Atlantic Pact to Push Europe Missile Bases

Paris, Dec. 17 (AP)—Supreme Allied Commander Gen. Lauris Norstad today won approval from the Atlantic Pact powers to push forward nuclear missile armament in Europe in the face of Soviet threats. Norstad emphasized the need for 1,000-mile guided missiles based in Europe and the foreign and defense ministers of the 16 nation alliance approved his goals as clear. This phrase, by a NATO spokesman, appeared to make it clear that Norstad was not getting all he wanted or asked. The objective of the Atlantic Pact military forces have usually been ahead of actual achievements. The resolution by the North Atlantic Council came after a sober presentation of Soviet military might, both conventional and atomic. Facing Norstad a force of about 17 combat divisions in a Russian Army of 170 divisions. One million Soviet soldiers could pour into Europe from the East. The western armistice shield failed. 7-Nation Unit Set to Control Ban on N-Tests

Geneva, Dec. 17 (AP)—The United States, Britain and the Soviet Union agreed today that a nuclear test ban should be controlled by a 7-member commission on which each of the three powers would have a permanent seat. They approved the fourth article of a draft treaty for the prohibition of atomic and hydrogen weapons tests. The article provides for establishment of the commission, which would be the supreme authority of a worldwide organization to police a test ban. The United States, Britain, and the Soviet Union would be permanent members of the commission. The other four members would be elected for fixed terms by a conference of all the members. Wide areas of disagreement exist on the details of the treaty. The four treaty articles now approved provide for a prohibition of tests, an obligation to cooperate in the verification of the treaty, a functional framework for the organization, and a prohibition of tests. Ike Seeks to Avert GOP Fight in Senate

Washington, Dec. 17 (AP)—President Eisenhower held a surprise conference with Senate Minority Leader Charles McNichols today to avoid a disruptive battle over the Senate's confirmation of a Senate party committee which assigns GOP leadership to various legislative committees. McNichols, chairman of the Senate GOP Policy Committee, told newsmen afterward that he and Eisenhower hope will be possible to start the new year as a united front. A split in Republican Senate ranks has been widening since the candidacy of Sen. Everett M. Dirksen for GOP floor leader. Dirksen indicated that he would support the initiative in arranging today's meeting. But McNichols added that the President "just listened and feels it is a problem for the Senate itself to resolve." McNichols said that as the titular head of the party the President should be glad to discuss the leadership problem with him at any time. There was no immediate indication of the effect the Eisenhower-Bridges conference might have on Senators organized to oppose Dirksen. Dirksen already has talked to representatives of the group opposed to Dirksen and that he has offered a fair compromise. The Doctor Says

Parents Should Not Delay Treatment of Crossed-Eyes

I have tried to point out again and again that the prevention of disease or injury is the best. But when this is impossible, the prompt diagnosis and treatment of a disorder in its early stages is likely to be both effective and less costly than if it is allowed to run on too long.

This is the case for crossed eyes in children. We do not know how to prevent this from developing, but its treatment is more likely to be successful if it is started early in life.

I should say first that nearly every mother who has a first-born child fears that the infant's eyes are crossed. During the first few weeks the eyes wander from each other and do not seem to be looking in the same direction. Generally this usually takes care of itself after a few months.

True cross-eyedness is when one eye turns inward. But in some cases the eye may turn outward (walleye) or sometimes upward.

Any one of several factors may cause cross eyes, a slow or hereditary disease, near- or far-sightedness, faulty muscles and nervous innervation.

There are several kinds of treatment for crossed eyes. Some of them can be started as early as the first year. Which of the various methods to use is a matter which must be decided by the physician. It may be that glasses will be recommended and this alone may or may not be sufficient.

Another method of treatment is to place a patch over the "good" eye. This forces the youngster to use the weaker eye and therefore strengthens its muscles and vision.

Eye muscle exercises are sometimes prescribed and this may be in addition to glasses.

Sometimes surgery is necessary if the other methods fail or the physician feels they will not work. This is not considered a dangerous procedure when done by a competent specialist.

The results of treatment do not come at once. It may take a year or longer to bring about improvement, but it will come.

The poor eyesight which accompanies crossed eyes is a severe handicap for any youngster. It interferes with his work in school and his pleasure in play.

It can also have a serious psychological effect. Playmates may call him "cockeyed" or some other teasing name.

A child past the first few months of life who shows a tendency to close one eye, to tilt the head or to rub one of the eyes, should be examined for crossed eyes since a child does not outgrow this condition by himself.

It is important to identify a youngster with crossed eyes just as early as possible and to start skilled treatment promptly. Those who do not do this will have a child who is handicapped by something which might have been corrected.

What main ingredients go into a successful holiday party? If you plan to stir up this brew of holiday entertainment, we advise you to observe certain ground rules. When recently helped give two parties for youngsters, we worked out the following:

1. If the partygoers are of preschool or early school age, you are plenty to manage.
2. State clearly on the invitations the time the party begins and ends. Plan enough activities for the party hours so there are no time lags. Watch Firm Said Misdleading Public

Washington, Dec. 17 (AP)—The Justice Dept. said today that a watch firm, in violation of Federal Trade Commission (FTC) regulations, is misleading the public.

Examining Frank Hise said in a report issued yesterday that the company failed to show the public that its watch cases are being made in Hong Kong. Hise ordered the company to show the origin of the cases—but dismissed other deceptive practices charges brought against the company in a FTC complaint made last January.

The examiner said that when the company stamps its trade name on the inside of the backs, it tended to mislead purchasers into believing the case or the entire watch was imported from Switzerland.

He said the cases have "Hong Kong" stamped in red ink on the inside of the backs when received by the company, but this is usually removed in processing the watches.

Hise said that FTC lawyers failed to prove that inscriptions placed on watch cases by the company were deceptive, as had been alleged. The challenged inscriptions were "Swiss steel back," "water resistant" or "water proof" and "cased and timed by precision watch craftsmen."

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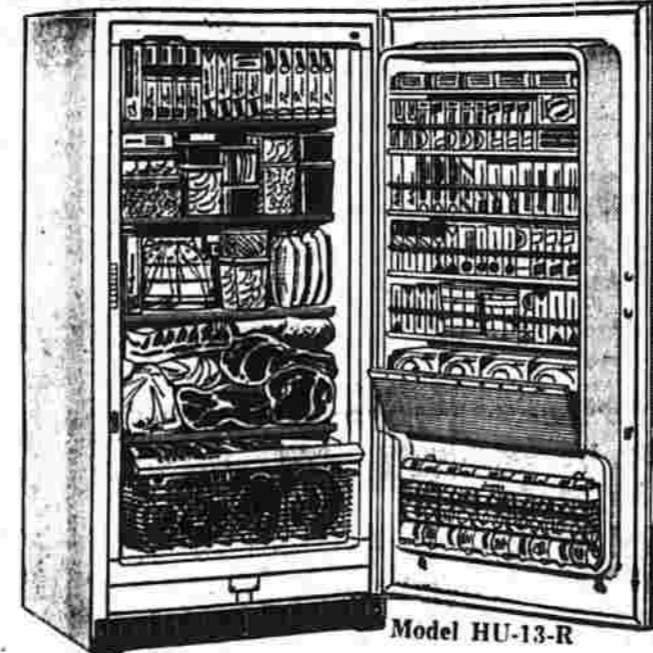

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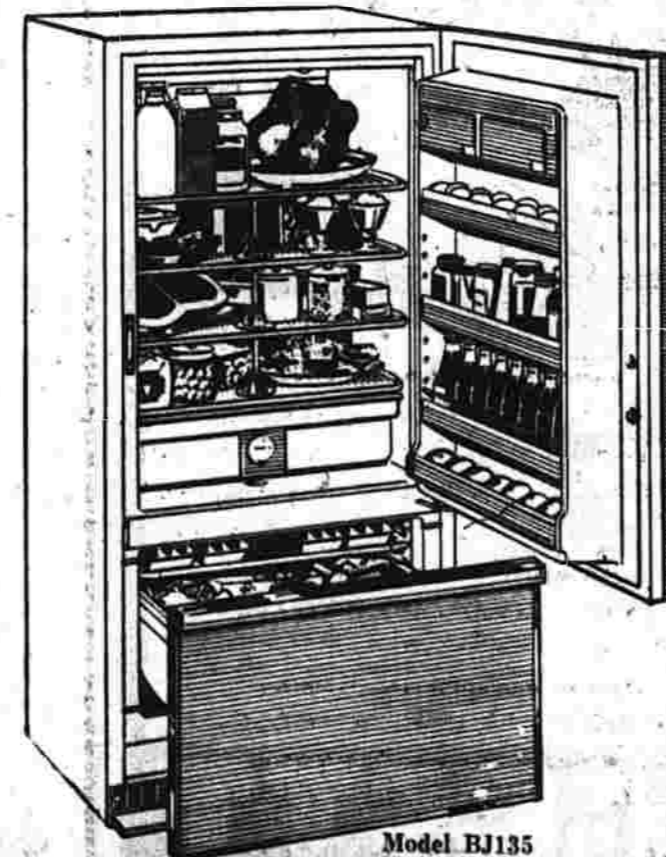


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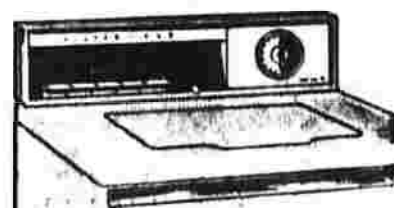

Mao Due to Resign, Chinese Reds Admit

watch developments in Red China draw varying impressions from Mao's retirement as government chief.

U.S. and British foreign officials took the view that Mao remained as powerful as ever. Some officials in Communist Poland felt that Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev had a hand in the maneuver—or at least welcomed it.

Mao stands as a potential rival to Khrushchev as the high apostle of world communism.

The Chinese Communist party's communique sought to set at rest reports that grumbling over the communique was a factor in Mao's decision.

The communique declared the campaign program to speed up production will be carried out.

The only hint of possible discontent among the Chinese people to the communique came in a plea to party workers to "tidy up and consolidate the people's communes in their own areas in close cooperation with the production tasks for this winter and coming spring.

The communique, in a direct attack on U.S. "imperialists trying to hang on to Taiwan (Formosa)," declared:

If the American aggressive forces do not withdraw the troops accord, then the day will eventually come when the Chinese on the mainland will unite to drive them out.

The Chinese leaders used caution in their communique to avoid creating even the slightest implication that Mao was forced out because of any errors.

The 65-year-old leader of the Chinese Communist revolution, has been pictured as the all-knowing guide and counselor who makes no mistakes. Much of the tightly regulated structure of Red China has been built around this picture.

And closing of the picture could cause cracks in the Communist control system. This would be especially true if there were any hint the change involved reversal over the new commune system, which is smashing revolutionary traditions to force people into work camps.

There also could be repercussions in China's satellites, North Korea and North Viet Nam, if people got the idea Mao is a "paper tiger."

Foreign Minister Chen Yi, in telling the diplomats of the change, admitted the Chinese people would be disturbed by a news. Chen reportedly said the decision would be announced in a way to banish all fear and apprehension.

Indications are that this will be done by playing up the traditional Chinese reverence for the scholar. The people apparently will be told that Mao is relinquishing one post to devote more time to study and writing.

This "back to the books" line already has been given to Peking correspondents for the London Daily Worker and the official Yugoslav news agency Tanjug.

Alan Warrington of the Worker reported that Mao had asked to leave the presidency in order to "concentrate his attention on policy and theory as more important than performing the functions of head of state."

Tanjung said Chen told diplomats that Mao will concentrate on communist party theoretical work. Chen reportedly said there were no internal or foreign difficulties involved in the change.

Yugoslav Communists said privately, however, that Mao had lost influence and power. Opinion was divided in the Yugoslav capital whether a more moderate or more extreme faction would succeed Mao.

State Department officials in Washington were reported convinced that Mao still controlled Red China. Chinese Nationalists on Formosa speculated that Mao, in trouble at home and in relations with Soviet Premier Khrushchev, was slipping. The Nationalists did not expect policy changes either, however.

Mao's successor as president has not been announced.

Quickie Gifts From the Kitchen

Found: The perfect recipe for the chewy candy that tempts everyone making and eating.

Fast as you can get your hands on it, this candy is made at college, training to do it. One of her best texts was the invaluable "How and Why of Cooking" by Evelyn C. Halliday and Janet T. Noyes (The University of Chicago Press).

The girls in the dietetic class soon discovered that the book contained a mean recipe for caramels. Around holiday time they cooked up the candy for gifts.

Other times of the year they made and sold batches of it for pin money.

Recently this caramel recipe, matched against another standard, one came out the winner. Here is our adaptation of the textbook rule.

The main ingredients in their original proportions, but we've added vanilla because it gives these light bland caramels delicate flavor; and we've particularized the method so that young cooks who have not had the benefit of a home economics classroom will find it easy to follow.

When big sisters go into the kitchen to make something sweet to eat, little sisters are sure to follow. We find such moppets are perfectly happy making off and cutting up the pieces of waxed paper needed for wrapping the candy. Then when the caramels are ready to be wrapped, they'll be ready to help do this work. But remember that small hands will "color" each candy wrapping most successfully by twisting its ends.

Light Nut Caramels
Ingredients: 1 cup sugar, 1 cup light corn syrup, 1 cup light cream, 1/2 cup butter or margarine, 1 cup chopped walnuts or pecans, 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Method: Place sugar, corn syrup, cream and butter in a large (about 3 quart) heavy saucepan; mix well. Cook over moderate heat, stirring occasionally. When the mixture begins to "caramelize," lower the heat and cook, stirring constantly, to 244 degrees on a candy thermometer; or until a teaspoonful of the mixture, when dropped into a cup of water, forms a firm ball that does not flatten when it is removed from the water. Stir in the nuts and vanilla. Pour into one corner of a lightly buttered cake pan (8 by 8 by 2 inches) allowing the mixture to flow and level of its own accord. Allow to stand until cold. Turn the block of candy onto a cutting board. Mark off into 1/2 inch squares; cut with a sharp knife. Wrap caramels individually in waxed paper. Makes about 1 1/2 pounds.

Chocolate Nut Caramels: Follow recipe for light nut caramels, adding 1 square (1 ounce) unwaxed chocolate after mixture has reached boiling point.

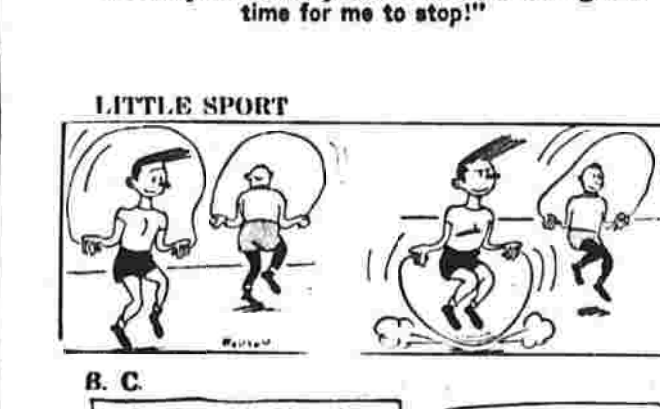
