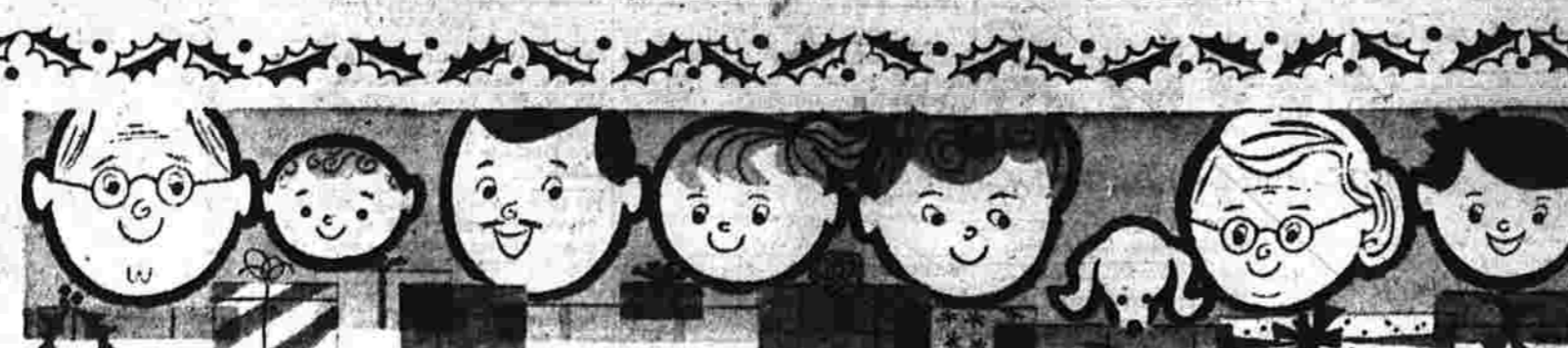

Kuznetsov also insisted that the conference should deal with the whole range of East-West disarmament problems which have been under discussion without result under United Nations auspices for the past 12 years.

This has been advanced previously by the Soviet Union in disarmament discussions.

The Soviet bloc also proposed inspection covering most of Europe, Turkey, Iran and the western United States. It also proposed to keep all nuclear weapons out of both parts of Germany. All these

## Federal Controls Urged on Prices Of Milk in State

Washington, Dec. 18 (AP)—The Agriculture Dept. today recommended a federal marketing order to regulate the sale of fluid milk in Connecticut.

The order would be designed to help stabilize prices and supplies of milk.

Similar to an order regulating milk in the New York-New Jersey area, the order would set minimum prices which handlers would be required to pay distributors.

Dairy men and handlers were given until Jan. 9 to submit exceptions to the proposed program.

The department also proposed amendments to the New York-New Jersey order designed to coordinate the two programs by eliminating Connecticut producers and handlers from provisions of the New York-New Jersey program.

**Look for Bad Breaks**

THE WAY TO avoid mishaps of this sort is to look for bad breaks before they attack you. It is impossible to provide against any possible bad break, partly because you don't know how long it will last. When a hand looks very easy, however, take a second look to see if you can take out insurance against an abnormal situation in a key suit.

In this hand, for example, you would have no problem at all. It takes only a few seconds to look for a way of guarding against a bad break in the trump suit.

Participate open with one spade and the next play passes. What you should do is to lead a trump. You can later get to dummy and lead a low trump through East in order to fit into the nine from your hand.

**Daily Question**

You are worried about a 5-1 trump break. You must think about the danger of finding all four trumps in one hand. How can you prevent the ten of trumps from being the trump? You have all of the trump? The simplest way is to begin the trump by leading the queen (not jack). No matter what happens on that first trump trick, you will find out how the suit breaks. ### The Doctor Says

**Bronchitis, If Ignored, Can Lead to Serious Illness**

By EDWIN F. JORDAN, M.D. Written for NEA Service

Irritation of the breathing passages leading to the lower lungs, which are known as bronchitis, is common and leads to distressing symptoms. The most frequent in coughing. The disorder is known as bronchitis.

Of course, there are other reasons for coughing besides bronchitis. Anyone who has unexplained long-lasting coughing should try to obtain a diagnosis as rapidly as possible.

In general, bronchitis is considered the result of an infection or some irritating agent breathed in with the air.

There are many possibilities. Not long ago, for example, snuff was incriminated and was shown to be the source of responsible germs. In the case reported when the use of snuff was discontinued the germs disappeared from the sputum coughed up.

Bronchitis is usually classified as acute or chronic. In the former, the disease is likely to start suddenly with symptoms similar to those of an ordinary cold. Heaviness or pain over the chest are likely to be present.

Other symptoms may or may not be present, but the most characteristic sign is a cough which comes off and on and causes a good deal of distress. Quite often the acute disease passes in a week or so, but frequently it leads to chronic bronchitis in which the cough simply does not go away.

If the cause can be uncovered and corrected, the coughing, however, is not always easy, and it is often necessary to use drugs or antibiotics which may relieve the symptoms somewhat.

Also, everyone who has bronchitis—the chronic variety in particular—should be built up to the best possible physical condition.

Change of climate, when it can be arranged, is an important part of treatment for many patients with chronic bronchitis. Often those who cannot seem to get over their chronic cough at home promptly improve when they go in a warm, mild or dry climate.

Of course, the result of such change depends to some extent on the cause of the bronchitis, and also on how long the bronchitis has been in existence and its severity.

What everyone with a long-lasting cough should remember is that this is not something to laugh off. It is likely to be relieved by patient cough remedies.

It should not be ignored lest a chronic state of bronchitis set in or even more serious complications develop.

### Christmas Tree Supply Shorter Than Last Year

New York, Dec. 18 (AP)—You'll probably be able to have a Christmas Tree this year as usual, although they are in shorter supply than in 1957.

A nurseryman in the Hartford, Conn., area reported the supply there the shortest in 30 years.

Shortages also were reported elsewhere in Connecticut, but a check-up in other key areas of the United States indicated their supply is ample.

New York City dealers said their supply is shorter than last year. They added that last year there was a surplus and that the quantity arriving should be sufficient.

Several reasons are given by those in the trade for the shorter supply this year.

One is caution against another surplus. Another is that cold weather and snow have hampered cutting in Northern United States and in Canada.

A third reason, advanced by Edwin Grove, secretary-treasurer of the Maine Christmas Tree Assn., is that widespread blazes last year of balsam needles gall midges made this year give trees a chance to recover.

Grove said Maine normally ships about one million Christmas trees annually, but that the number would be less this year.

G. W. I. Crichton, Nova Scotia deputy lands commissioner, estimated that the province's Christmas tree output this year would be about 75 per cent of last year's.

It warned the needle midge blight, right inspection demands in the New York market, and a general warning to better quality trees. Cold weather and muddy conditions also hampered the Nova Scotia harvest.

After the ceremony of the red hat, Pope John gave his blessing to the Cardinals and to the thousands in the basilica, those who were on his portable throne.

The new Cardinals returned to the basilica altar, before the pope's pontifical throne for the final ceremony.

They prostrated themselves before the altar and prayed while the Sistine choir sang a verse of the Te Deum (hymn of thanks). Then, in the last act of the public ceremony, Eugene Cardinal Tisserant, the dean of the College, recited a prayer over the still prostrate prelates.

All the Cardinals then filed out to a concluding secret consistory with Pope John.

There the Pontiff gave the new ones their symbolic rings and assigned them titular churches in Rome. Then he performed an ancient ceremony to admit them to the privilege of counseling him and to speak at consistory.

Pope John placed them in secret to the College's future deliberations.

The three new Cardinals absent may be Fernando Collinze of Portugal; Joseph Bueno of Montreal, Archdiocese of Quebec; and the Vatican's Nuncio to Italy, Giuseppe Piatia. They will receive the insignia of their office from the chiefs of state of Portugal, Spain and Italy following ancient custom between those predominantly Catholic nations and the Vatican.

The day's ceremonies began with the new Cardinals taking their oaths before Cardinal Tisserant. Speaking for the pope, the newly created Cardinal, Archbishop Giovanni Battista Montini of Milan said:

"I, Cardinal of the Holy Roman Church, promise and swear, until the hour of my death, and during my life, to obey the pope, to be obedient to the Holy Father, Pope John XXIII, and to his legitimate elected successors in the future, and not to give advice, consent or aid to acts against the pope's majesty."

The week's ceremonies included the Sacred College—the Senate of the church—in its largest assembly in history and expanded its first line beyond the limit of 70 members set by Pope Sixtus V in 1586.

The 23 new Cardinals named by Pope John Nov. 17 include 13 Italians and 10 non-Italians.

**Geiger Counter Aids Inspection**

Washington—A new device, the Atomonitor, is being used by the Army Ordnance Corps for radioactive inspection of hidden, vital parts in mechanical assemblies on a production line at the rate of 2,000 assemblies an hour.

The device replaces manual inspectors to make sure artillery-shell fuse heads contain complete firing-pin assemblies.

The part to be detected is plated with 1/100 micrograms of radioactive silver. A Geiger counter in the device checks assemblies for radiation, and nonradioactive assemblies are ejected from the production line.

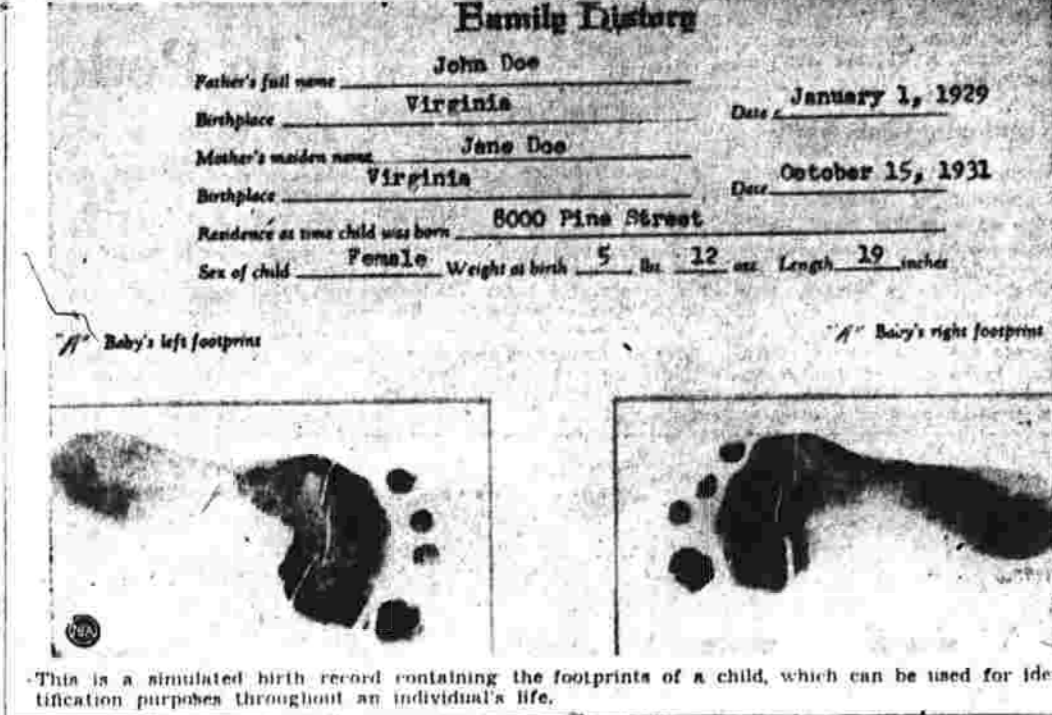
# FBI Urges Infant Footprinting

Washington—(NEA)—Not even the world's best baby photographers can turn out a memento that is as valuable to proud parents as the hospital record of their infant's footprints.

The importance of this unique document made headlines recently when a Boulder City, La., couple called on the Federal Bureau of Investigation to find out which of their five-year-old twin daughters was which.

The girls looked as much alike as two peas in a pod. In a constant state of confusion trying to tell them apart, the couple called on the FBI to help.

Finally, the parents decided it was time to settle the problem. They asked local doctors to take footprints of the girls and to match them with those on their birth certificates. But the footprints of the girls looked so much alike that the police as well as smiling faces.



This is a simulated birth record containing the footprints of a child, which can be used for identification purposes throughout an individual's life.

Finally, the FBI identified the prints in the FBI Identification Division in Washington. The bureau's identification division agency identifies disease victims in areas missing persons and straighten out baby mix-ups as public service. With 15 minutes the highly skilled FBI experts spotted differences in the prints and solved the parents' dilemma.

It's cases like this that cause FBI officials to emphasize the importance of hospital footprints. They explain that the prints of no two people having the same fingerprints also hold true for footprints.

Footprinting is usually used for infants since their fingers are too small and their prints are too imprecise. But agents explain that since a baby's prints are being taken before the delivery room there is no footprints way of identifying a newborn child about his identity. This is

# Some Raises On Appliances Seen for 1959

New York, Dec. 18 (AP)—The head of the nation's largest electrical manufacturing concern says prices in electrical appliances will rise in 1959.

Ralph J. Cordner, chairman of General Electric Co., told a year-end news conference yesterday.

"The electrical appliance market generally has been a soft one and there have been many competitors. I would presume there will be some price increases in the coming year."

Robert Paxton, GE's president, declared:

"Some of our people hope to raise prices on television sets. Cordner predicted higher sales of appliances and other consumer goods, along with continued strong defense business, would offset lower orders for utility apparatus in 1959."

All told, Cordner said GE should show a favorable trend in total sales in the fourth quarter of this year and 1959.

On the nation's economy, the GE chairman declared: "The recovery that has been under way since the third quarter of 1958 is a sound recovery, and will continue."

The company's stock price rose in recent weeks was a good sign that business was recovering, he said. "They are not indulging in an excessive build-up of inventories and facilities beyond what is warranted by foreseeable economic conditions."

Cordner said GE will spend roughly \$100 million for capital expansion in 1959, about equal to this year's outlay. He said the company had completed a ten-year \$1.4 billion program, so 80 per cent of the year's funds will go into "new processes, equipment and facilities."

For business in general, Cordner said he expected a "moderate" push ahead in reorganizing the value of a free economy over a government controlled economy. He is urging other businessmen to acknowledge their political responsibilities.

# Greek Cypriots Spared Death

Nicosia, Cyprus, Dec. 18 (AP)—Two Cypriot youths, who were sentenced to die early today, received last minute reprieve from British Governor Sir Hugh Foot. The executions had been expected to take place today in Nicosia central prison. Hundreds of prisoners who had been chanting anti-British songs and shouting anti-British slogans broke into tremendous cheer.

The above gave the first indication of the reprieve to crowd waiting outside. The two youths, Curtis Constantinides, 27, and Yankis Athanasios, 22, had been expected to have at dawn, though officials had not announced the time.

They would have been the first persons including the British on the Mediterranean island in 21 months. They were condemned for the EOKA murder of another Greek Cypriot, EOKA is the Greek terrorist organization fighting for union with Greece.

A later government announcement said the sentences had been commuted to life imprisonment.

Numerous appeals for clemency had been made to British authorities. Messages from the youths' parents to Queen Elizabeth II, Governor Sir Hugh Foot, and Evangelos Averoff-Tonizalis reported by the British press.

# Court Clears Wohlgenuth Of Treason

Karlsruhe, Germany, Dec. 18 (AP)—Dr. Wolfgang Wohlgenuth, who former West German Security Chief Otto John claimed spied for East Germany, was acquitted today of treason charges.

The West German Supreme Court said there was no evidence that ex-SS doctor's relations with East German to Communist were treasonable or that he had kidnapped John.

John defected to Communist East Germany July 20, 1954. Returning after 17 months in the East, he claimed Wohlgenuth drugged and kidnapped him for the Reds. John was convicted of treason two years ago, was sentenced to four years in prison, and was pardoned by president Theodor Heuss early this year.

Wohlgenuth admitted putting John in touch with high-ranking Communists. John, he said, believed Nazism and militarism were reviving in West Germany and was fed up with it. He testified that the security chief went over to the east voluntarily.

Wohlgenuth also admitted driving John over the East Berlin border. Wohlgenuth himself remained in West Germany except for secret, hurried trips into West Berlin, where there was a warrant for his arrest.

West Berlin police finally arrested him last February when he crossed into the British sector of Berlin. He was held in a cell for several days.

Court President Heinrich Jagow told Wohlgenuth in his verdict: "Nobody can convict you because John committed a crime that at least outwardly caused serious damage to the West German Federal Republic."

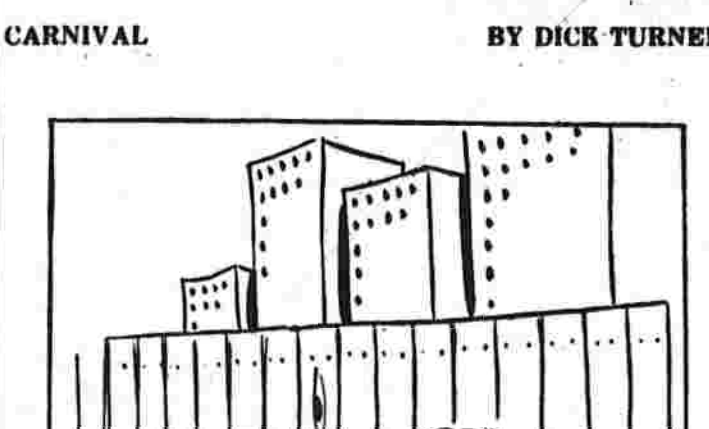

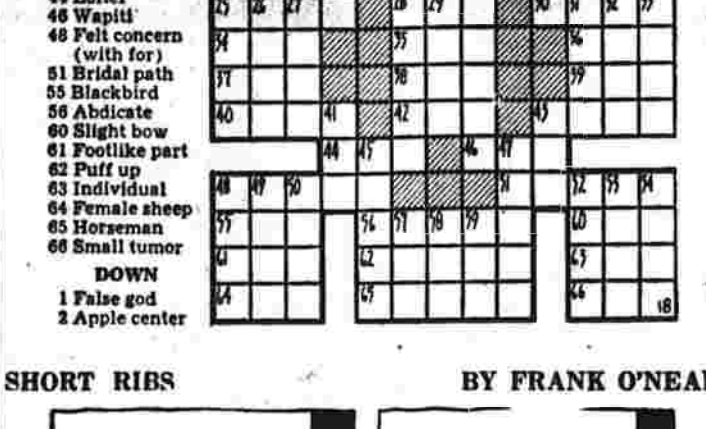
