The Wonders of Democracy

Certainly the most fascinating demonstration of democracy at work in the election Tuesday was not the astounding victory at the polls in Connecticut of the Republican ticket...

The boy who really came from the wrong side of the tracks would be, of course, Nelson Rockefeller, newly elected governor of the state of New York.

Who can imagine a greater political handicap than the name he wears?

The poor little poor boy ran away to make it in the world and become a democracy of American politics.

But when the poor little rich boy ran away to make it in the world, he ran away to make it in the world of the rich.

Of course, to be candid, Rockefeller's handicap was not slightly by the fact that his own particular political opponent was also from the wrong side of the tracks.

With the idea of great wealth, sometimes predatory in its beginning, that Rockefeller has probably, over the years, had the heaviest burden to carry.

Furthermore, when we ask what lies in the future for the boy from the wrong side of the tracks wearing the wrong kind of name, we find ourselves talking about the White House.

For another thing, the Rockefeller run tool everywhere something about what kind of Republican it takes, other than a fairly rich one, to win a state such as New York.

Last year I didn't get my Christmas shopping done until the last minute, just as Santa's shadow was flitting across the rooftops of Manchester's shops.

But, having given all the explanation and justification we can muster, the fact remains that the Democrats are not applying the law of spots even more rigorously than the Republicans.

Furthermore, there was definite evidence at least one of the five states heavily industrialized California that the voters were voting their own convictions, not their own prejudices.

It would seem, then, that the voters saw the "Right to Work" amendments for what they were, attempts at legalized union busting through the outlawing of the union movement.

Actually, the "Right to Work" laws give no one the right to work without a union. They give no one the right to choose to use it as a tool with which to turn the clock back on industrial democracy.

Nonetheless, it is true that industrial democracy seems to have the aspect of a labor autonomy. But when that happens, the cure is restraint of the unions, rather than their destruction.

What they do to give those American cure for the old-time sins of capitalism has been retained in its original form, and the destruction of the capitalist system.

Maintenance of strength and bargaining power for unions does a great deal to prevent the theoretical "right to work" of the individual who doesn't want to join a union.

In this connection, it is interesting to note that many employees actually prefer the union. These are the employees who are not looking for ways to play off individual workers against the union.

It is also worth noting that most of the states whose right to work laws are the books are in the South.

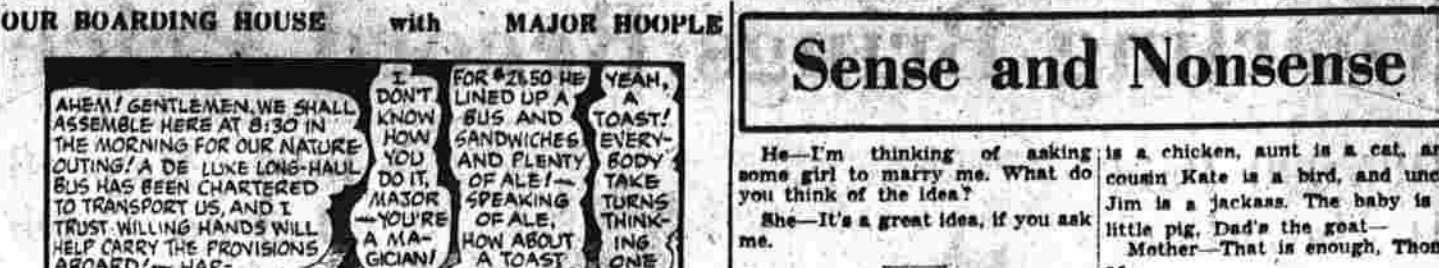
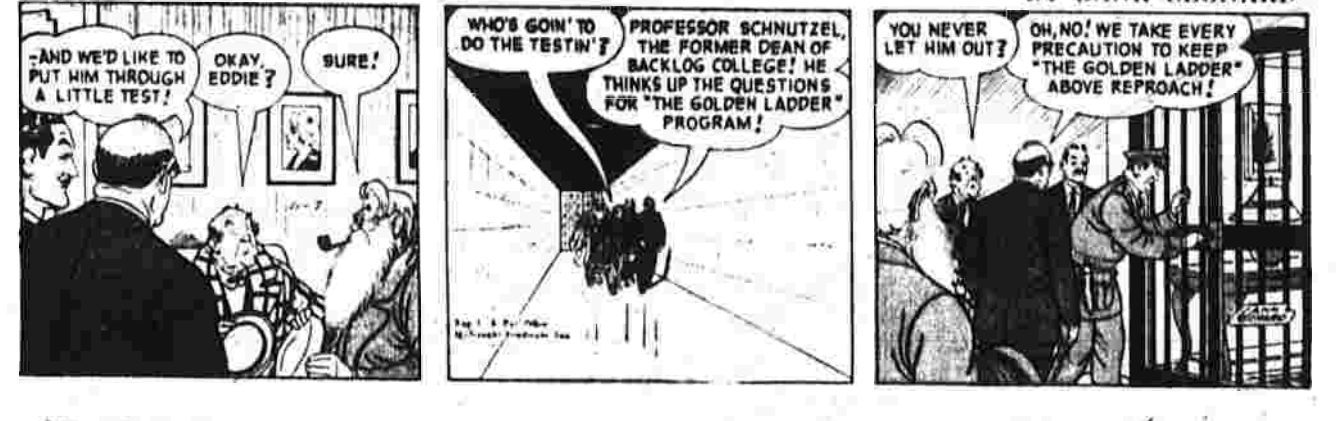
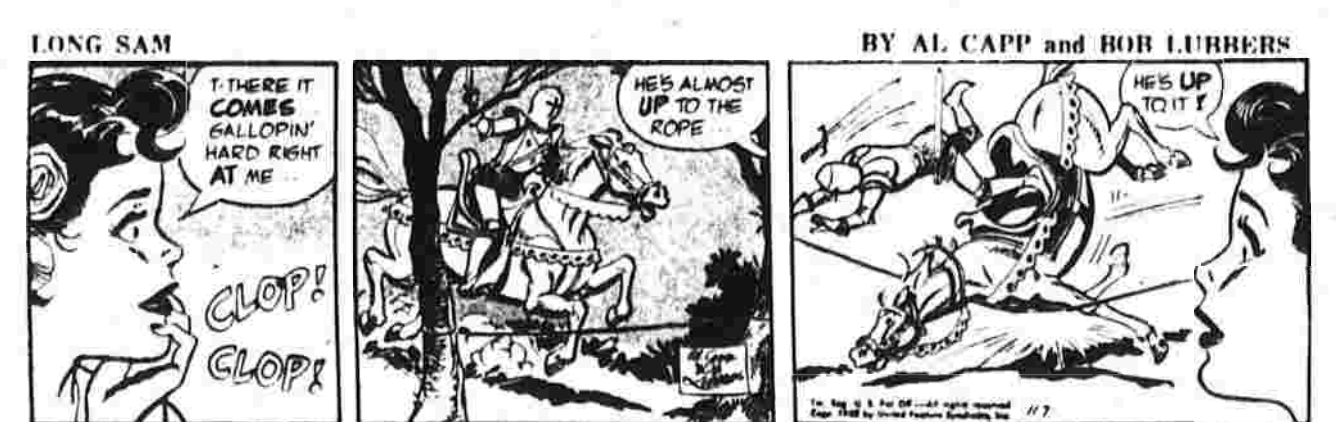
