Those Lost Chords Shell Would Improve Bad MHS Acoustics

One quarter of each concert performed in the Manchester High School auditorium was not heard by anyone but the players, although as many as 1,500 people were listening.

Efforts have been made to effect a permanent cure for the problem.

—Eleanor Nagy, professor of music at the Hartt College of Music at the University of Hartford, said the best way to project the sound was to install a shell.

—Pearson advised several rough estimates. The least expensive shell, one made of stretched canvas, would cost \$1,500, including installation. The most expensive, made of plastic with aluminum reinforcement, would be \$2,500 to \$3,000.

—Martin inquired if a formal request for a shell was made to the Board of Education. It would be up to Martin to get estimates and collect bids for the shell.

—Martin compared notes with some parents from Hartford's Bushnell Memorial in the fall. The Bushnell was faced with a similar problem, but less severe. Since then the Bushnell put up a new shell.

—If the high school shell could not be paid for by the bond money, then perhaps some civic or high school group might consider it.

—The director of the U.S. Marine Band which played here in October 1967 also commented on the difficulty of the acoustics. The right hand instruments, the horns and the baritone, "lost" their notes above the stage instead of "blowing" into the audience.

—Teachers Agree

—Dr. Albert Pearson, director of the music department at the high school and Robert Vetter, assistant director, agreed the acoustics were bad.

The U.S. Court of Appeals yesterday dismissed an appeal by the millionaire's counsel and ordered compliance with Judge Wyzanski's order.

Traffic Study Offers Broad City Changes

A traffic study report with over 40 recommendations was presented to the City Council last night by the Planning Commission and Executive H. Flynn, traffic engineer of West Hartford Associates of West Hartford.

New traffic signal lights, off-street parking, limited curbside parking, and channelization islands were recommended at some intersections.

A traffic commission of not more than five members should be appointed to continuously review traffic control problems and make recommendations, Flynn stated.

The traffic engineer was hired in September to survey traffic and parking problems in Belleville and to make recommendations. The survey and advisory report was presented to the City Council at a meeting in January.

The possibility of developing several new streets to improve the flow of traffic and open up areas for development was suggested by Flynn. School St. might be extended across Park St. to Elm St. Park St. fire station behind the Memorial Building is an extraordinary lot. The lot should be relocated, Flynn said. Elm St. should be one-way northbound. Park St. should be one-way westbound and parking on the upper end of Park St. should be eliminated. A stop sign should be placed at the northern end of Park St. Prospect St. and Elm St. should be no parking on Prospect St. between Elm and Park Sts.

A new street could run diagonally from E. Main St. opposite Elm St. to the intersection of Market and Brooklyn Sts. This would open up the area for redevelopment and balance the widening of Main St. shopping center. Study Elm St. from Cottage St. west to Prospect St. and Elm St. west to Elm St. full width is included in this recommendation.

Flynn referred to the non-use of the large tract of land at the intersection of Elm St. and Elm St. to replace the present signal light at the intersection of Elm St. and Elm St. in the same speed all day. A new signal that would control all streets at the intersection and be adjusted to varying traffic flow at different times of the day and evening would improve the situation, Flynn said. He pointed out that many elderly pedestrians use the crossing and the present "Walk" light is not clear enough. Safety islands halfway between the intersections should be installed on both sides.

The two parking meters near the corner of Park St. and Park St. might be moved. No parking from 4 to 6 p.m. to allow traffic entering the intersection to pass. If the car ahead is waiting for a green light to go through the intersection, traffic behind it is held up in the single lane.

Traffic signal lights have already been requested for the intersections of Union and West Sts. and for Windsor and Windsor.

Girelli Judges Town Reports

Boston Schaffer, Institute director, who made the announcement, said that more than 75 entries have already been received for judging. Deadline for entries is Jan. 2, and the three judges will meet at the University on Jan. 13.

The town report entries will be divided into six categories, based on population. The purpose of judging. Entries will be chosen for awards on the basis of content, comprehensibility, utility and attractiveness.

\$100,000 Blaze Guts Restaurant

CONTRACT ACCEPTED
Bridgeport, Dec. 9 (AP)—Union employees of the Connecticut Railway and Lighting Co. have voted 251-237 to accept a contract proposal made by their negotiators.

The lone exception was the Bridgeport Local which voted overwhelmingly last night to reject the contract. But the Bridgeport result failed to overcome the vote of the four other locals in New Britain, Waterbury, Derby and Norwalk.

Bridgeport Local 459 voted 181 to 18 against accepting the proposal. The contract was negotiated last Wednesday.

Paul R. Rust, president of the company, said he would accept the outcome of the vote with his heart of trust.

The contract offer, calling for a wage boost the first year, and five cents an hour in the second year with insurance and other fringe benefits, is the same as the one rejected last Friday by bus drivers of the Connecticut Company.

In return for this, both companies had asked the removal of the arbitration clause from the contract.

Harry Teroson, president of Local 459, had said that this was the major objection to the proposed contract.

The union, which has about 570 members, has been working without a contract since the old one expired Sept. 30. Drivers presently receive \$2.15 an hour, plus fringe benefits.
