Reds Hint New Plan On Berlin

Berlin, Nov. 25 (AP)—A Soviet spokesman said today the Kremlin's plan to make West Berlin a free, demilitarized city might be "expanded and changed" during negotiations with the Western powers.

The statement came amid Western suggestions that the Soviet drive to get the Allies out of West Berlin should be used as the basis for broad discussions of German reunification, the problem lying at the heart of the current crisis.

Flexible Attitude
A spokesman for the Soviet Embassy in East Berlin indicated the Russians may take a flexible attitude during the six months of negotiations they have proclaimed before trying to implement the 4-power occupation of Berlin. He said he did not regard the Western reaction to Soviet Premier Khrushchev's plan as a rejection.

Lord Mayor Willy Brandt of West Berlin advised the Allies to deal with the problem of uniting Communist East Germany with free West Germany rather than just reacting to the Moscow plan. British diplomats in London also suggested yet another round of reunification talks, involving foreign ministers of the West and Russia or even by treaty of government.

The subject probably was discussed in Bonn, West German Capital, where the three Western ambassadors were called to the Foreign Office. David K. E. Bruce of the United States, Sir Christopher Steel of Britain and Francis Beaufort of France conferred with Deputy Korean Minister Hilger Van Schepersberg. Details were not revealed.

Connecticut got a severe dose of wind and rain last night that proved more like a tropical storm than the beginning of winter.

The storm, which began in the state early this morning and left houses rocking, broke up trees and a howling wind accompanied the rain.

Blanks of White Mountain were flooded, and a municipal parking lot in Meriden filled up with cars.

Rivers rose, but not enough to cause serious flooding. High tide was higher than normal, but abating winds kept it from entering sheltered harbors.

The fast-moving storm left a blanket of white across the Middle West, and it was reported to have crossed the state from the north.

Heavy snow hit the northern section of Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont by early morning, measuring 8 to 10 inches. Heavy falls were reported in western Massachusetts.

The major snow area extended from northern New England across northern New York State and western Pennsylvania into the upper Ohio Valley.
