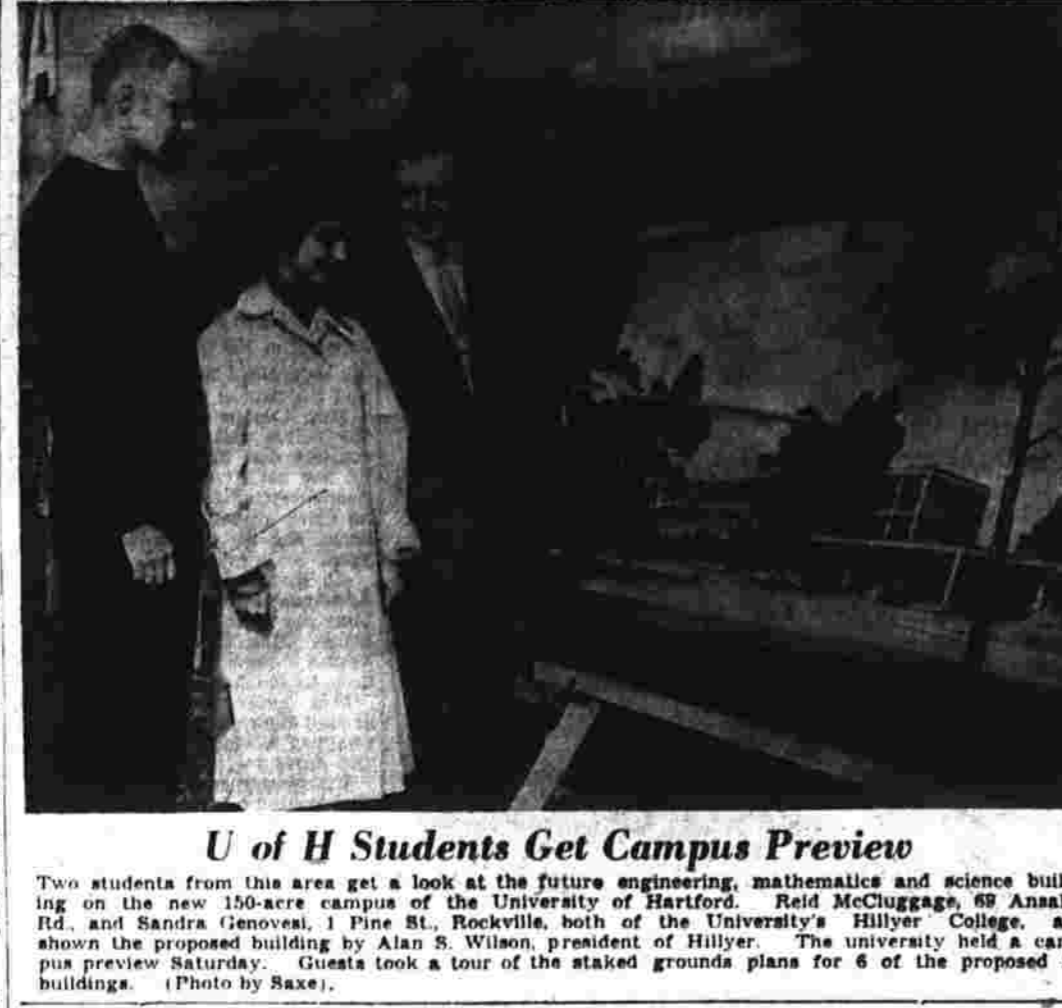
### Bolton Fallout Seen Major Danger To State in Case of N-Attack

Ernest Elliott, director of the federal "survival project," summarized the state's preventive plans for a possible major nuclear attack (N-Attack) last night at the 50th anniversary of the state's first atomic bomb test.

The plan, approved by the State Civil Defense Council, is the first of its kind in the nation. It was two years in the making, prepared by a staff of 12 to 15 people who operated on a "survival project" basis.

Calling a spade a spade, Elliott pointed out that the state's defense area is completely unprepared for an N-Attack. He said the state is operating on a 10-year program in its planning. At the beginning of the period, it is expected that there will be four hours warning of attack. It may be possible that there will be 15 or 20 minutes warning and only one or two hours of attack.

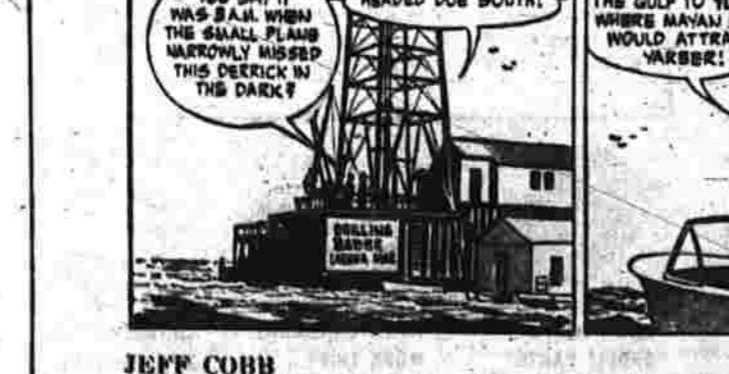

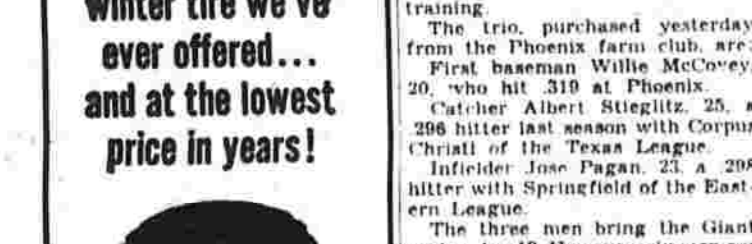
