Parade to Honor Missile Soldier

Manchester residents will have a chance to see a full dress parade tomorrow afternoon at Mt. Nebo Field where troops of the 1st Air Cavalry will perform a military ceremony for the first time in the city.

U.S. Seeks Release Of Nine by Castro

The Treasury manager who would be returned shortly, the embassy said. The Americans were Charles R. Brunell, 35, the refinery supervisor of maintenance and construction, whose wife and year-old son live in Santiago; and Kenneth H. Drew, 40, Joliet, Ill., machine shop foreman, whose wife also lives in Santiago.

It was not immediately known whether the kidnappings were ordered by rebel leader Fidel Castro, who has been waging guerrilla warfare against President Fulbright's Helix for the last two years from jungle camps in the Sierra Maestra west of Santiago.

To dramatize the rebel cause last June, a rebel force headed by Castro's younger brother, Raul, kidnaped 20 American and Canadian mining workers and 30 soldiers and Marines from the U.S. Navy at Guantanamo Bay, 90 miles east of Santiago.

Vollem and Vice Consul Robert D. Wicks obtained release of the 10 men after more than three weeks of jungle negotiations. The last release came on orders to Raul from Fidel Castro, who said he did not want to alienate the United States from his cause.

School Board Tables Action On Languages for School

Miss Viola Larsen, elementary supervisor, presented information on the teaching of foreign languages in the elementary school. This report was requested after a proposal was made by board member Vincent Krasnicki that the board consider teaching a foreign language.

It was stressed that most serious consideration must be given to what language should be taught since it would not be economical to teach a language which could not be continued in high school. Miss Larsen said introduction of a foreign language at the elementary level is not something done quickly. She said it must have staff cooperation and community achievement of students. Qualified people will be invited to discuss this matter at the November meeting according to board vote.

The board took an action on the report after a vote to table the proposal for later consideration.
