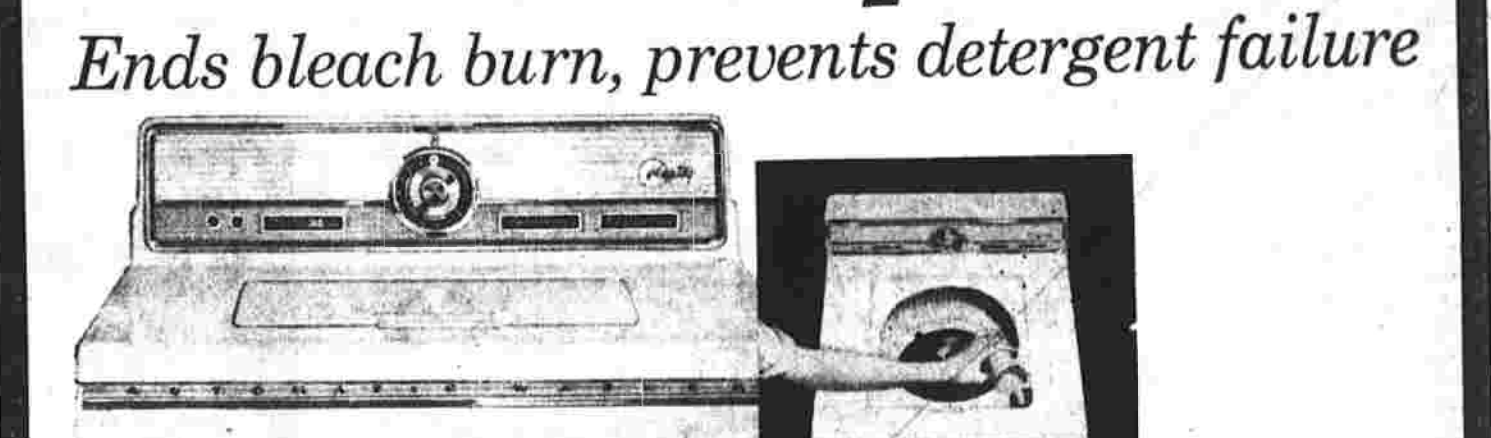

### Rockville-Vernon City Hospital Reports Net Loss of \$4,583

Rockville City Hospital reported a net loss of \$4,583 during the fiscal year 1957-58, according to the annual report released today.

The hospital had operated in the red for the first time in its history since 1947, although it had an operating loss of \$1,200 in 1956. The hospital's fiscal year ends Sept. 30.

The financial report, prepared by Joseph P. McManus, business manager, shows that the hospital's operating loss for the year was \$4,583, compared with a net gain of \$250,222 in 1956-57.

The operating loss is the result of a 12.5 percent increase in the number of patients, and the endowment and miscellaneous income is \$4,000 less.

In 1956-57 the hospital showed a net profit of \$13,852, despite its operating loss.

The trustees note that of the total expenditures of \$2,707,707, approximately \$2,000,000 was made in the Rockville area, employees as well as wages and salaries.

Statistics compiled by Mrs. Virginia A. Yasuhiko, hospital secretary, indicate that the hospital's net loss is the result of a 12.5 percent increase in the number of patients.

The total number of days patients spent in the hospital dropped from 11,526 in the year ended Sept. 30, 1957, to 10,561 last year. Also, the average stay of a patient dropped from 43 to 37 days.

The hospital minimized the cost to the patient by treating more outpatients, and by shortening the hospital stay, McManus explained.

While 1,041 outpatients were treated in 1957, a total of 1,337 were treated last year.

### 3,000 Measures Filed By State Legislators

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS—Connecticut legislators today start finding pigeon-holes for more than 3,000 pieces of legislation.

In the pile of bills are the key proposals of Gov. Abraham Ribicoff's Democratic administration, which controls both Houses of the state.

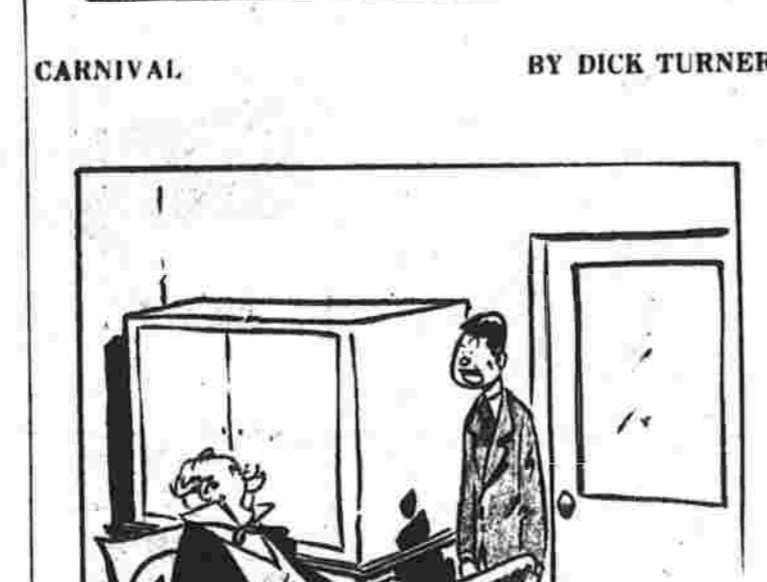

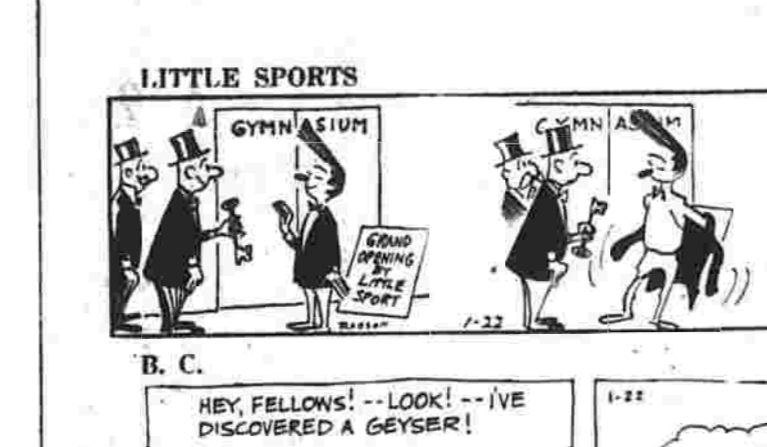
