The Hurdles Are High
 The Greater Hartford Bridge Authority operates between two forces: one the unalterable demand that it obtain from its bridge owners the Connecticut River the amount of toll to be originally estimated as available by the New York and New Jersey Turnpike Authority, and the other the relatively unknown quantity of resistance and discontent by the Connecticut public.

Last summer, in order to improve its income, the Authority set out to enact a regulation banning the use of loose toll tickets on its bridges. The public uproar over this forthcoming policy produced a kind of diversionary attack, in which the right of the Authority to impose tolls at all on the old historically free Bulkley Bridge was challenged. While this issue seemed to be exciting the public and producing campaign pledges from political candidates, the Authority marked time. Now, feeling that the public may be again, the Authority has gone back to its original intention and has promulgated its regulation, banning the use of loose tickets after Feb. 1.

After that date, everybody presenting a ticket at the Connecticut River blockade will also have to present the book it came from.

The primary objective of this ruling is to make it impossible for one-passenger travelers from distant points to pick up loose tickets and thus evade payment of the high cash tolls especially designed for our out-of-state friends and visitors. If this were to be the only effect of the ruling, Connecticut reaction could be limited to one of the questionable pleasure which comes from seeing somebody else pay up.

But if we were to delve into the recesses of the calculations behind this "ruling," we should be likely to discover that it also promises to produce an increase in toll income from Connecticut passers of the blockade. For, in fact, toll tickets are not refundable, and when they are no longer valid, and when every ticket presented must be accompanied by its own book, more books will be sold, more tickets in such books will be wanted because the family or business does not use them all up in time, or more books purchased will be of the "tight ticket classification" with their longer life.

If the Authority were interested in "balancing this additional new expense for Connecticut passers of the blockade," it might conceivably do that by removing the time limit on the tickets, so that families and business could buy as many full-up tickets as they might need, and then use them as they saw fit. Unfortunately, the Authority is not privileged to think such kindly thoughts. It must do everything its consultants tell it to do in order to obtain the income these same consultants calculated the blockade would yield. It wants more money from out-of-state transients. It wants more money from people in the Hartford region too, and its new regulation will give it both.

Politics An Unlaid
 It was not an illustrious session of the United Nations General Assembly which adjourned last Friday night. Each major world power was represented, and the session did not end in a moment of quiet contemplation when the world's leaders were annually succeed in facing both major world powers into a common front. The session generated more noise than action. It marched toward a precipitous end and then but always fell back, treaded and ineffective. Sometimes, the equal of a private war was a thing of at most complete hypocrisy, as when both major parties proclaimed themselves in favor of some international control of outer space, but both went along with strategic goals which made very sure no such control would come along very soon to interfere with their private race into the military potentialities of outer space. Sometimes, the will of a majority was frustrated by rigid and seemingly undemocratic parliamentary requirements, as when a resolution acknowledging Algeria's right to independence failed by one vote to gain the two-thirds vote necessary for adoption.

The session did not depart from the mediocre spirit and record of the session itself. East and West dutifully accused each other of abstractionism. Each attempted, with some awkwardness, to claim some kind of strategic victory, or some item of good accomplishment.

All this, moreover, and dash and pointed as it is, overburdens the session into a somewhat reassuring pattern the pattern of the session of the state legislature, or of the Congress, or the parliament which does nothing more than mark time while issues and minute wait for crystallization.

There is only one really noticeable omission from this picture. The delegations which gave this nonsensical performance do not really have to go back and face their own constituents directly, or face any electorate directly on the basis of their legislative record. They are responsible directly only to the government which appointed them, and told them what to do, and these governments, whether dictatorial or democratic, generally operate, too, as if foreign policy were something above the comprehension or wisdom of their own ordinary constituents. But we would like some day, to see every country select some number of its United Nations delegates by direct election, with the constituents giving their ideas of what United Nations policies, and the policies of their own nations in the United Nations, ought to be. And the voters given their chance to express their will.

Such direct representatives of the people would not need to constitute the majority of any nation's legislature in order to have their primary function, which would be to give people, as well as formal governments, voice and representation in the world legislature.

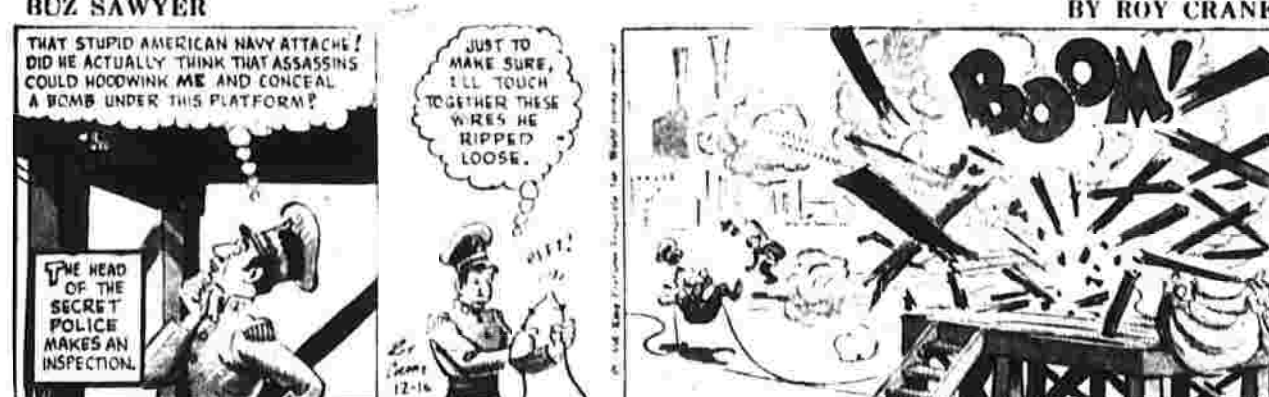

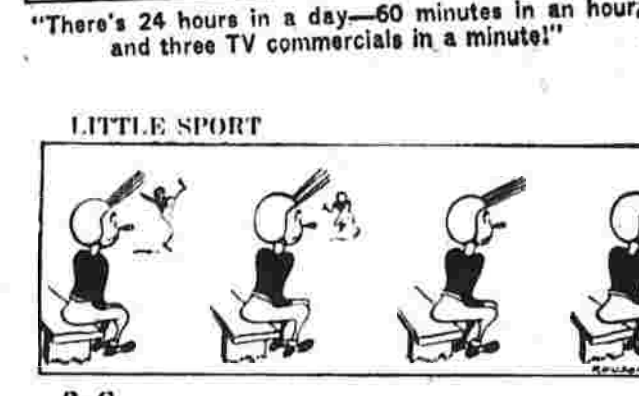
