school is expected to be filled with 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students by 1960.

Elimination of double sessions proposed a 750-pupil school that would be expanded to 1,200. It also urged that, in addition to the 15.38-acre site, the Board should make a choice between double sessions or a drastic juggling of students and available class room space scattered throughout the school system.

School Board Chairman Charles McCormick expressed his appreciation today to those who voted for the school as well as those who worked on its plans. "I was glad to see so many people felt as the members of the Board did on the need for the school," McCormick said.

"I for one, and the other members of the School Board respect those who voted the other way, but we are sure we will be able to demonstrate that they voted the wrong way," he said.

"This school will enable us to connect the chain of new schools with its missing link, and it will permit us to go ahead with education on the high plane many of us have long envisaged for Manchester," he added.

McCormick also expressed his gratitude to the 1958-59 and 1959-60 Boards of Directors, the Building Committee, General Manager Richard Martin, the PTA groups and all other boards and organizations that either worked on the plans for the school or helped get out the vote yesterday.

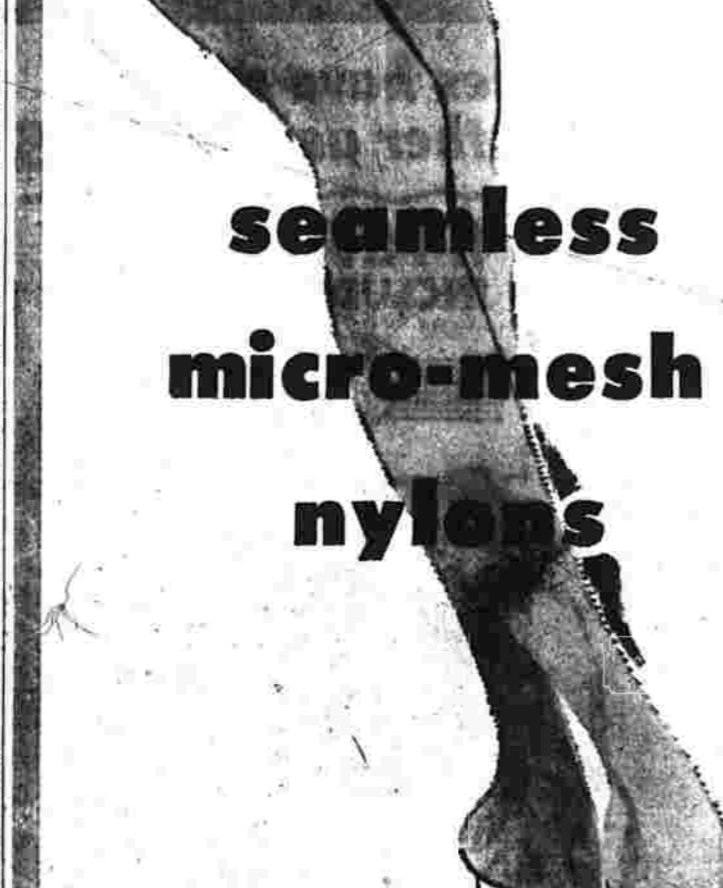

## Escaped Convict Hides Six Weeks with Family

Parsons, Kan., Dec. 8 (AP)—You just don't take chances with an escaped convict, said William March.

Thus the 41-year-old Parsons, a laborer, explained why he kept silent while an escaped convict shared his home as an unwelcome guest for 42 days.

Acting on a tip from Mrs. March, police yesterday arrested Richard Lee Algaier, 28, a St. Louis robber who escaped Oct. 18 from the Missouri Penitentiary. Algaier was picked up while slipping beer in a Parsons tavern. He was unharmed and did not resist.

Police also charged March with harboring a criminal after he signed a statement saying Algaier made no threat to harm him. But the charges were dropped.

Last night March said Algaier did not know what had happened and he had lots of friends.

Why did he sign the statement? "There was just too many of 'em around asking questions and I didn't know what to do," March said. His wife said last night in their dark little home he was sick and hungry.

Algaier also said he walked the 20-mile miles between the prison and Parsons, showed up at the March house last four days after he escaped.

"We first took him in because he was sick and hungry," said Mrs. March, apparently gray at 33. "We have always helped people like that."

A week later, Algaier told him he was a fugitive.

"From then on he always had one of us with him," she said, weeping as she recalled the experience.

"When my husband went to work, the kid was a day. Algaier was home with me and the children. If he went out he always had one of us with him."

Mrs. March said Algaier once threatened to kill her husband. But he wasn't trying to frighten them into silence, she said.

"He just didn't like William."

However, she said the two men never engaged in any serious altercation and that as far as she was concerned, Algaier was a likable fellow. She said Algaier often helped her with the children, ranging in age from 6 months to 12 years.

Algaier decided to leave Parsons Monday night. He borrowed March's car and left a few miles out of town, the car belonging to a ditch back to Parsons and the March home cause Algaier, that was enough for Mrs. March. When Algaier stepped out for a beer, she called police.

Algaier will be returned to Missouri, where he still has two years left to serve.

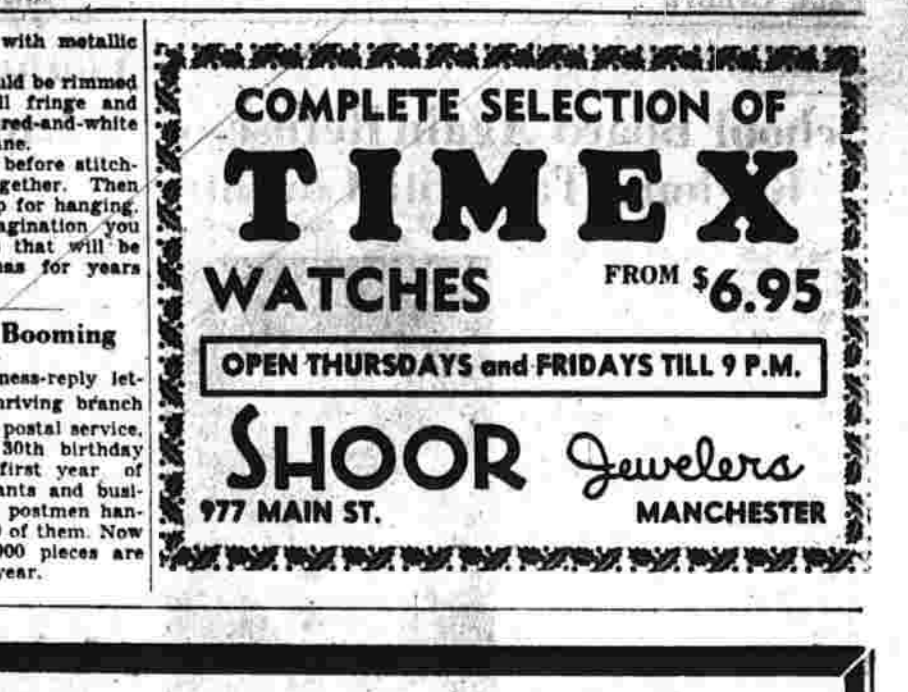

# Drills Twice a Month Local Fire Regulations For Schools 'Excellent'

(Continued from Page One)  
"Outside of the large Connecticut cities," Shaw said, "there are no alerted fire marshals. In some cases they may get as much as \$300 each year."  
"For the most part, they are all dedicated men. But because they have to hold other jobs to maintain their families, they have to do their work on a part-time basis," Shaw said.  
The local marshals are charged with the responsibility of inspecting public buildings regularly and under the code once a year and more often as necessary.  
"They have to be their inspectors at night or on their days off," Shaw said.  
Many Schools Rechecked  
Results in many parts of the state have been rechecked and areas for fire hazards today in the wake of the Chicago blaze which took 90 lives.  
Numerous steps to insure safety for children were instituted, including new fire drill procedures.  
Some cities, such as New York, Los Angeles and Pittsburgh, were sending officials to Chicago for a first-hand account of what authorities were doing here.  
At New Haven, Conn., city officials announced that they are placing school fire prevention and evacuation procedures under the supervision of the fire department.  
The Board of Education previously had charged. Fire officials now will hold monthly drills and make periodic inspections.  
Authorities in Kansas City said that, although schools there are regularly inspected four times a year, a special check was being made by a team of 30 inspectors.  
A Boston report disclosed that three of the city's school buildings were not given safety certificates by the Massachusetts Department of Public Safety. Two had faulty boilers and a third failed to meet safety requirements.  
Boston Fire Commissioner Francis X. Cotter ordered a special study of buildings. School Committee John J. Tierney said a dozen Boston schools had defective heating equipment.  
New Orleans Fire Department Supt. Howard Day called a Tuesday meeting of public and school officials to consider any necessary new measures.  
"He added that he would ask authority for the fire department to list fire drills without advance notice. At present, school officials must be informed beforehand."  
Officials in Washington, D. C., said steps already had been taken to prevent a disaster such as that in Chicago. One of the major fire older buildings with drop-out, enclosed exit stairwells.

Washington, Dec. 8 (AP)—Baseball magnates today formed an angry, united front against the major league players' bid for a cut of the owners' income and minor league demands for a pension plan.

The players' demands were backed by World Series radio and television money, which the players yesterday voted a salary proposal calling for 20 per cent more for each player.

At the same time, International League executives were alarmed by the threat of a strike by their players following the officials' refusal to accede to an ultimatum by the athletes.

"You will accept the proposal or you will not have International League baseball," the I.L. executive reported Thursday.

The International League officials are fully sympathetic to the players' request, said Frank Horton, president of the Rochester club, who reported Thursday.

Horton added the director "could find no way, within the economic framework of the league, to raise the more than a quarter of a million dollars to underwrite a pension plan."

Horton's reply was: "We intend to operate the league and play baseball in 1956. The players must agree to a pension plan."

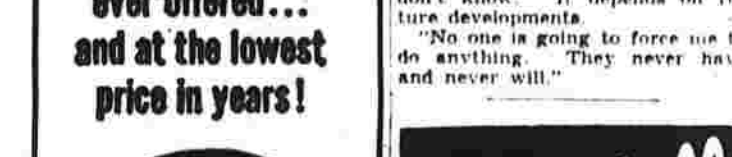
