# TDC Ponders Formation Of Industrial Foundation

The possibility of establishing an industrial foundation in Manchester to aid in the development of the town is being studied by the Town Development Commission.

Leonard Sander, TDC chairman, emphasized today the formation of such a foundation is strictly in the "study" stage and an immediate action is contemplated on the suggestion.

"Whether such a foundation would be suitable for Manchester remains to be seen," he said, "and it will take a lot more study and research to determine this before the Commission can make a recommendation."

"Sincerely" forming a "Development Commission" and "Associates" Boston consulting firm hired more than a year ago to aid the town in its work of attracting industry to it.

Purpose of an industrial foundation would be to provide a firm contemplating moving to the town in the future with a ready-made even though industrial buildings are not available.

The foundation is a private organization, would be formed by residents willing to participate in a non-profit basis in order to attract the type of tax-paying industry to the town which would benefit the economy and provide more jobs.

Such an organization would also cooperate with banks, insurance companies and the Connecticut Development Credit Corp. in financing new plants.

One formed in 1918

Research in the past year already has shown such foundations one of which was formed as long ago as 1918.

A few months ago the possibility of forming such a foundation in Manchester to meet competition from other communities in the state to attract industry was mentioned at a TDC meeting by Leonard Sander, Jr., vice chairman of the commission.

Although the Commission members expressed considerable interest in the idea, they wanted more detailed information as to how it operated and what it would fit in with the TDC's program of attracting industry to Manchester.

As a result of the discussion, Sander was commissioned to prepare a report on the working of such a foundation.

This report, which covers 33 pages, is now under study by the Commission members. A copy has also been given to General Noel, Mayor Richard Martin and Hugh Sledge of the State Development Commission. Sander also further explained the workings of an industrial foundation.

In the introduction to his report, Sander says his firm feels now is the time for the TDC to seriously consider the formation of such a foundation in order to provide the final missing tool for the industrial development of Manchester.

Sander terms this step a necessary one to complete the TDC's program of the last year during which, he says, "Manchester has established an active program for the attraction and solicitation of industry."

An industrial foundation would in no way duplicate the duties, activities or programs of either the local and state development agencies, Sander says, "but rather would strengthen their hands and provide means needed to offset competitive forces from other communities to industrial firms seeking to relocate."
