**Student's Resourceful Robot Helps Sell Boys on Science**

By RICHARD DAW  
Russellville, Ark. (AP)—A little man of the Ozarks barely three feet tall, is doing his part in America's drive to out-Sputnik the Russians.  
His name is Cog and he's a robot.  
At Halloween Cog greets trick-or-treaters with bags of candy in each hand, and at Christmas he strolls around in a Santa Claus suit singing carols.  
"The neighbors think I'm crazy," says 18-year-old Robert Dupre, Cog's creator.  
But Dupre thinks Cog is a good way to get other youngsters interested in science.  
The professor at Arkansas Tech agrees, and use Cog—with Dupre's help—in lectures at nearby schools.  
Cog is a good introduction to science, says physics instructor Earl R. Williams, who believes the whetting of the appetite by such a device may be the birth of a future scientist.  
For four years Cog has amused, frightened and educated folks in the mountain Arkansas region. And for all those years, Cog has challenged Dupre.  
Work Continually  
The Arkansas Tech sophomore continually works to bring the robot closer to the capabilities of a human.  
Cog started as a flimsy shell of cardboard and aluminum foil with a speaker inside. All he could do was talk.  
Now he's fully motorized and made of sheet aluminum, able to move in any direction, carry things about, even write on a blackboard in a child's scrawl.  
In all, Dupre estimates he has put about 3,200 hours of work and \$100 into Cog. He plans to invest more of both.  
Three motors power Cog's movements, and a speaker in his neck provides his voice. Red lights are his eyes, blue lights his ears and a plastic radio dial is his futuristic hat.

# James M. Curley, 83, Dies; Political Boss

(Continued from Page One)

The "Last Hurrah" was made in a movie which had its premiere in Boston. Curley didn't attend. Curley later made his autobiography, titled "I Did It Again." His tragedies were mainly personal.

Curley's first wife, Mary, who bore him nine children, died in 1925 a half dozen years before his career reached its zenith with his election as governor.

Curley was deeply devoted to his family but he lived in a state of constant nervousness. He never had a grandchild.

Two sons who survive are George and Walter Curley.

Curley's daughter, Mary, who is a real business woman, is a governor's aide in the state department of health in February 1968.

Curley's son, a lawyer, died in 1958.

Curley, who has a second wife, Gertrude.

Curley, 83 years old, expressed a wish to live to be 125 "so I can make my political comeback."

Curley first went to jail at the time of the Peabody for conspiracy to conspire with doctors to receive examinations for another man. He served five months in 1947 in the Federal Correctional Institution at Danbury for a mail fraud case.

Through his years in politics, Curley often referred to the city jail incident as an example of how far he would go to win.

Curley was elected by President Truman in 1950 after serving five months at the Federal Correctional Institution at Danbury. Curley reports at the time that Truman had received 100,000 communications requesting clemency.

Curley, born in Boston of Irish immigrant parents, started his career in a clerical job in a shoe store. He had a high school education. But he was a militant socialist with a strong personality.

He had a trick of the Irish call "the gift of the gab" he was a born orator, a spellbinder of the crowd.

His years were deep and social and he could hold his own in any audience, a speech sprinkled with quotations from the classics, punctuated with phrases from Latin or Greek.

He had a trick of affecting a broad "Harvard accent" when he chose to imitate the "Harvard Blue Bloods" in a political speech in the power parlors of the city.

His rhetorical ability gave rise to many stories most of them true about his quick mind and tongue on the public platform.

Curley's prestige declined during his single term as governor.

During his second year in office he was close to ruin for United States Senator. His opponent was socialist Henry Cabot Lodge, now the United States Ambassador to the United Nations.

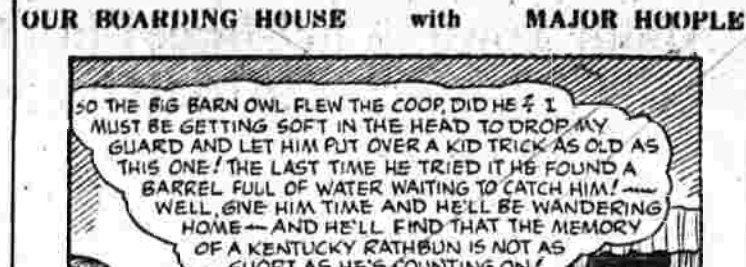
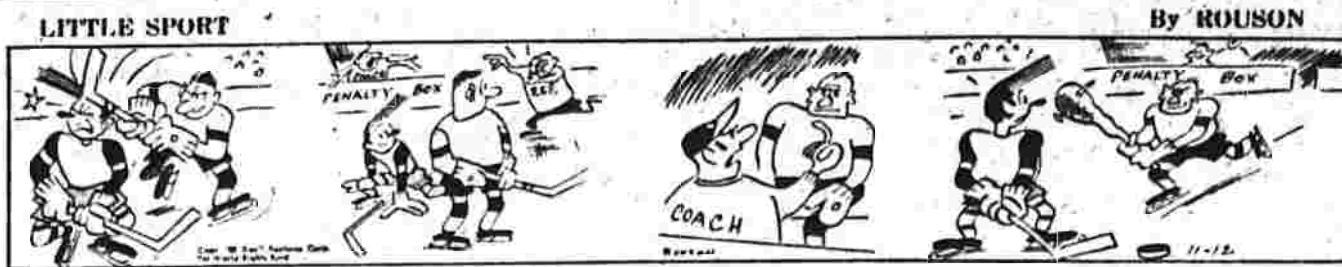
Curley's political career was ended by the old campaign strategy. Ten years later Curley tried a comeback for governor but he was beaten again by one of the blue bloods he had once attacked.

Curley died in the Veterans Affairs Hospital in Danbury, Conn., at the age of 83.
