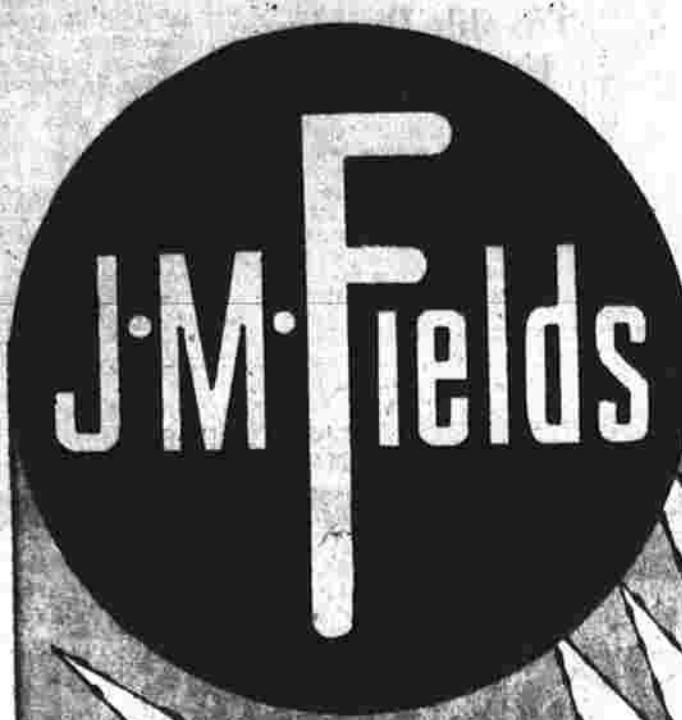

field strengthened. This was apparently induced by electrical currents in the atmosphere. Balloons detected x-rays within some 20 miles of the Earth's surface.

Through chains of magnetic stations, some IGY scientists have tracked on tracing local and surface magnetic variations induced from electro-magnetic events in the upper air, seeking clearer understanding of air-Earth interactions.

IGY men confirmed the existence of the equatorial electrojet, a powerful electric current flowing in daylight hours only above the Earth's magnetic equator. Similar currents presumably circle both poles. They offer new insight upon solar effects on magnetic fields.

Probing the sky with radio fingers, scientists found the ionosphere or electrification of the upper air persists over the South Pole even during the long polar night when the sun is down. Apparently, great clouds of electrons drift in slowly from lower latitudes. Simple absence of sunshine does not remove the ionosphere.

Radio studies of the ionosphere, and the discovery that radio signals can be received from Earth satellites at unexpectedly long distances, offer clues to new methods of radio communication.

Earth's Great Measured

A group of scientists used man-made explosions and the shock signals from natural earthquakes to fill in their understanding of the Earth's interior and its heat. Shocks from underground A-bomb tests offered a new tool for doing this.

Seismic soundings detected the thinnest crust of the Earth yet discovered under the sea—2½ miles—and also the thickest under the sea—9 miles deep.

The pull of gravity was measured over 10 per cent of the sea surface, and over vast distances on land—adding up ultimately to far more accurate picture of the Earth's gravity, and from that, a better conception of the real shape of the Earth.

The moon and the sun, through gravity, cause tides not only on the oceans, but also on the land—actually creating wavy bulges in the Earth's crust.

Scientists are now working to learn how much the Earth and sea level may be rising.

Glaciologists from 28 nations checked all the Earth's ice areas. They sampled down through layers of ice to find out how old the present glacial changes, to

Consumers Hold Key to Stem 1959 Rise in Cost of Living

By RAY CROMLEY

Washington (REA) — Surprises in December, 1958, the dollar bill likely will buy only two cents less worth of goods than now.

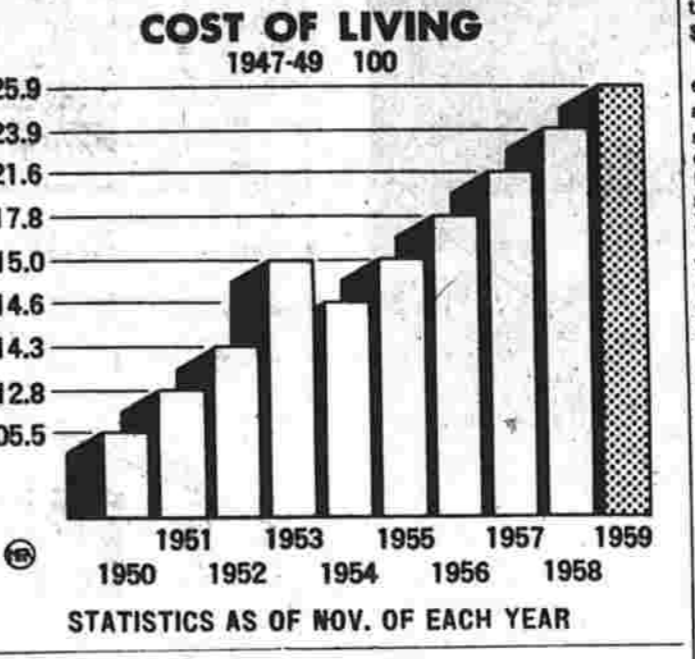
That's an average of the prices set by top government and private economists here. Some think the cost of living will go up only one per cent, some figure a three per cent rise.

Of course, many goods are going up a lot more than this but the overall average will be pulled down by a slip in farm food prices.

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce interviewed businessmen throughout the country. Almost half the industrialists interviewed believed the goods they make will go up. Most other businessmen—except bankers—believe their goods or services wouldn't. Actually what happens depends on John Q. Consumer. Mr. Consumer has a great deal of power in his hands this year, say the economists. According to his whim, he can force prices down, or he can force them up.

If he buys heavily at whatever the cost, simply because he has the money or credit, prices will go up. If he waits for a better price, prices will stay relatively stable.

John C. Has Moore, who has chosen this year because he has the money in his pocket, says he has no use for the things he needs to get by on for another year. He can wait until the price goes down, or he can buy a TV set. He's in the driver's seat. Producers who don't protect investors from a decline in the value of the dollar, instead, many men with money are putting their funds in stocks, which rise with inflation. These men believe that if the dollar goes down, then their stocks will go up at least enough to make up the dollar's decline, and perhaps a little bit more.

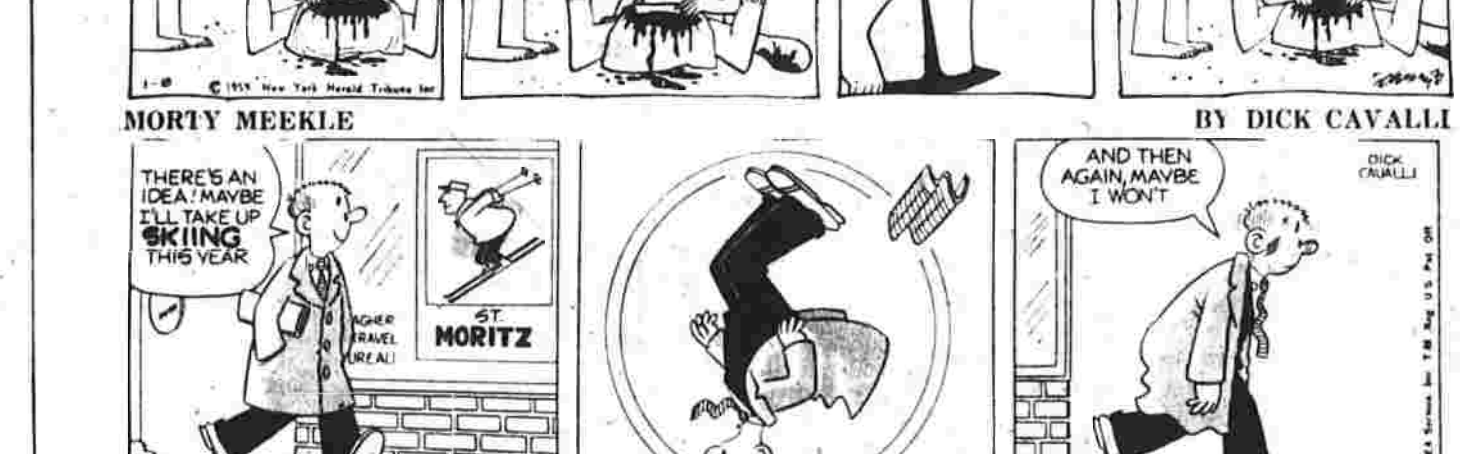
