 Hammarajd and the UNEF commander, Canadian Gen. E. L. Machine Gulps And Chews Trees
 Portland, Ore.—A new machine that gulps slash trees and chews them into chips is adding to revolutionize road-clearing operations in the Pacific Northwest.
 The giant chipper, designed by Stan Elmer of Portland, has 300 horsepower and can grip trees up to 24 inches in diameter at a rate of 50 feet a minute. The 40-foot-long machine either sprays the chips or piles them for use in landscaping.
 The cost of clearing roads with this machine is less than that of less than conventional methods of cutting, pulling and burning trees. 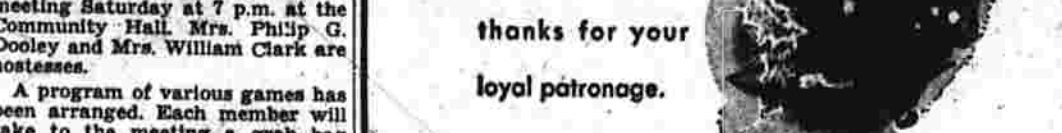

Board Votes 6 to 1 To Fluoridate Water

The Board of Directors last night authorized the Town Water Department to install and operate a plant for fluoridating town water.

A 10 to 1 vote, with two abstentions, passed the controversial measure to put matters up to the public in which they (Directors) would stand if they were afraid to take the responsibility of making a decision.

Buying the equipment and installing it will cost about \$10,000, he said, according to estimates from towns which have bought fluoridation equipment. On the same basis, operational costs might amount to \$5,000 a year with \$2,000 for chemicals, \$200 for power and \$2,000 for wages. As yet, these estimates are indefinite in Manchester's case, he pointed out.

Directors voting in the affirmative were Gilbert Barnes, Mayor Eugene Kelly, Councilmen Ronald Jacoda, Alice Lameno and John Hutchinson.

Robert Gordon was opposed, Theodore Powell and Francis Mahoney abstained.

The vote followed a long discussion in which Powell, Gordon and Mahoney argued against the measure on grounds that fluoridation should not be forced on townspeople who might not want it. They did not take a stand on whether they should have it or not.

Question Pondered Before Kelly, in answer, said this question has been pondered innumerable times in the history of public welfare legislation, adding: "How is this any more onerous than compulsory education, the draft and compulsory vaccination, and other types of legislation that restrict an individual's freedom or compel others to do something against their wishes?"

Director Jacobs, who voted for fluoridation, asked before the vote was taken that approval be made in the form of an ordinance, rather than in the form of an administrative act, so that the latter would be subject to judicial review.

Kelly, however, maintained that approval of fluoridation, which is considered legal, is not a matter of ordinance.

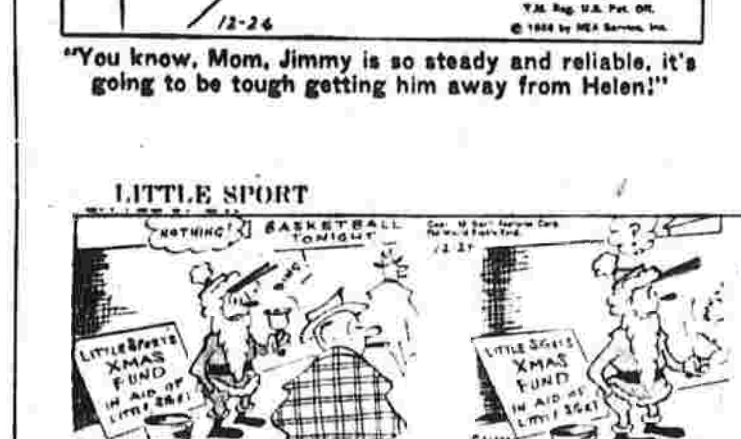

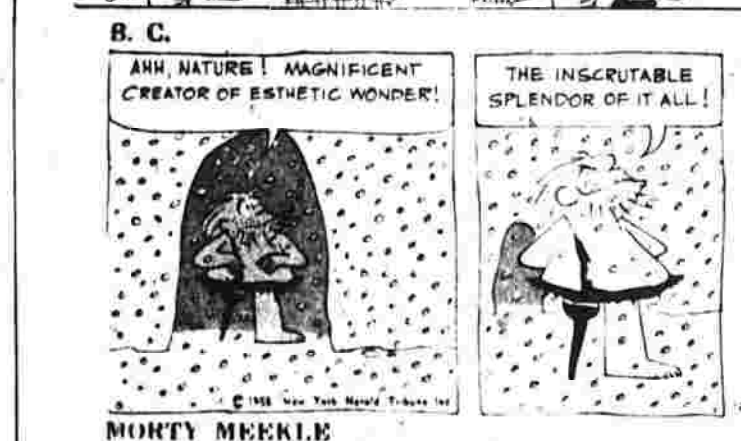

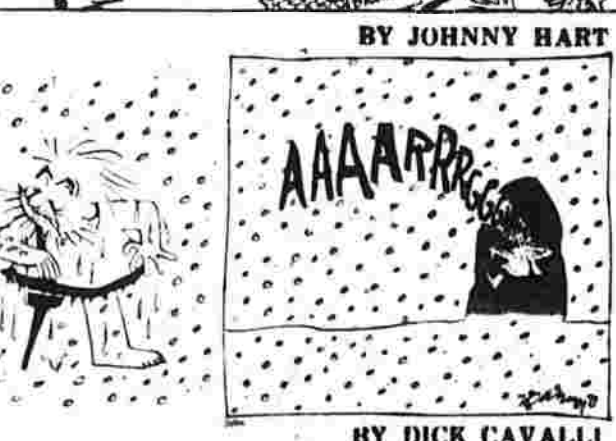
