The dispute between unionized town employees and the town ended today as General Manager Richard Martin agreed to restate immediately a policy of Local 991, State, County and Municipal Employees, A.F. of M.

For its part, the Local acknowledged in effect, its responsibility for the individual who acted responsibly in Martin's temporary withdrawal of recognition, on Sept. 19, and its responsibility to return to work immediately if the individual should be reinstated.
