### Bolton Planning Unit, SBC Disagree On Sites; Referendum Slated

Intentionally or not, the Bolton Planning Commission (TPC) pulled a "switch" play on the School Sites Committee at last night's town meeting. The action was not by about 100 people who heard the report of the Sites Committee and authorized the selection to be made by the firm of Buck and Buck, sanitary engineers hired by the committee to use one of the properties of the Dr. Alton acreage, including a filter bed and discharge system, treated sewage effluent through "Hayberry" Pond and objection to this by neighboring property owners and particularly George G. Rose whose dairy herd, he said, would not drink the chlorinated water this would dump in the brook, ended consideration of the Alton property.

**Switch Filter Bed Idea**  
The committee then transferred the idea of the filter bed to the 30-acre Bolton-Toomey property, valued at \$30,000 and proposed piping outflow to a tributary of the Hop River, bordering Rt. 6. Discovery of a good brook there and the fact that the property was already zoned for residential use, made the plan more attractive.

The School Sites Committee, which had spent about an hour and a half giving a report which strongly recommended purchase of the Bolton-Toomey tract next to the present school, was surprised by the TPC's surprise report.

TPC Chairman James F. Haselett, grasping the implications of the meeting that the TPC had been authorized for not taking a stand on the sites question. He emphasized that the TPC had no quarrel with the Sites Committee and expressed admiration for the job they had done. "But," he added, "we were asked to give an opinion as to what."

**Conger Named**  
Raymond E. Conger was elected moderator for last night's session and will serve also as moderator for the upcoming referendum. He reminded the session of the "ground rules" for an orderly meeting before calling for the reading of the warning.

Conger also had the petition seeking a referendum vote read to the session. This provided a surprise and elicited a number of questions from those attending. It asked that the referendum be called "to see which of the possible school sites is to be purchased by the town the Bolton-Toomey tract, John Swanson Jr. farm, Rose farm or no site."

The inclusion of the two sites means an acknowledgment that an organized move is underway favoring no site. The School Sites Committee, while favoring the Bolton-Toomey

site. He said, in his opinion, the cost of sewage disposal should not be the prime factor in the decision. Using rough estimates since detailed preliminary plans were not authorized, Buck said the cost of a septic tank and filter, chlorination chamber and control chamber for both the Bolton-Toomey and Swanson properties would be \$20,000. He estimated the cost of a sewage disposal system for the Rose property at \$20,000. This would be final cost at the property since it would be a substitute drainage system.

However, relative to the Bolton-Toomey property, the pipe would have to be laid down an old road bed at a cost of \$22,000. This estimate included any costs of rock excavation for the Swanson property. It would be necessary to lay 1,200 feet of pipe, Buck said, at an estimated cost of \$4,000. It was also established that on the Swanson property it would not be necessary to leave the tract to pipe the outflow to the brook. The outflow would be discharged into a swamp which property is not owned. It is a fine piece of property, the Rose property is not suitable. Personalities do not enter into this decision.

### Rockville-Vernon Jedro Corp. to Build 38 City Apartments

The Rockville Zoning Board of Appeals approved today the plan for 38 garden apartments on E. Main St. by the Jedro Corp. a Rockville firm, after a public hearing last night.

According to ZBA chairman Frederick F. Koppel, the appeals unit placed a number of restrictions on the project which was originally intended to contain 96 apartments. Each apartment is to contain four rooms.

The firm was granted a variance for non-conforming use of part of the land and to allow that a permit issued in January 1957 had not expired.

The project will be located on Residential A zoned land which allows a single family house. At last night's hearing Sol Dubowatzky, president of the Jedro Corp., said the firm had not expired because it was up one apartment building which faces E. Main St.

Dubowatzky said the firm agreed to reduce the number of living units to 38 since they thought that the ZBA would not approve a larger number because it was too many in the area.

The apartment project will consist of 19 buildings.

Restrictions placed on the project by the ZBA, Koppel said, provide that the developer must obtain an access road into the property and give an option to the city to take over the road if it chooses; install a fire hydrant on the road; erect a fence on both sides of the parking area for 50 cars; install concrete sidewalks within the project which are to be approved by the inspector; and do suitable landscaping.

The entire project must be completed by May 1, 1960. The firm's officials said that they want to purchase more land to the rear of the project to provide a playground.

The general design of the housing units will be the same as the one already built except that the stairway to the second floor will be less steep as recommended by the building inspector.

The only opposition to the housing project was presented by Leon R. Neumann, 143 E. Main St., who opposed the project to provide a playground.

Three other requests heard by the ZBA last night were also granted. Ernest Hartmann was given permission to move a house from the property to Hartmann's Supermarket on Windsor Ave. in Franklin St. Hartmann told the board he will amass the area to provide additional off-street parking.

## The Doctor Says

Glandular Fever Appears on Rise Among Children

Mrs. J. writes that her 7-year-old son has had infectious mononucleosis for the second time and that following that they can't seem to get him completely back to normal. She adds that the doctor says many cases of this disease have developed in high school boys and girls.

This disease, also known as glandular fever, is indeed common among children and young men and seems to be getting more so. Recurrences and relapses, while they have been reported, are fortunately not too frequent. The experience of slow recovery however, by no means unusual. But general speaking, recovery without serious complications can usually be expected in time.

This is a curious disease. It is probably the result of an attack by some virus, but it offers some problems in diagnosis. The symptoms it produces are not always alike, and the course it takes may vary from an extremely mild one which is quite inappreciating.

At the onset infectious mononucleosis may produce symptoms much like those of other conditions. There may be sore throat, fatigue, pains and a general feeling of malaise. There is likely to be a slow fever.

Symptoms such as nausea, vomiting and pain in the abdomen are by no means unusual. Enlargement of the lymph nodes in the neck and other parts of the body are frequent. It is this which gives it the name, glandular fever. It is the blood, however, which is the key to the diagnosis. The number of white cells in the blood is increased. When the blood is smeared on a glass slide, stained and examined under the microscope, it usually shows a peculiar type of cell which was once called a "monocyte," and which is responsible for "mononucleosis" part of the name.

Except for these cells and a complicated special test of the blood called the heterophile antibody test, the symptoms of infectious mononucleosis are similar to a great many other conditions. For this reason the diagnosis is often long delayed and sometimes not made at all.

In most cases complete recovery comes after a few weeks. In some, however, fever and a rusty-colored feeling, lasts for months. Occasional serious complications have been reported, but these are the exception rather than the rule.

A really good treatment for infectious mononucleosis has not been developed. One or more of the antibiotics may prove helpful, but this is by no means certain. Rest in bed and treatment of the symptoms are about the best we can do at yet.

What concerns the medical profession particularly is the possibility that this disease may be fatal in severe and more common as time goes on.

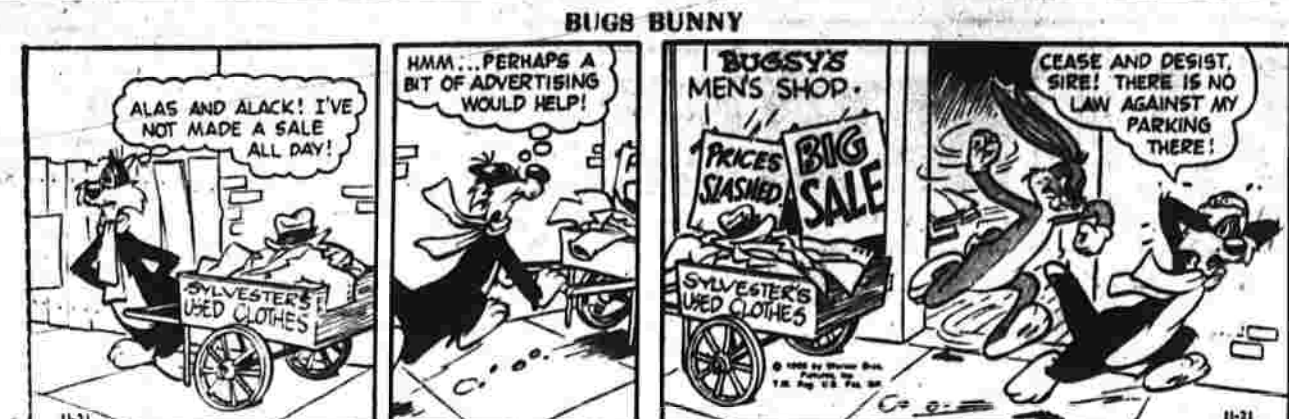

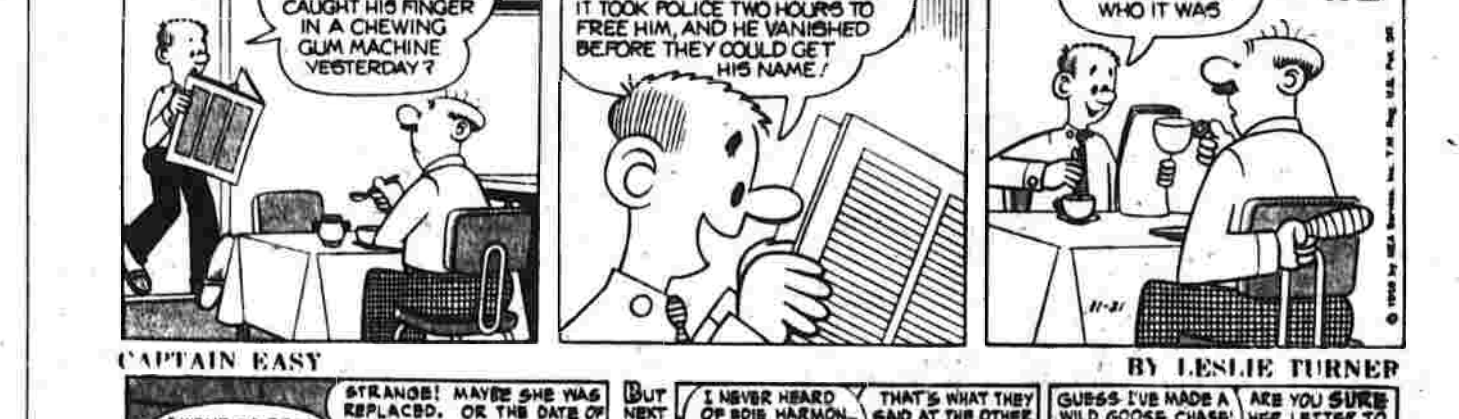
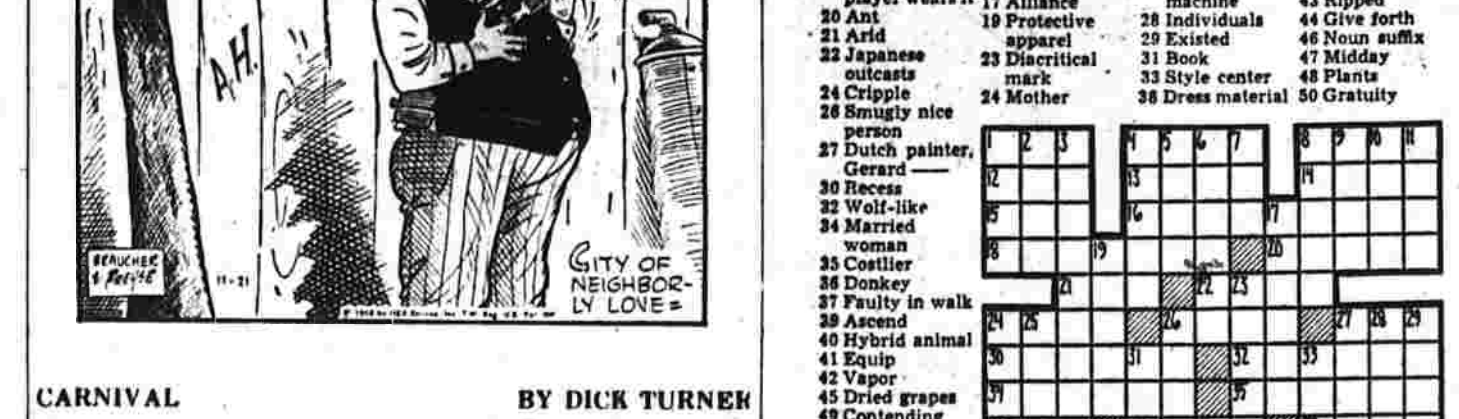
