Bill Would Cut House Members

Hartford, Nov. 20 (AP)—A proposal has been filed for consideration by the 1959 Legislature to reduce the size of the House of Representatives by 110 members. State Rep. Richard C. Noyes (R-Farmington), yesterday proposed that the House members be reduced to 168—one for each town of the state. Noyes proposed that the state constitution be amended to make such a change in house membership. The Doctor Says

Doctors Use Many Methods In Treating Varicose Veins

By EDWIN F. JORDAN, M.D.

Typical of many letters I receive is one from J. M. who writes that his mother's veins have broken and bled.

This problem with varicose veins either with or without ulceration is extremely frequent. I would like to begin by explaining what happens.

The veins carry blood to the heart. The blood in the veins has returned oxygen and other substances from the tissues.

For the reason it is the veins of the leg which are most commonly affected. The varicose veins are those which are swollen and tortuous.

Standing too much, overweight, a family history of varicose veins, the wearing of tight garters, all contribute to the development of varicose veins.

Because veins are unidirectional and women especially stand them for the reason almost all of them are on the lower extremities.

Many ways of treating varicose veins and ulcers are used. The simplest is the use of elastic bandages or stockings.

Various veins may be tied or cauterized. Injections of sclerosant have been used for many years. However, it is by closing the opening of the vein that the most permanent relief is obtained.

In recent years surgery seems to have become more common as a treatment and injections less so, but they are sometimes used in combination.

The treatment of ulcers is difficult. Though several methods are reasonably successful, prevention of serious sores is of great importance. This can be done by proper treatment before the varicose veins have become too extensive.

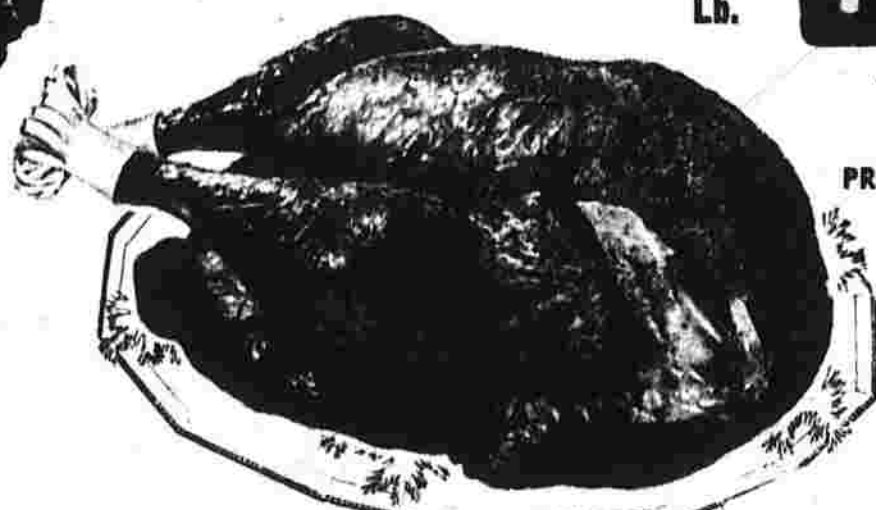

Teachers Toil to Improve Junior High Science Course

By SUZETTE ABRAHAM

Science teachers at Barnard Junior High School are quietly performing the most challenging experiment of their careers. The subject of the experiment is the science curriculum itself. Out of a jumble of information which must be learned somehow by the 1,500 students at the junior high, the 11 science teachers are creating a smooth, well-organized course of study.

The experiment started several years ago when the science teachers at Barnard got together with the science teachers at the senior high school to talk over the 7th and 8th grade science curriculum—and what was wrong with it.

What They Found

They found among other things:

1. There wasn't enough equipment for the teachers.
2. There was no standard textbook for either grade, and teachers were resorting to a hodge-podge of books.
3. Material covered in the two grades was not uniform.
4. Not enough consideration was given to equalizing the different elementary school backgrounds of the children.
5. Some material was unnecessarily repeated in the two grades.
6. Teachers in the senior high school science classes had to waste valuable time teaching the simplest fundamentals.

Led by the head of the department, Donald Warren, and working with Assistant Superintendent of Schools Raymond D. Stinchfield, the teachers evaluated themselves, the students and the program. They came up with a new program, one which they hoped would solve their problems.

Instead of having one general science program for seventh grade and another for eighth grade, the teachers combined the program to make one smooth, integrated program that is taught over a period of two years.

7th Grade Program

In the seventh grade students receive a thorough orientation during the early weeks of school. They learn the definition of "science" and how the study started, and who are the heroes of it. They learn what is meant by the scientific method, and what scientific principle is, and what scientific instruments are. After they have a good idea of how "science" differs from other subjects, they begin to study the subject itself.

Living things make one major unit, matter makes another, and fire makes the last unit of seventh grade science.

In eighth grade the students, after a test review in September of what has been learned the previous year, proceed to a unit on energy and forces, another on electricity and magnetism, a third on the human body, and a fourth on nutrition.

By the end of eighth grade the students are ready to study static electricity and current electricity, and how to generate it and use it. They are also ready to study human behavior, mental disorders, and communicable diseases.

While the distribution of difficult areas of study in seventh, eighth and ninth grades is still not entirely solidified, those areas

which are now slated for ninth, tenth, eleventh, human anatomy and physiology, and weather. This in ninth grade there was more general science, much of it repeated.

At the end of this year the teachers will evaluate the program, revamp it if it's necessary, and propose for introducing the program to the eighth grade next year.

In preparation for the evaluation, Warren and Stinchfield are looking for a good standard science text to administer in the near future. The same text or a similar one will be administered at the end of the year to test the teachers with some kind of measuring stick for the effectiveness of the program.

Earlier Improvements

This is not the first time the science curriculum has been improved at the junior high school. Other changes in the past include some homogeneous grouping, an increase in demonstrations by teachers, an increase in science clubs, and gradual acquisition of more equipment.

Right now most of the expensive equipment is kept in a central storage closet under the supervision of the department head. When a teacher wants a battery or a chemical or a model of a heart, he sends over to the main building for it, a day ahead of a similar one will be administered at the end of the year to test the teachers with some kind of measuring stick for the effectiveness of the program.

Called "Science Problems I," the book is a lively, well-illustrated, self-instructive text, which does not confuse the student, the teacher. It was selected by all of the teachers to switch to in the eighth grade next year.

Next year both seventh and eighth grade curriculum is still very much in the experimental stage.

Right now only the seventh grade is being taught under the new program. The present eighth grade was allowed to continue this year under the old program, since it would have been confusing for the student to switch in the midst of the new curriculum.

The key to using the system this year was the purchase of a uniform textbook.

Obviously there are disadvantages to this arrangement, like the danger of breakage or loss, the inconvenience of it, and the load placed on the department head.

The department is working now toward acquiring enough equipment for each teacher.

After that they'll work toward acquiring enough equipment for groups of students.

Two Obstacles

Eventually they hope to have enough equipment for individual students, but that is a distant possibility to attempt because of two things that interfere with such a step:

1. The average size of a science class is 35 pupils. This is far too many for one teacher to supervise during an experiment or demonstration, particularly since these students are just learning how to use the instruments.
2. The room themselves are not arranged for science experiments. For one thing, there are only two rooms of the right used for science which are equipped with enough gas and electrical outlets to permit groups of students to do experiments. Not one room has enough outlets for individual ex-
